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#### Letter from the Commissioner

Texas public higher education is a vast network of nine health science centers, 38 universities (or general academic teaching institutions), 50 community college districts, three state colleges, and four state technical colleges. Together, these institutions enrolled 1.3 million students in fall 2010 and received \$7.78 billion in state and local tax support in fiscal year 2010. Given so large an investment, the residents of Texas, particularly state and local policy makers, should have readily available to them basic information about the characteristics and performance of Texas public higher education — institution by institution — in state and national contexts. This first edition of the *Texas Public Higher Education Almanac* is not intended to be exhaustive; for a more complete view of Texas higher education, the reader should refer to the "Data Resources and Tools" section of the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board website (www.thecb.state.tx.us).

It is virtually impossible to overestimate the role that higher education plays in determining the future of Texas. More than any other single factor, higher education drives economic development and determines quality of life. Because of the vital role that higher education plays in the overall well-being of Texas and specific communities, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board launched the *Closing the Gaps by 2015* initiative in 2000, which intends to bring Texas to parity in higher educational attainment with the ten largest states. In 2007, the Perryman Group, one of the most prominent consulting firms in Texas, studied the economic impact that achieving the goals of *Closing the Gaps* would have on the state and concluded that, by 2030, Texas would experience increases of \$489 billion in total spending, \$194 billion in gross state product, and \$122 billion in personal income. Furthermore, Texas would see an increase of one million new jobs and experience a return on its investment in higher education of 8:1.

All of which brings us back to this almanac. The data included here show that Texas is well on its way to achieving the goals of *Closing the Gaps*, but challenges remain. We are doing well in terms of access and participation — enrolling new students — but not so well in terms of student success — students actually completing certificates and degree programs. Texas higher education continues to improve but we still lag behind the leading states, and we still have a good distance to travel to assume a position of national and international leadership in higher educational attainment and quality.

Speaking on behalf of my colleagues at the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, I hope you will examine this almanac with care and join us in building a system of higher education that will serve as the foundation of our state's future prosperity and well-being. Our young people deserve nothing less.

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#### Introduction

In October 2000, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) adopted *Closing the Gaps by 2015: The Texas Higher Education Plan.* The plan aims to close educational gaps within Texas and bring Texas to parity with other leading states. It focuses on key goals and outcome measures including, but not limited to, student participation (as measured by enrollment) and success (as measured by certificate and degree completion) in postsecondary education.

In 2004, the THECB established a higher education accountability system that is recognized nationally for its "best practice" reporting of student outcomes and institutional practices. This almanac makes available in print much of the same accountability data at a level of detail previously accessible only online. It allows readers to easily make institutional-level comparisons on many performance measures and characteristics that contribute to helping the state meet the goals of *Closing the Gaps*.

Additional information about the THECB, all annual progress reports on *Closing the Gaps*, and access to the Texas higher education accountability system are available at www.thecb.state.tx.us.

#### **Definitions, Data Years, and Data Sources**

Accountability groups: Texas public higher education institutions are grouped according to their general mission. Universities are grouped based on key academic indicators such as size, number of graduate programs, and research expenditures. Community colleges are grouped based on size. See www.txhighereddata.org/Interactive/ Accountability/AcctSysOverview.pdf for more information on university groupings.

Age: Age is calculated by subtracting the individual's date of birth from the *begin date* of the reporting period. For fall, the begin date is September 1; in spring it is January 1; and in summer it is June 1.

Average tuition and fees: The cost of tuition and mandatory fees charged to a student taking 30 semester credit hours (SCH) (15 SCH fall and 15 SCH spring). For four-year public institutions and the Lamar and Technical Colleges, tuition includes mandatory tuition (state-required tuition) and designated tuition (set by institutional governing boards). *FY 2011 rates* 

**Degrees awarded:** Number of degrees awarded by race/ethnicity and level. Certificates are not included. *FY 2010* 

#### Developmental education:

College-level course completion:

Percentage of total students below state Texas Success Initiative (TSI) standards in math, reading, and/or writing who successfully completed a college-level course (math-intensive, reading-intensive, and/or writing-intensive, as applicable) with a grade of A, B, or C within three years of college enrollment. *Fall 2006 cohort* 

#### Total students below state standard:

Students who are in college for the first time (both full- and part-time) who did not meet Texas Success Initiative (TSI) standards for college readiness in math, reading, and/or writing at the time of enrollment. *Fall 2006 cohort* 

TSI obligations met: Percentage of total students below state Texas Success Initiative (TSI) standards in math, reading, and/or writing who satisfied TSI obligations within two years of college enrollment. *Fall 2006 cohort* 

#### **Dual credit:**

**Dual credit outcomes:** College persistence and graduation rates for dual credit students who subsequently enrolled in a Texas college or university. The percentage who earned a baccalaureate and/or associate degree is unduplicated. **Fall 2005 first time in college (FTIC) cohort** (Source: www.txhighereddata.org/Interactive/HSCollLink2.CFM)

**Dual credit as percentage of total enrollment:** Dual credit enrollment as a percentage of the total enrollment. *Fall* **2009** (Source: www.txhighereddata.org/Interactive/HSCollLink2.CFM)

**Dual credit students:** High school students who attempt one or more college courses for high school and college credit.

#### **Enrollment:**

**Fall headcount:** The institutional fall headcount enrollment by race and ethnicity, including all full- and part-time students. *Fall 2010* 

Full-time student equivalent (FTSE) undergraduate enrollments: The sum of all fall undergraduate semester credit hours (SCH) attempted divided by 15. Fall 2010

Full-time student equivalent (FTSE) total enrollments: The sum of all fall semester credit hours (SCH) attempted divided by 15 for undergraduate SCH, 12 for master's and professional SCH, and 9 for doctoral SCH. Fall 2010

#### Faculty:

**Total university faculty:** All faculty members with teaching responsibilities, including teaching assistants.

**Two-year college faculty:** Number and percentage of full-time (teaching 80% or more) and part-time faculty members. This includes faculty members teaching flex courses. *Fall 2010* 

University tenured/tenure track faculty: Faculty members with teaching responsibilities who have received or are on a track to receive tenure. Fall 2010

**First-time students accepted:** Percentage of first-time summer/fall applicants accepted by the institution. *Fall 2010* 

#### First-time undergraduates in Texas

top 10%: The percentage of first-time undergraduates entering in the summer or fall class who ranked in the top 10 percent of their Texas public high school graduating class. *Fall 2010* 

**Fiscal year (FY):** The state's fiscal year is similar to the academic year of institutions. The fiscal year runs from September 1 through August 31; for example, FY 2010 is September 1, 2009, to August 31, 2010.

#### Four-year university graduation rates:

The percentage of first-time entering, degree-seeking students who enrolled in a minimum of 12 semester credit hours

their first fall semester and who graduated with a bachelor's degree or higher from the same institution or another Texas public or independent institution after four, six, and ten academic years. **Rates through FY 2009** (for fall 2005, 2003, and 1998 cohorts respectively)

#### **Graduate success:**

Baccalaureate graduates who are employed and/or enrolled in a graduate school:

Percentage of graduates employed in the fourth quarter of the calendar year following the graduation academic year and/or enrolled in a Texas graduate program in the fall semester after graduation. *FY 2009* 

#### Community and technical college

graduates: The percentage of academic or technical graduates employed or placed in military service in the fourth quarter of the calendar year in which the program fiscal year ends; the percentage of students enrolled in a Texas institution in the following fall after the school year in which the program year ends; the percentage of students who were employed and enrolled; or the percentage of graduates who were employed and/or enrolled. *FY 2009* 

#### **Hispanic Serving Institutions (HSI):**

Colleges, universities, or systems/districts in which total Hispanic enrollment constitutes a minimum of 25% of the total enrollment.

Historically Black College or University (HBCU): Any historically black college or university established prior to 1964, whose

principal mission was, and is, the education of black Americans.

**Lower-division:** Course offerings at a level of comprehension usually associated with freshman and sophomore students.

Percentage of graduates completing 30 SCH at a two-year college: The percentage of university graduates who took 30 or more semester credit hours (SCH) at two-year public institutions. FY 2010

Percentage of students receiving Pell

**Grants:** The percentage of undergraduate students who receive a Pell Grant of any amount. *Fall 2008* 

**Percentile:** The score below which a certain percentage of observations fall. For example, the 25th percentile score is the score below which 25% of the scores may be found, and the 75th percentile score is the score below which 75% of the scores may be found.

#### Race/ethnicity:

**African American:** The race of a person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa.

Multiracial/African American: The race of a person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa, plus one or more other races.

**Hispanic:** The ethnic origin of a person of Cuban, Mexican, Puerto Rican, South or Central American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

International student: A person who is not a citizen or permanent resident of the United States and who is in this country on a temporary basis and does not have the right to remain indefinitely. It may also refer to a nonresident alien.

**Other:** All other races not individually listed, including Native Hawaiian, other Pacific Islander, American Indian, Native Alaskan, Asian, or unknown origin.

White: The race of a person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, the Middle East, or North Africa.

Ratio of undergraduate FTSE to undergraduate degrees: Undergraduate full-time student equivalents (FTSE) divided by undergraduate degrees awarded. FY 2010

Research expenditures: Total expenditures from federal, state, private, and institutional sources combined as reported in the annual research expenditures report. *FY 2009* 

Research per T/TT faculty FTE: Total research expenditures per tenured/tenure-track (T/TT) full-time faculty member equivalent (includes only faculty members with teaching responsibility). FY 2009 (research expenditures), Fall 2008 (T/TT faculty FTE)

Revenues per FTSE: Revenue, excluding constitutional funds, divided by the number of full-time student equivalents (FTSE), by categories, including total, tuition and fees, state appropriation, federal funds, and institutional funds. Tuition and fees is net of scholarship discounts and allowances. Auxillary funds are included. FY 2010 (Source: Sources and Uses publication available on the Coordinating Board's website: www.thecb.state.tx.us)

**SAT/ACT test scores:** Test score ranges are shown for Math and Critical Reading on the SAT test and for Math, English, and Composite on the ACT test. Fifty percent of

enrolled full-time students have test scores within the ranges listed, 25% have scores above, and 25% have scores below. (Source: USDOE IPEDS data for fall 2009)

#### Transfers to a senior institution:

**Cohort:** Number of students entering higher education for the first time at a two-year public institution, who are not concurrently enrolled at a four-year institution.

#### 2004 cohort

**Transfer rate:** The percentage of students in the cohort who transfer to a senior institution within six years. **2004 cohort through FY 2010** 

#### Two-year college graduation rates:

The percentage of first-time, full-time, credential-seeking undergraduates who graduate within three, four, or six academic years. Both degrees and certificates are included. *Rates through FY 2009* (for fall 2006, 2005, and 2003 cohorts respectively)

#### Two-year college students at universities:

Baccalaureate graduates who completed SCHs at two-year public colleges:
Percentage of baccalaureate graduates who

Graduation of two-year college students:
Percentage of undergraduates who were first-time transfer students from Texas two-year public colleges with 30 or more semester credit hours (SCH) in the six years prior to transferring and who graduated from the same Texas public university within four years. FY 2010

**UG:** Abbreviation for undergraduate.

**Upper-division:** Course offerings at a level of comprehension usually associated with junior and senior students.

Uses per FTSE: Operating expenses divided by the number of full-time student equivalents (FTSE). Operating expenses are broken out by total, instruction, research, academic support, student services, institutional support, operations and maintenance of plant, scholarships and fellowships, and capital outlay from current fund sources. FY 2010 (Source: Sources and Uses publication available on the Coordinating Board's website: www.thecb. state.tx.us)

Except in the instances noted, the source of data is the Texas Accountability System.






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





#### Statewide Enrollment by Gender






Total Undergraduate Degrees/Certificates Awarded Annually by Race/Ethnicity


#### Closing the Gaps in Research Funding

Below is an overview of how well Texas is reaching its goal of obtaining federal research funds. Federal R&D funding comes from the discretionary one-third of the federal budget; therefore the amounts allocated to the various agencies and programs engaged in R&D fluctuate annually. It is anticipated that FY 2011 federal funding for R&D will decrease slightly by \$429 million (0.3%), leaving an overall total of \$148.1 billion to support R&D efforts nationally.




Percentage of Federal Science and Engineering Obligations for Research and Development Allocated to Texas **Public and Independent Institutions**


#### **Emerging Research Universities**

Texas currently has two public research universities and has identified seven others as emerging research universities, which could become eligible for monies from the National Research University Fund. Eligibility will depend on various measures, including but not limited to restricted research expenditures in the amount of \$45 million for the two state fiscal years preceding the state fiscal bienium, total endowment of at least \$400 million, and 200 Ph.D. degrees awarded.




#### **Restricted Research Expenditures\***

Two Public Research Universities Seven Emerging Research Universities









#### PERCENT STUDENT POPULATION BY RACE/ETHNICITY















#### **Sources of Data**

#### National Context Data

Graduation rates are from *The Chronicle of Higher Education, Almanac Issue, 2010–11,* August 27, 2010. These graduation rates are a percentage of first-time entering, degreeseeking students who enrolled in a minimum of 12 semester credit hours at four-year institutions in 2002-3 and graduated from the **same** institution within six years.

For the statewide and institution graduation rates, Texas included public and private institutions and rates of students who transfer between institutions. Texas' graduation rate is the percentage of first-time entering, degree-seeking students who enrolled in a minimum of 12 semester credit hours their first fall semester and who graduated with a bachelor's degree or higher from the same institution or another Texas public or independent institution after six years.

Educational attainment data are from the U.S. Census Bureau using the American Community Survey, Puerto Rico Community Survey, 2006–2008 American Community Survey 3-Year Estimates, Educational Attainment for Population Age 25 or Older, 2008.

Educational appropriations per FTE are from the State Higher Education Executive Officers (SHEEO) State Higher Education Finance (SHEF) survey for FY 2009.

Tuition and fees data are from the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES), Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) Data Center, 2009 collection frequently used variables tuition and fees, 2009–10. Median household income data are from the U.S. Census Bureau using the Median Household Income and Gini Index in the past 12 months by state and Puerto Rico, 2008–09. The data are in 2009 inflation adjusted dollars using a three-year average.

Test scores are from NCES IPEDS Data Center, 2009 collection.

Faculty data are from NCES IPEDS Data Center, 2008 collection instructional staff/salaries average salaries of full-time instructional faculty members equated to nine-month contract average salary — all ranks.

Federal research and development obligations data are from the National Science Foundation WebCASPAR database, Survey of Federal Science and Engineering Support to Universities, Colleges, and Nonprofit Institutions.

#### Statewide Overview Data

Regional data are from the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, Texas Education Association, and National Student Clearinghouse, May 19, 2010.

Total enrollment by age and educational attainment data are from the U.S. Census Bureau using the American Community Survey 2007–2009 American Community Survey 3-Year Estimates.

Non-English speaking households and international population are from the U.S. Census Bureau, State & County QuickFacts from 2000.

Texas population data are from Texas State Data Center, 2009 Age, Sex, and Race/
