

Low-Producing Program Review

A degree program is a low-producing program (LPP) if, over a five-year period, the number of graduates is:

- fewer than 25 graduates for undergraduate programs;
- fewer than 15 graduates for master's programs; and
- fewer than 10 graduates for doctoral programs.

Board may recommend to an institution's governing board the closure or consolidation of a program, if it has been LPP for three or more consecutive reviews (TAC Rule 4.290).

Programs that are not closed or consolidated must be identified on the system's or institution's Legislative Appropriation Request (LAR).

To allow time for institution and system to decide on appropriate action, prior to the LAR, staff will recommend in odd numbered years and system and institution will report in even numbered years.
