US DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

The US Department of Education administers federal financial aid. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board does not have the ability to grant loan forgiveness, deferral, or forbearance of federal loans. The Coordinating Board cannot check the status or amount of your federal loans or grants.

From this page, you can log into your account and find information on your loan servicer. The US Department of Education can provide additional information on options for loan repayment or discharge due to a closed school.

US DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY

International students who were attending a school at the time of closure should contact the US Department of Homeland Security regarding the following actions:

- 1. Seek a change of status;
- 2. Enroll in another qualified program of study at an Student and Exchange Visitor Program (SEVP) certified school; or
- 3. Depart the United States.

Nonimmigrant students who have questions about their options should call the SEVP Response Center at **703-603-3400**. This number is staffed from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. ET, Monday through Friday, except federal holidays. The response center can assist with the facilitation of transfer to SEVP-certified schools where the students have accepted admission.

Students may refer to the Homeland Security <u>School Search page</u> to find schools certified by SEVP to enroll nonimmigrant students. F-1 nonimmigrant students must enroll in a full course of study at an SEVP-certified school in order to maintain their nonimmigrant status.

VETERANS AGENCIES

All questions regarding veterans' educational benefits should be directed to the federal or state agency dealing with veterans affairs.
