


File Processing








Cumulative File - MOVEit



Texas Transfer Grant

Overview



Texas Transfer Grant Purpose

The Texas Transfer Grant (Transfer Grant)
Program provides need-based grants to
enable eligible students to transfer from
public two-year to four-year institutions
of higher education within Texas.



NOTE: The Texas Transfer Grant is a newly established program which is separate from the pilot program that was administered during the 2022-23 academic year (see <u>Texas Administrative Code, Title 19, Part 1, Chapter 22, Subchapter K</u>).



Student Eligibility

To qualify for a Transfer Grant, a student must:

- ✓ be classified by the institution as a Texas resident;
- ✓ be registered with Selective Service, or be exempt;
- ✓ have applied for any available financial aid and show financial need;
- ✓ be enrolled in a baccalaureate degree program at an eligible institution on a full-time basis;
- ✓ have earned an associate degree at a Texas public 2year institution with a minimum 2.5 grade point average





Award Amounts

The maximum semester grant amount will be consistent with the maximum semester amount for the Toward Excellence, Access, and Success (TEXAS) Grant.

FY 2024

- Maximum semester grant amount:\$5,387
- Estimated Family Contribution (EFC):
 \$6,464

FY 2025

- Maximum semester grant amount: \$5,394
- Student Aid Index (SAI):\$6,472

(Transfer Grant) Intent to Participate

The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board is required to invite eligible institutions to participate in the Texas Transfer Grant program to be included in the allocation calculation process. The newly established program, which is separate from the "pilot program," received state-appropriated funds for the 2023-24 (FY 2024) and 2024-25 (FY 2025) academic years during the 88th Legislative Session.

All institutions are required to complete the enclosed Intent to Participate form by April 8, 2024 (see Texas Administrative Code, Title 19, Chapter 22, <a href="Section 22.202). Institutions that do not confirm their intent to participate by the deadline will not be included in the initial allocation calculation process.

Rules establishing procedures to administer the program can be found in Texas Administrative Code, Title 19, Part 1, Chapter 22, Subchapter K.

Texas First Scholarship Eligibility

Student Eligibility

To qualify for this scholarship, a student **must**:

- Be enrolled at an eligible institution;
- Be a resident of Texas;
- Be registered for Selective Service, or be exempt; and
- Have graduated early from high school under the Texas
 First Early High School Completion Program.

Institutional Eligibility

Students graduating under the TX First Program: On or After Sept. 1, 2023

ALL Texas public institutions.

Students graduating under the TX First Program: Prior to Sept. 1, 2023




UPDATE Recipient Rosters

- ✓ Recipient rosters includes a list of all eligible students who have been issued a certificate.
 - High School Graduation Date added
 - Date Certificate Issued by THECB moved to column G
- ✓ Roster updates occur when new certificates are issued.
- ✓ Institutions are **not required** to collect scholarship certificates issued by THECB to the student.

A **Texas_First** folder has been created in MOVEit DMZ for all public institutions. Rosters have been moved into the new folder for institutions to access.






















Last Payment Request Option

2023-24 Financial Aid Database (FAD)

Reporting Updates and Deadlines

FAD Report Deadlines

Institutions are required to submit a comprehensive FAD Report two times a year. The second cycle requires a validation of data, and the third report cycle requires certification.

Important: Institutions that fail to adhere to the deadline dates listed risk postponement of future state financial aid disbursements, including loan disbursements.

UPDATE State Priority Deadline Date

Memo was sent February 28, 2024, to communicate:

- The state priority deadline was extended due to exigent circumstances related to federal aid development, as authorized under Texas Administrative Code 22.6(3).
- Is a requirement for General Academic Teaching Institutions (GATIs) including Lamar State College Orange and Lamar State College Port Arthur, as defined in <u>TEC</u>, <u>Title 3</u>, <u>Section 61.003(3)</u>.
- Institutions have flexibility to define how their students must meet the priority deadline.*

Priority Deadline Date

The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) has extended the 2024-25 (FY 2025) state financial aid application priority deadline from March 15, 2024, to April 15, 2024, due to exigent circumstances related to federal aid development, as authorized under Texas Administrative Code 22.6(3). The updated priority deadline will be immediately published on the THECB's public website.

As a reminder, the state priority deadline is a requirement for General Academic Teaching Institutions (GATIs) including Lamar State College Orange and Lamar State College Port Arthur, as defined in TEC, Title 3, Section 61.003(3). The other institutions of higher education are encouraged to utilize the deadline but are not required to do so.

Institutions have flexibility to define how their students must meet the priority deadline. However, the Department of Education's recent workaround for individuals whose contributor(s) do not have a valid social security number should be honored by institutions for the 2024-25 award year, when determining a student's eligibility for meeting the priority deadline (see Federal Student Aid Announcement).

The priority deadline is neither a guarantee to receive funding if a student applies by the applicable date for the academic year, nor is it a restriction to those that apply beyond the date. It is a mechanism that is used to evaluate similarly situated students to prioritize limited funding and to encourage students to complete their application timely to increase the likelihood of receiving state funding. While the priority deadline extension is not intended to deter individuals from completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), it acknowledges that many individuals continue to face technical challenges in their effort to submit the FAFSA.




Training Requests


