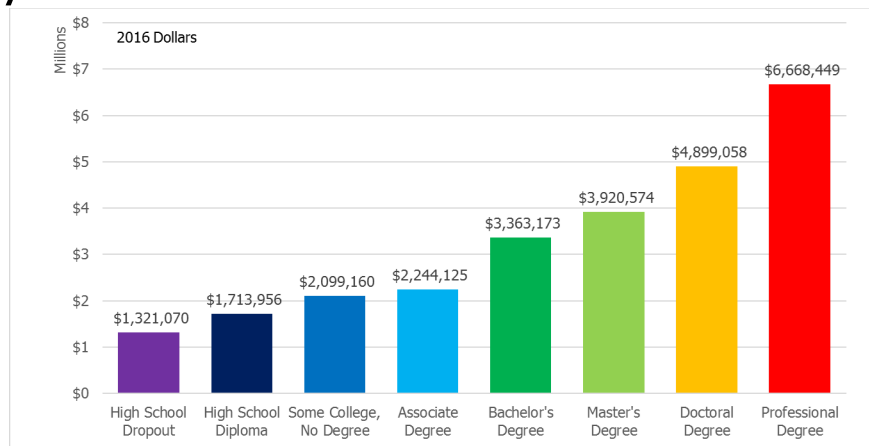

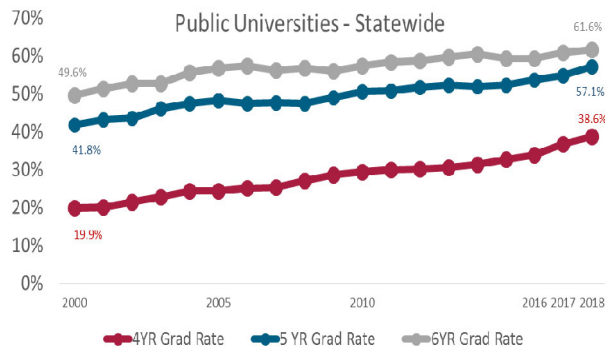


## What helps improve efficiency?

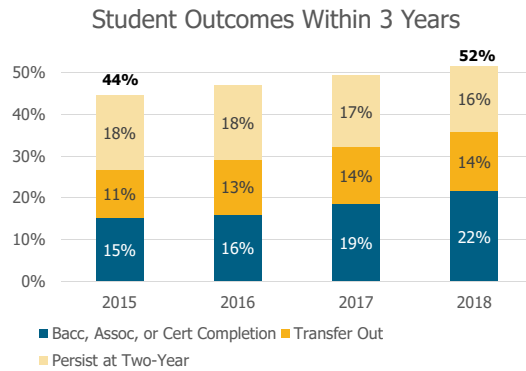
- Improved graduation rates

## A larger percentage of students are successfully earning degrees and certificates and doing so more quickly

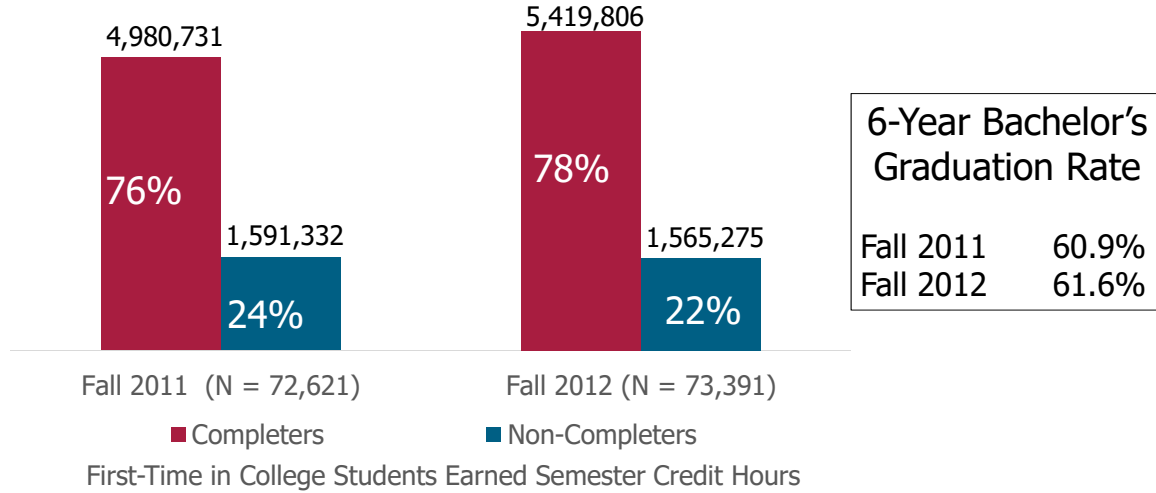
### Public Universities – Statewide



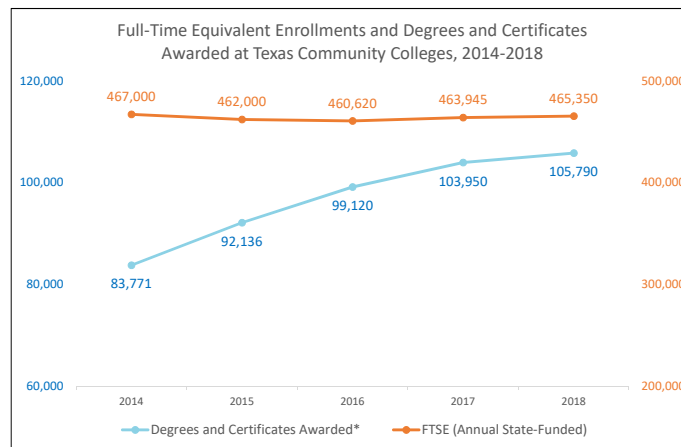
### Public Two-Year Colleges - Statewide



As higher percentages of students graduate, the number and proportion of credit hours earned by students who did not graduate decreases



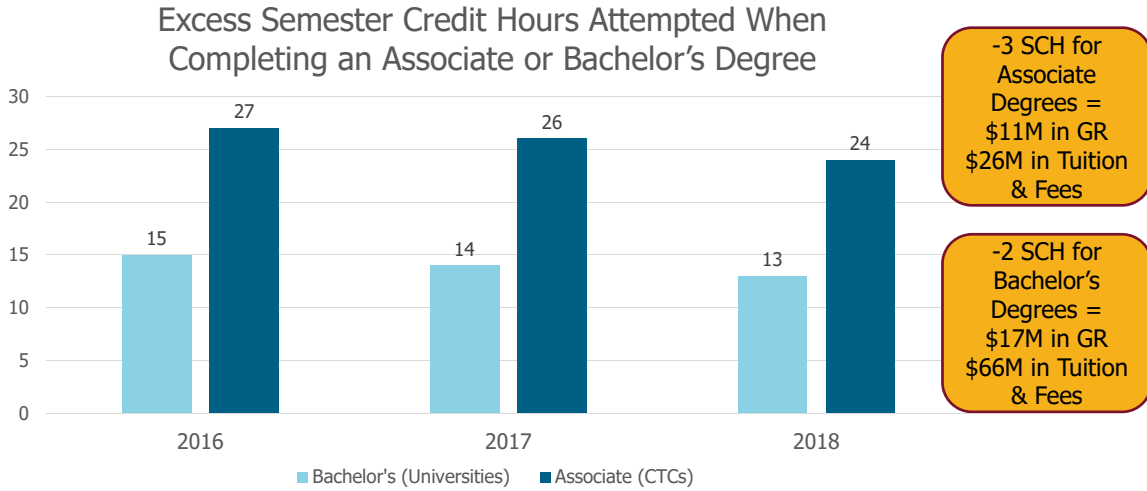
Degrees and certificates awarded increased 26.3% from 2014 to 2018 while FTSEs (full-time student equivalents) remained stable



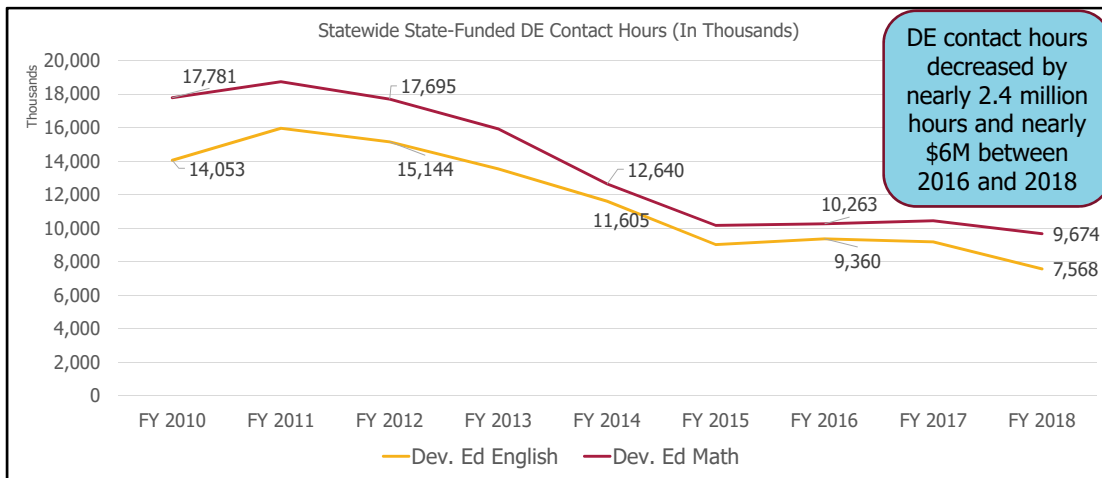
\* Does not include Core Completers, which are included in success points. Core completers grew 40.2% from 2014-2018
