

Currently, the EA Net is considering a universal definition of *emergency*, which is...




Emergency is defined as, "An unexpected or unforeseen expense, event, or circumstance that could cause a loss of momentum toward student success."

Note* **Typical** unexpected or unforeseen expense, event, or circumstance <u>categories</u> might include: Childcare, Housing/rent, Food, Health Care, Transportation, and Utilities.

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
Survey Responses for Those without an EA Program
