What is TXWORKS?

Eligible, Texas college students will have an opportunity to:

- intern either in-person, virtually or a hybrid with an employer located in Texas.
- gain and strengthen career readiness through paid meaningful work experience.
- work a minimum 8 weeks and a minimum of 96 hours.
- earn a minimum of at least \$20/hour.
- explore career paths and become marketable to compete and contribute to their current and future economy.

Student Eligibility for 2021-2022

Financial:

 Completed the Free Application for Student Aid (FAFSA) for the 2019-2020, 2020-2021, or 2021-2022 academic school year and received a Student Aid Report with an Estimated Family Contribution (EFC) between \$0 and \$5,846.

Participation:

 Interns cannot complete more than one (1) TXWORKS internship at a time or complete more than two (2) internships total.

Enrollment:

- Enrolled as a half-time or full-time undergraduate student (6 hours or more) the semester prior to internship; enrollment as a student during internship permissible.
- Seeking a **Certificate**, **Associate Degree**, *or* **Bachelor's Degree** at an eligible Texas college or university (cannot have earned a bachelor, graduate, or professional degree).
- Graduated from high school, earned a GED, or completed high school equivalent program (dual credit students are not eligible to participate).

Residency:

• Are a resident of Texas.

- 2. Obtain and download a digital copy of your transcript (can be an unofficial copy).
- 3. Update your resume (or create one if you do not currently have a professional resume appropriate for applying for an internship).

Texas Administrative Code 21.1083


"Be enrolled at the institution granting an exemption...in courses required for teacher certification in one or more subject areas determined by the Texas Education Agency to be experiencing a critical shortage of teachers at the public schools in this state."

Educational Aide Exemption Funds

Funding Reminders:

- A fillable PDF form is used to request funds throughout the year.
- The institution is required to provide a minimum of 10% of the student's award using institutional funds (non-federal/state).
- Participating schools must cover **all** tuition and required fees* for formula funded courses.

*Lab and class fees are not covered



EAE Matching Requirement

REQUIRED MATCHING

Participation in the EAE Program requires that institutions use institutional funds (non-federal or state aid) to cover **at** least 10% of each recipient's exemption.

NOTE: Institutions can contribute beyond the 10% minimum requirement.

Tuition Equalization Grant: Tuition Differential Update

Tuition Differential:

The difference between the tuition paid at a private or independent institution and the tuition the student would have to pay to attend a comparable public institution in Texas.

To calculate tuition differential:

Current Tuition Rate - SACS Level Rate = Difference x Total SCH = Tuition Differential $$515 - $200 = $315 \times 27 \text{ SCH} = $8,505$

TUITION DIFFERENTIAL (19 TAC, SECTION 22.22)

Tuition differential is defined as the difference between the tuition paid at a private or independent institution and the tuition the student would have to pay to attend a comparable public institution in Texas. Fees are not included in this calculation, only tuition rates. The Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) identifies institutions by the highest levels of degrees they offer. These levels are used by the THECB to identify "comparable" institutions for the purpose of calculating tuition differentials, regardless of accreditation.

The following table shows average resident undergraduate and graduate tuition rates per SCH for public institutions at various SACS levels for the 2021-22 academic year. These amounts should be used by the institution to derive tuition differentials by using the student's total SCH and multiplying the tuition rate provided (see Appendix 2 for individual institutional program levels).

OVER AWARDS (19 TAC. SECTION 22.11)

If an award has been disbursed and a student receives other assistance that exceeds the student's financial need, the institution is not required to adjust the award unless the sum of the excess resources is greater than \$300.

AWARD ADJUSTMENTS (19 TAC, SECTION 22.11)

Institutions may be required to make award adjustments in the following circumstances:

- Student officially withdraws from enrollment.
 - The institution will use the general refund policy to determine the amount of financial aid to be reduced.
- A refund is not owed to the program if a student drops or withdraws after the end of an institution's refund period.
 Student's disbursement exceeds his/her eligibility amount.
- Recalculate eligibility amount.

NOTE: If funds are available after an award has been adjusted, they can be re-awarded to other eligible students at the institution. If the funds cannot be re-awarded, they must be returned to the THECB based on the <u>Timely Distribution of Funds</u>.

TUITION DIFFERENTIAL EXAMPLE

 Charges for an independent 2year institution (e.g., Jacksonville College) should be compared to public community college charges (Level 1).

 A Level 2 institution that only awards TEG to associate degree students (e.g., Southwestern Christian College) should compare its charges to those of public community colleges (Level 1).

 Levels 2, 3, 5, and 6 independent institutions (other than Southwestern Christian College) should compare their charges to the average charges of public institutions at the same levels.

Tuition Differential Calculation

 Institution Current Tuition Rate per SCH = \$515
 Institution SACS Level 5 = \$200
 Undergraduate student is enrolled in 12 SCH for fall and 15 SCH for spring.

To calculate tuition differential

Institution Current Tuition Rate -SACS Level Rate = Difference x Total SCH = Tuition Differential

For Example: \$515 - \$200 = \$315 \$315 x 27 SCH = \$8,505

This student is eligible for a TEG award since the tuition differential (\$8,508) is more than the maximum award (\$3,420).

College Access Loan

CAL Interest Rate Reduction

Effective July 1, 2021:

- New applications certified by the institution will carry a fixed rate of 3.75%
- Students or institutions can request a cancellation if the loan disbursements are pending. Once canceled, the student can reapply to take advantage of the lower rate.
 - Credit is only good for 90 days; reapplying could repull credit.
 - Send <u>CONTACT US</u> and select "Financial Aid Questions" as Contact Reason.

NOTE: Loans certified prior to July 1 will be 4.2%.

Contract Agreement Transition

FY 2022 Contract Agreement Transition

Effective Sept 1, 2021:

- Institutions and the THECB will use a three-page simplified Program Participation Agreement (PAA).
- New agreements will be sent via email to the Director with instructions.
- The two-year agreement will cover FY 2022 and 2023.
- Send the signed agreement back by Aug. 18, 2021.


