Letter from the Commissioner

In the spring of 2016, Gov. Greg Abbott charged three state agencies, the Texas Education Agency, the Texas Workforce Commission, and the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, with developing a set of recommendations that would create greater collaboration among them, raise educational attainment and economic competitiveness, and place Texas on a clear path to achieving the goals of the state's higher education strategic plan, 60x30TX, whose major goal is that 60 percent of young Texans will hold a certificate or degree by 2030.

Representatives of the three agencies convened meetings of education, business, political, and community leaders in every region of Texas to gather information and recommendations related to the governor's charges. Texans had plenty to say. They enthusiastically endorsed 60x30TX even as they noted how far we have to go to achieve its primary goals. Like Gov. Abbott, they emphasized the need to increase collaboration among the three agencies and to strike a balance between academic and professional training on the one hand and career and technical education on the other. Business leaders from El Paso to Tyler underscored the need to incorporate marketable skills into the educational experiences of all college students, regardless of major. They expressed great concern for academic quality and rigor throughout the educational pipeline and advocated for expanding educational opportunities for the 60 percent of public K–12 students who are poor. And everywhere we went, we heard concerns about the rising cost of higher education and the enduring burden of student debt.

After a culminating statewide meeting in Austin, the three agencies issued a report. Its title, *Prosperity Requires Being Bold*, nicely captures its key idea: Texas cannot reach its education and workforce goals doing business as usual.

For Texas higher education leaders, the complaints and concerns expressed across the state cannot be ignored. Parents complained about the deficiency of transfer policies that result in the loss of academic credit — and increased cost — as students move from one institution to another. Academic, financial, and career counseling on college campuses were described as being inadequate, if not altogether unavailable. Business leaders noted recurrently that graduates of both two- and four-year institutions often lacked critical thinking and communication skills, not to mention strong work habits. The affordability of higher education was another prime topic everywhere, to the point that many participants in the regional meetings questioned whether higher education was truly worth the cost.

Higher education leaders in Texas must respond to these concerns, not only in words but also in deeds. As I write, groups of higher education leaders are working to improve transfer policy and practice and to expand student advising and counseling in both face-to-face and online formats. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board is convening faculty groups to consider how marketable skills can be incorporated into the curriculum across all majors, especially the liberal arts.


Certainly one of the most gratifying outcomes of the tri-agency regional meetings has been the recognition of the need for more public/private partnerships across Texas. Corporate leaders recently joined with the heads of the three agencies to announce the launch of the Texas Internship Challenge, a campaign to expand the number of paid internships across the state available to college students. And the 85th Texas Legislature, currently in session as I write, is considering a bill called "Texas Works," which would expand the number of off-campus work-study positions available to college students and would be funded jointly by the state, businesses, and community-based organizations. Everybody wins through initiatives like this: Financial aid dollars are stretched further, students acquire invaluable workforce skills, and college costs are held down.


To borrow a phrase, achieving the goals of 60x30TX requires being bold. As you will note in the following pages, educational improvement in Texas is steady but slow, too slow to reach the goals of 60x30TX. Too few students of color, and poor students in general, achieve a postsecondary credential of any type; too few Texas high school graduates enroll in higher education relative to projected workforce needs; and six-year university graduation rates are still only at 59 percent — again, well below projected workforce needs.

We Texans must embrace boldness and innovation and quicken the pace on our way to 2030. By achieving the goals of 60x30TX, we will be able to look back and say we did some extraordinary things for the young people and the future of Texas.

Introduction

2017 marks the second year of 60x30TX, the new higher education strategic plan for Texas. In 2015, Gov. Greg Abbott helped launch 60x30TX and, in 2106, charged the Texas Education Agency, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB), and the Texas Workforce Commission with working together to achieve the goals of 60x30TX. This tri-agency effort included regional meetings that led to recommendations to the governor.

In addition to the tri-agency collaboration, the THECB has done much to promote 60x30TX, including producing this 2017 Texas Public Higher Education Almanac, which enables quick reference to institutional data and annual progress toward the four 60x30TX goals.

The first 60x30TX Progress Report was disseminated in fall 2016. Much of the discussion in the report pertained to strategies and initiatives implemented to promote the plan, as well as legislative policy recommendations to help reach the plan's goals. For example, the THECB undertook several digital initiatives that align with 60x30TX. They include a soon-to-launch Grad TX mobile app to encourage students who drop out to return to college and complete their degrees; a GenTX mobile app that will allow students and parents to set up checklists and reminders about important application deadlines and connect via social media; an updated state higher education accountability system that will provide in-depth data on the state's progress toward the 60x30TX goals; and a new 60x30TX.com website sponsored by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation that provides a high-level, interactive view of the state's 60x30TX progress, as well as insight into related hot topics.

In addition to developing digital tools, the THECB sponsored events and conferences such as the Marketable Skills Conference, TAB (Texas Affordable Baccalaureate) Lab, a P–16 conference, a block scheduling conference, and eight regional 60x30TX workshops. The purpose of these events was to discuss strategies for reaching the plan's goals and to encourage local, regional, and statewide innovation and collaboration. THECB staff also made hundreds of 60x30TX presentations, both in and out of state. Commissioner Raymund Paredes, board members, and key staff presented the plan at every board of regents meeting, and most board of trustees meetings, in Texas. Since the plan's adoption, the agency's board meetings have included major policy discussions related to 60x30TX on college readiness, dual credit, student completion, and student debt.

Media coverage of all 60x30TX events and the plan has resulted in hundreds of major news stories in national, state, and local venues. In a short time, 60x30TX has attracted the attention of state and national higher education leaders and has inspired innovative initiatives to help students achieve their higher education dreams. These efforts are only the beginning for 60x30TX and for achieving a bold Texas future.



Definitions, Data Years, and Data Sources

The following definitions, data years, and data sources will help you navigate the data provided in this year's almanac. They are particularly helpful in reading the institutional profiles. For a more comprehensive list of data source references, see p. 90.

Accountability (Peer) groups: Texas public universities are grouped based on key indicators such as mission, number of doctoral-research/scholarship programs, and research expenditures. Public two-year colleges are grouped based on size and/or type.

Age: Age is calculated by subtracting the individual's date of birth from the *begin date* of the reporting period. For fall, the begin date is September 1; for spring, January 1; and for summer, June 1.

At risk: Includes students who received a Pell Grant, graduated with a GED, were 20 years or older when they first entered college, started as a part-time student taking fewer than 12 hours, or had an SAT/ACT score less than the national average.

Average tuition and fees: The cost of tuition and mandatory fees charged to a student taking 30 semester credit hours (SCH) (15 SCH in the fall and 15 SCH in the spring). For four-year public institutions and the Lamar and Technical Colleges, tuition includes mandatory tuition (state-required tuition) and designated tuition (set by institutional governing boards). Submitted to the THECB on the College Student Budget Report. *FY 2017 rates*

Bachelor's graduates as a percentage of undergraduate FTSE enrollment: The number of students who received an undergraduate degree from an institution in a given year divided by the annual full-time student equivalent (FTSE) enrollment. The FTSE enrollment is the total of all semester credit hours divided by 30 (the number of SCH considered full time for undergraduates annually). Dual credit enrollments are not included in FTSE. FY 2016

Debt:

Average student debt: For FY 2015 graduates, average student loan debt includes all identifiable debt prior to graduation for those students with debt. University graduates include those who received a bachelor's degree. Two-year institution graduates include those who received an associate degree or certificate.

- Native student debt: Average debt for students who graduated from the institution where they were enrolled as a first time in college (FTIC) student.
- Portion as parent debt: Portion of native students' debt that was incurred by a parent through a federal PLUS loan (2005– 11) or a federal Direct PLUS loan (2009– current). All native students with debt are included in parent debt calculation.
- Transfer student debt: All identifiable average debt for students who graduated from an institution but were not first time in college (FTIC) at that institution.

Debt profile for 2009 cohort: For completers and non-completers, the average student loan debt includes identifiable debt up to graduation or through FY 2015. Students who were still enrolled (had not graduated by FY 2015) were included as non-completers.

Identifiable debt: All undergraduate debt accumulated at Texas institutions as reported to the THECB, including federal and state loans, parent Plus loans, and some private educational loans.

Percentage with debt: Percentage of an institution's graduates who incurred identifiable debt prior to graduation. *FY 2015*

Statewide student debt as a percentage of first-year wage: Median of individual student's identifiable debt to first-year wage percentage for students awarded a level I or II certificate, associate degree, or bachelor's degree from a Texas public institution. Individual must have student loan debt data at time of award and wages in first year following award. Bachelor's degrees awarded at community colleges are not included. Debt data for 2014 graduates. Wage data from 2015. (Source: Financial Aid Database System, Office of Personnel Management, unemployment insurance [UI] wage records)

Degrees awarded/degrees and certificates awarded: For universities, the number of degrees awarded by race/ethnicity and level; certificates are not included. For two-year institutions, the number of degrees and certificates awarded by race/ethnicity.

FY 2016

Developmental education:

College-level course completion: Percentage of total students below state readiness standards (called Texas Success Initiative [TSI]) in math, reading, and/or writing who successfully completed a college-level course in the related area (math, reading-intensive, and/or writing-intensive, as applicable) with a grade of A, B, or C within two years of college enrollment. *Fall* 2013 cohort

Total students below state standard: Students in college for the first time (both full- and part-time) who did not meet the state readiness standards in math, reading, and/or writing at the time of enrollment. *Fall 2013 cohort*

State readiness standard met: Percentage of total students below state readiness standards in math, reading, and/or writing who satisfied state standards within two years of college enrollment. Fall 2013 cohort

Dual credit:

Dual credit students: High school students who attempt one or more college courses for high school and college credit.

Dual credit as percentage of total enrollment: Dual credit enrollment as a percentage of the total enrollment. *Fall 2016*

Dual credit outcomes: College persistence and graduation rates for an institution's dual credit students who subsequently enrolled in the same or a different Texas college or university. The percentage who earned a baccalaureate and/or associate degree is unduplicated. *Fall* **2011** *first time in college (FTIC) cohort*

Earnings of graduates: Annual wages of graduates during the first, third, fifth, eighth, and tenth year after graduation. Wage calculations include students who worked in Texas at least three-quarters of the year and did not earn a higher degree during the tracking period. No inflation factor was applied. For 2005 graduates, the wages are for 2006 (first year), 2008 (third year), 2010 (fifth year), 2013 (eighth year), 2015 (tenth year). For 2014 graduates, the first-year wages were calculated for 2015.

Enrollment:

Fall headcount: The institutional fall headcount enrollment by race and ethnicity, including all full- and part-time students. *Fall 2016*

Full-time student equivalent (FTSE) undergraduate enrollment: The sum of all fall undergraduate semester credit hours (SCH) attempted divided by 15. Fall 2016

Full-time student equivalent (FTSE) total enrollment: The sum of all fall semester credit hours (SCH) attempted divided by 15 for undergraduate SCH, 12 for master's and doctor's professional practice SCH, 9 for doctor's research/scholarship SCH, and 17 for optometry SCH. Fall 2016

Faculty:

Total university faculty: All faculty members with teaching responsibilities, excluding teaching assistants. *Fall 2015*

University tenured/tenure track faculty: All faculty members with teaching responsibilities who have received, or are on a track to receive, tenure. *Fall 2015*

Two-year college faculty: Total number of faculty members and number and percentage of full-time (teaching 80% or more) faculty members. This includes faculty teaching flex courses. *Fall 2015*

First-time students accepted: Percentage of first-time summer/fall applicants accepted by the institution. *Fall 2016*

First-time undergraduates in Texas top 10%:

The percentage of first-time undergraduates entering in the summer or fall class who ranked in the top 10% of their Texas public high school graduating class. *Fall 2016*

Fiscal year (FY): The state's fiscal year is similar to the academic year of institutions. The fiscal year runs from September 1 through August 31; for example, FY 2016 is September 1, 2015, to August 31, 2016.

Graduates' status/success:

Baccalaureate graduates' employment/ enrollment status: The percentage of graduates employed in the fourth quarter of the calendar year after graduation and/or enrolled in a Texas institution in the following fall after graduation. FY 2015

Two-year college graduates' employment/ enrollment status: The percentage of academic or technical graduates employed in the fourth quarter of the calendar year after graduation and/or enrolled in a Texas two- or four-year institution in the following fall after graduation, as specified. FY 2015

Graduation rates:

Public university 4-, 6-, and 10-year rates:

The percentage of first-time entering, degree-seeking students who graduated with a bachelor's degree or higher from the same institution or another Texas public or independent institution after 4, 6, and 10 academic years for two groups: those students who enrolled in their first fall as full-time students (taking 12 or more semester credit hours [SCH]) and those who enrolled part-time (taking fewer than 12 SCH). *Rates through FY* **2016** (for fall 2012, 2010, and 2006 cohorts, respectively)

Public two-year college 3-, 4-, and 6-year rates: The percentage of first-time, credential-seeking undergraduates who graduate within 3, 4, or 6 academic years for two groups: those students who enrolled in their first fall as full-time students (taking 12 or more semester credit hours [SCH]) and those who enrolled part-time (taking fewer than 12 SCH). Both degrees and certificates are included. *Rates through FY 2016* (for fall 2013, 2012, and 2010 cohorts, respectively)

Developmental education/non-developmental education rates: The percentage of first-time, full-time, credential-seeking undergraduates who graduated after three academic years by whether they met or did not meet state readiness standards in one or more areas under the Texas Success Initiative (TSI).

Hispanic Serving (HS): Colleges, universities, or systems/districts in which Hispanic fall headcount enrollment constitutes a minimum of 25% of the total fall headcount enrollment.

Historically Black College or University (HBCU): Any historically black college or university established prior to 1964 whose principal mission was, and is, the education of black Americans.

Lower-division: Course offerings at a level of comprehension usually associated with freshman and sophomore college students.

Percentage of graduates completing 30 SCH at a two-year college: The percentage of university graduates who took 30 or more semester credit hours (SCH) at two-year public institutions. FY 2016

Percentage of students receiving Pell Grants:

The percentage of undergraduate students who receive a Pell Grant of any amount. *Fall 2014*

Percentile: The score below which a certain percentage of observations fall. For example, the 25th percentile score is the score below which 25% of the scores may be found, and the 75th percentile score is the score below which 75% of the scores may be found.

Race/ethnicity: In addition to African American, Hispanic, and White, the following race/ethnicity categories are included.

International student: A person who is not a citizen or permanent resident of the United States and who is in this country on a temporary basis and does not have the right to remain indefinitely. It may also refer to a non-resident alien.

Other: All other races not individually listed, including Native Hawaiian, other Pacific Islander, American Indian, Native Alaskan, Asian, multiracial not including African American, or unknown origin.

Research expenditures: Total expenditures from federal, state, private, and institutional sources combined, as reported in the annual research expenditures report. FY 2016

Restricted research expenditures: Expenditures contracted, gifted, or granted by an external entity (such as government agencies, philanthropic organizations, or individuals) where the primary use must be research or development. The Coordinating Board collects restricted research expenditures for formula distribution of Research Development Funds (RDF) and as a criterion for the National Research Universities Fund (NRUF). However, restricted research expenditures are more narrowly defined here than in the Annual Financial Reports (AFR) and thus not comparable. Estimates for restricted research expenditures for institutions not participating in RDF or NRUF are research expenditures minus state appropriated funds, institutional funds, and indirect cost. FY 2016

Research expenditures per T/TT faculty

FTE: Total of federal and non-profit research expenditures per tenured/tenure-track (T/ TT) full-time faculty member equivalent (includes only faculty members with teaching responsibility). FY 2016 (research expenditures), Fall 2015 (T/TT faculty FTE)

Revenue per FTSE: Revenue, excluding auxiliary and public service funds, divided by the number of full-time student equivalents (FTSE) by categories, including total revenue, tuition and fees, state appropriation, federal funds, and institutional funds. Tuition and fees is the net of scholarship discounts and allowances. FY 2016

SAT/ACT test scores: Test score ranges are shown for Math and Critical Reading on the SAT test and for Math and English on the ACT test. Of enrolled full-time students, 50% have test scores within the ranges listed, 25% have scores above, and 25% have scores below. (Source: USDOE IPEDS data for fall 2015, most recent data available)

Student/faculty ratio: Full-time student equivalents (FTSE) divided by full-time equivalent (FTE) teaching faculty. For FTE teaching faculty, faculty reported on CBM008 must match CBM004 to be included in calculation. Fall 2015

Time and SCH to degree: The average length of time in years and number of attempted semester credit hours (SCH) to complete an associate degree (for two-year institutions) or a bachelor's degree (for four-year institutions) for students who graduated in FY 2016. Students are tracked 10 years back for accumulation of semester credit hours and total years and months that have elapsed from the first date of entry. Dual credit and developmental education hours are excluded. (Note: Dual credit hours were included in these measures prior to the 2013 almanac.)

Transfers to a senior institution:

Cohort: Number of students entering higher education for the first time at a two-year public institution who were not concurrently enrolled at a four-year institution. *Fall 2010 cohort*

Transfer rate: The percentage of students in the cohort who transferred to a senior institution within six years. *Fall 2010 cohort through FY* 2016

Two-year college students at universities:

Baccalaureate graduates who completed SCHs at two-year public colleges: Percentage of baccalaureate graduates who completed 30 or more semester credit hours (SCH) at two-year public colleges. FY 2016

Graduation of two-year college students:

Percentage of undergraduates who were first-time transfer students from Texas two-year public colleges with 30 or more semester credit hours (SCH) in the six years prior to transferring and who graduated from the same Texas public university within four years. **FY 2016**

UG: Abbreviation for undergraduate.

Upper-division: Course offerings at a level of comprehension usually associated with junior and senior college students.

Uses of funds per state-funded FTSE:

Operating expenses divided by the number of full-time student equivalents (FTSE). Operating expenses are broken out by total; instruction, research, and academic support; student services and scholarships; institutional support and operations and maintenance (OM) of plant; and other expenses (e.g., capital outlays from current fund sources). **FY 2016**

Except as noted in the almanac, the source of data is Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board institutionally certified CBM data; most measures are available in the Texas Higher Education Accountability System.

60X30TX

Strategic Plan Update

60x30TX, the state's new strategic plan for higher education, is focused on student success over the next 15 years. The plan builds on the success of *Closing the Gaps by 2015* and will establish a globally

competitive Texas workforce by 2030. The committee of business and education leaders from across Texas who developed the plan sought input from more than 5,000 stakeholders statewide.

Achieving the goals of 60x30TX rests heavily on collaboration among stakeholders in higher education, K–12 education, and the workforce. Supporting students through completion to become more actively engaged citizens and to strengthen the Texas economy means addressing college affordability and making explicit the workplace skills that students obtain in their programs. As voiced by Gov. Greg Abbott, "The strength of Texas' economy is our workforce, and a skilled and educated workforce gives Texas a competitive advantage Texas will be better because of our new focus on 60x30TX, and our brightest years are yet to come."

60x30TX has four student-centered goals in the areas of attainment, completion, marketable skills, and student debt. The new plan calls for ambitious, yet realistic, interim targets and strategies that will get Texas to its final goals in 2030.

In 2016, the THECB engaged in numerous activities to communicate and promote 60x30TX to stakeholders. In April 2016, the THECB hosted a conference on marketable skills as a forum to advance existing discourse about policy, practice, and innovation in making students aware of the marketable skills they acquire during college. From April to December, the THECB hosted a series of regional workshops across the state, supported by Lumina Foundation and College for All Texans Foundation. Local leaders from public schools, institutions of higher education, business and industry, and government and nonprofit organizations attended. The workshops provided a forum for local leaders to exchange ideas and create partnerships to help achieve the 60x30TX goals. Upon request, THECB staff has been, and remains, available to present 60x30TX to stakeholder groups.

Since the workshops, the THECB has introduced a new website, 60x30TX.com, to emphasize the goals and targets of the plan and has engaged in activities to share data on those goals and targets. In addition, the Texas Higher Education Accountability System has been revised and enhanced to align with 60x30TX. The THECB has dedicated staff, with support from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, to train and assist stakeholders in using these data.






Only about 41 percent of Texans ages 25–34 have a postsecondary degree or certificate. The best-educated societies in the world are at or near 60 percent in this age group. To compete and excel in this environment, 60x30TX sets an ambitious goal of 60 percent postsecondary attainment for young adult Texans.







Data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics make clear that students don't get much of an economic lift from college attendance unless they complete a degree or an undergraduate certificate. Texas needs to continue its record of generating impressive growth in undergraduate degree and certificate production at all colleges and universities—private, public, and for-profit. With 60x30TX, Texas aims to award a total of 6.4 million certificates or degrees by 2030. The plan also sets targets for Hispanic, African American, male, and economically disadvantaged completers and seeks to increase the percentage of students who enroll in higher education directly after high school from the current 53 percent to 65 percent.




Percentage of Texas Public High School Students Enrolling in Higher Education the Following Fall










Marketable Skills


Marketable skills are those valued by employers that can be applied in a variety of work settings, including interpersonal, cognitive, and applied skills. Students acquire these skills through curricular, co-curricular, and extracurricular activities. All programs develop skills of value in the marketplace. Students who can articulate their marketable skills are better positioned to get a suitable job. In a 2012 national study by the University of California Los Angeles Higher Education Research Institute, 88 percent of surveyed students identified "getting a better job" as the most important reason for

attending college. The 60x30TX plan requires institutions to formally identify those skills for each of its degree programs by 2030 so that students are aware of and can communicate those skills to future employers. This goal calls for every institution in Texas to articulate the identified skills to students.

GOAL By 2030, all graduates from Texas public institutions of higher education will have completed programs with identified marketable skills.

Student Debt




As a state, Texas has an opportunity to balance student loan debt and improve how higher education is financed to reduce financial barriers that students and families encounter when pursuing any level of higher education. One way to focus on student loan debt is to set the statewide goal of maintaining debt load, as measured against student earning power at graduation. 60x30TX sets the goal to keep this ratio at 60 percent for students with debt who graduate in the state. There are several facets to this goal: (1) the role of the state, (2) the role of institutions, and (3) the role of students. While there


will be variation by sector and by student, all undergraduates with student loan debt who complete a credential from a Texas public two- and/or four-year institution are included in the 60 percent calculation. In 2015, half of undergraduate students completed their degrees and certificates with student loan debt. This goal also includes a target to maintain this percentage, so that no more than half of undergraduates complete their credentials with student loan debt.

GOAL By 2030, undergraduate student loan debt will not exceed 60 percent of first-year wage for graduates of Texas public institutions.*


The amount of debt a student incurs can have a lasting impact on a student's life after college. Concerns about college costs and loan debt also can affect the student's decision to attend and persist in higher education. This page profiles undergraduate debt for students who attended Texas public higher education institutions. A trend line illustrating the percentage of students graduating with debt shows encouraging, although slight, decreases in recent years following several years of increases. Students who borrow but who do not complete, as highlighted in the 2009 cohort profile, have the burden of debt without the increased earnings potential of a degree. Also, as shown at the middle of the page, the average debt (for students with debt) and percentage of students with debt at Texas public universities differs considerably across institutions.

























Total enrollment in public, independent, and career two-year and four-year institutions from 2000 to 2016





Graduation Success

The most important measure of postsecondary success is degree completion. The tables below show enrollment and graduation success for first-time college students entering Texas public universities and two-year colleges in fall 2010. As the tables indicate, student enrollment in higher education does not ensure graduation. The tables also show that part-time students are less likely to complete a degree than are full-time students. The bar charts at the bottom show that Texas students attending public institutions of higher education enroll in more semester credit hours, on average, than are required to earn a degree, and they take longer to graduate. Statewide, success numbers increase somewhat when comparing 6- and 10-year graduation rates. Both 6- and 10-year graduation rates increase over time.









Graduation Rate of 8th Grade Cohort (2005–16)








Transfer Success

Transfer rates are becoming a more important indicator of postsecondary success since more than half of all Texas students enter higher education through a public two-year college. Students who transfer with 30 or more semester credit hours (SCH) are more likely to graduate within four years of transfer than are students who transfer with fewer than 30 SCH. Differences in transfer rates by ethnicity are also notable.









Developmental Education Profile

Although Texas continues to improve the college readiness of its high school students, those who are not college ready continue to face serious barriers on their pathway to certificates and degrees. While students entering higher education directly from high school are more likely to be college ready than are students who do not, more than half of students entering a Texas public two-year college do not meet state college-readiness standards. This lack of readiness has a negative impact on postsecondary success. Of every 100 two-year college students who are below the state readiness standard when they enter college, only 36 have graduated or are still enrolled in higher education after three years, compared to 57 out of every 100 students who enter college ready.

Number of students, out of every 100, who have graduated or are still enrolled in higher education after two years:








Total Texas Research Expenditures
























