The WSMP is funded by appropriations through the Texas College Work-Study Program (General Appropriations Act, Senate Bill (SB) 1, 85 th Texas Legislature, Regular Session which was signed by the Governor on June 12, 2017). For FY 2018, the WSMP received \$2.75 million. Of that funding, \$2,061,033 will support institutions that participated in the WSMP during FY 2016 and 2017. The balance of the FY 2018 funding will support new institutions that did not participate in the program during FY 2016 and 2017.
