Workforce Pell Grant Program Guidelines

Purpose

The **Workforce Pell Grant (WPG)** Program expands federal Pell Grant eligibility to include short-term, high-value workforce education training. By providing financial aid for tuition and fees, this initiative supports accelerated pathways that align with Texas economic priorities. These programs meet established workforce standards, increasing access to stackable, portable, and industry-recognized credentials that strengthen employer partnerships and the talent pipeline.

Consultation Attestation: As required by the proposed WPG regulations, the Texas Workforce Investment Council was consulted in the development of these guidelines.

Institution Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible to become a WPG program, a program must meet the following eligibility requirements:

- **State Authorization, Accreditation, and Title IV Eligibility:** Institutions must be officially authorized to operate in Texas by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB), maintain institutional accreditation from an agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education (USDOE), and be eligible to receive Title IV Pell funding to participate in the WPG Program. [Recognition of Accrediting Agencies - Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board](#)
- **Program Existence:** A program must have been in operation for at least one year before becoming a certified Workforce Pell Grant program.
- **Institutional Good Standing:** The institution offering the program must not have been subject to any suspension, emergency action, or termination of programs under Title IV in the previous five years.
- **Program Duration:** Institutions must offer short-term workforce programs leading to a recognized postsecondary credential that are at least 8 weeks and less than 15 weeks (8-14 weeks) in length and consist of at least 150 but less than 600 clock hours of instruction (150-599).
- **Program Instruction:** Program must be taught at least 75% by the offering institution, unless it is a related instruction component for a Registered Apprenticeship program, in which case at least 50% must be taught by the offering institution.
- **Program Format:** Program must not be offered as part of a correspondence course or a study abroad program (this does not exclude online programs).
- **Stackable:** The program must lead to a recognized postsecondary credential (e.g., advance certification) that provides earned credit toward an advanced certificate or degree program.
- **Portable:** The earned credential must be recognized by various employers.

- **Exception to Portable and Stackable Requirement:** Programs that prepare students for employment where there is only one recognized credential and grant that credential are excluded from the stackable and portable requirements.
- **Credit Articulation:** All programs must ensure program completers receive academic credit that is applicable toward an additional certificate or degree at one or more eligible institutions (i.e., there must be a documented pathway to a credit-bearing program).
 - **Non-credit Programs** must prove they create a pathway to further education.
 - **Registered Apprenticeship Programs** must lead to academic credit within a certificate or degree program.
- **High-Skill, High-Wage, or In-Demand:** The program must lead to a high-skill, high-wage, or in-demand occupation as defined by the governor. A list of eligible Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) codes and Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) codes will be made public.
- **Meets Employer Hiring Needs:** The program must meet the specific workforce competencies and skills, and recognized credentials required by high-skill, high-wage, or in-demand industries and occupations for employment and career advancement.
- **Completion Rate:** Programs must demonstrate a better than 70% program completion rate within 150% of its expected completion time.
- **Job Placement Rate:** Programs must demonstrate a better than 70% job placement rate within 180 days of program completion.
- **Value-Added Earnings:** Value-added earnings are to be calculated three award years after the first award year when the eligible workforce program has graduates.
 - First value-added earnings calculation would occur during the 2029-30 award year and would apply to the 2030-31 award year.
 - For the interim, THECB will collect tuition and fees information for each program submitted for eligibility.
 - Once value-added earnings are calculated, schools must limit tuition and fees to the value-added earnings calculated by USDOE if they want to maintain Workforce Pell Grant eligibility.
- **Administrative:** Institutions must have the administrative capability and capacity to track program outcomes, manage potential increases in enrollment, and complete all reporting requirements.

Steps to Become a Certified and Approved WPG Program

1. **Institutions Submit Certification Form:** Once institutions have reviewed the WPG Program requirements, they may complete the **Eligibility Certification Form** during the specified submission period to confirm institution and program eligibility.

2. **THECB Conducts an Internal Review:** After the submission of the Eligibility Certification Form, the THECB will evaluate each application for completeness and adherence to all state and federal program requirements and make recommendations for certification.
3. **Governor and USDOE Final Approvals:** Once a program is recommended for certification by the THECB, it will transition through the remaining certification and approval stages defined within these guidelines.
 - a. **Please Note:** A recommendation for program certification by the THECB does not constitute final approval as an official WPG program. Final certification will be completed by the governor, who will then send the list of WPG-certified programs to the USDOE. An institution must apply for and receive final approval from the USDOE to begin WPG implementation.
4. **Institution Administration:** Institutions will establish the internal processes to implement Workforce Pell with financial aid offices as necessary, per federal guidance to support Workforce Pell-eligible programs and students at the institution.

1.1 WPG Certification and Approval Policy and Process

- **Eligibility Certification Submission:** The institution shall submit a complete and accurate Workforce Pell Eligibility Certification Form through the designated systems of the THECB, including all required institutional and program-level data and accompanying documentation. Institutions should conduct an internal review to ensure program alignment and eligibility prior to submission of the Eligibility Certification Form.
- **Program Review and Eligibility Determination:** All proposed programs shall undergo a THECB review process to ensure alignment with federal and state eligibility criteria.
- **Data Integrity and Documentation:** The institution shall ensure all submitted data are accurate, verifiable, and supported by appropriate documentation.
- **Approval and Authorization:** To implement WPG, institutions must first submit an Eligibility Certification Form. Programs must then secure state-level certification before applying for and receiving final approval from the USDOE. Documentation verifying all state and federal approval must be maintained.
- **Post-Submission Review and Compliance:** The institution shall monitor certification and approval status, respond to requests from the USDOE, and ensure no program is offered under WPG funding until official approval is granted.

Certification and Approval Process

The certification and approval process provides a framework of steps an institution must take to be considered for WPG. Additionally, this process provides the USDOE with a list of certified-eligible programs that have been vetted to implement high-quality workforce education programs and pathways.

Phase 1: Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board Initial Review

Through the completion of an electronic Eligibility Certification Form, eligible institutions (accredited and Title IV eligible) will have an opportunity to confirm all submitted programs meet the eligibility requirements outlined above.

Phase 2: State-Level Certification

Programs who meet all WPG eligibility criteria and labor market benchmarks will be recommended for certification by the THECB. THECB will then consult with the Texas Workforce Investment Council (TWIC) to receive feedback on the list of recommended programs, which will then be sent to the governor’s office for final certification and submission to the USDOE.

Phase 3: Federal Submission and Final Approval

An institution must apply for and receive final program authorization from the USDOE to begin Workforce Pell implementation. The approved programs are activated at the federal level for WPG disbursement.

Phase 4: State-Led Program Oversight

The THECB provides annual eligibility assessments, technical support to participating institutions, and guidance for continued compliance and program implementation success.

Continued Eligibility Requirements

Each subsequent year after being certified, participating WPG institutions must:

- Submit all necessary information, including a full list of students who completed the program during the award year, for THECB to verify the job placement rate and completion rates for such award year.
- Report the program’s published tuition and fees through a process to be determined by USDOE.
- Maintain eligibility by continuing to comply with all program requirements.

Annual New Program Eligibility Certification Form Submission Period: Each future award year, THCEB will repeat Phases 1-4 to allow for new programs to apply for WPG certification.

1.2 Consultation with the Board Timeline and Process

State Workforce Development Board Definition: The State Workforce Development Board is established under Section 101 of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) and the Code of Federal Regulations, Title 20, Part 679, Subpart A. In Texas, this board is the Texas Workforce Investment Council.

THECB consulted with TWIC to develop these guidelines and the process through which an institution may request a certification that a program meets WPG requirements. Once THECB reviews submissions from institutions to determine which programs will be recommended for certification, THECB will consult with TWIC to receive feedback on the list of recommended programs. After THECB incorporates any feedback from TWIC, it will submit the recommended list of programs to the governor for final certification and submission to the USDOE.

Moving forward, THECB will continue to consult TWIC on any changes to these guidelines and before recommending any new programs for certification. TWIC and THECB will also meet annually to review program progress and ensure the certified program list aligns with the state's broader workforce goals and the WIOA state plan.

1.3 Workforce Pell Grant Program Appeal Procedure Policy and Process

Policy Statement

- **Initial Certification Decision Notification:** The THECB will issue written notification to institutions regarding denial of state-level program certification.
- **Right to Appeal:** An institution may submit a formal appeal of a denied certification decision to the THECB within 30 days of receiving written notification of denial, citing specific grounds for reconsideration.
- **Submission of Additional Evidence:** The institution may provide supplemental documentation, corrected data, or clarifying information that was not included or fully reviewed in the original submission.
- **Correction of Material Errors:** Appeals may be based on identification of factual, procedural, or data entry errors in the original evaluation that materially impacted the eligibility determination.
- **Program Reevaluation Request:** The institution may request a full reevaluation of the program against Workforce Pell eligibility criteria, including workforce alignment, program structure, and outcome measures.

- **Final Determination and Compliance:** The decision issued after review of an appeal by the THECB shall be considered final. The institutions must comply with all findings and may not resubmit until the new submission period is opened for the new program year.

Appeal Process

- **Notice of Denial**
 - The institution receives a formal denial notification from the THECB.
 - The notice includes the reasons for denial and deadlines and instructions for appealing the certification decision.
- **Appeal Submission**
 - Formal appeal is submitted within the required 30-day timeframe.
 - Appeal must include:
 - Specific grounds for reconsideration.
 - Supporting documentation or corrected data.
 - Explanation of errors or omissions in original submission.
- **State Review of Appeal**
 - The THECB will review the appeal submission.
 - Review may include:
 - Verification of new evidence.
 - Reassessment of program eligibility criteria.
 - Confirmation of data accuracy and compliance.
- **Appeal Determination**
 - A final decision is issued:
 - Approved appeal: Program proceeds to certification status.
 - Upheld denial: Completed submission remains declined.

Please note that an upheld denial is a final and binding decision. If an appeal is approved, the program must still proceed through the remaining certification and approval phases. Due to the timing of these processes, program implementation may be delayed.

1.4 High-Skill, High-Wage, or In-Demand (HHI) Industry and Occupation Methodology and Process

Methodology

The Texas Workforce Commission (TWC) uses a data-driven methodology to identify high-skill, high-wage, or in-demand occupations. A detailed write-up of the methodology as well as the list of eligible SOC codes and associated CIP codes can be found in [Appendix A](#).

The methodology was developed, to the extent possible, to align with Section 122 of the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act and Section 102 of the WIOA. Future review of this methodology will occur at least once every two years and be conducted concurrently with the development and modification of Texas's WIOA state plan.

Evidence

- **Program Identification:** Institutions must ensure all programs submitted for approval are included on the HHI list ([Appendix B](#)).
- **Eligibility Certification Form:** Institutions will complete a form and provide required program information for *each* program they are submitting for certification via Qualtrics. Each CIP code submitted in the form must be included on the HHI list.
- **Exceptions:** Programs serving as a related instruction component of a Registered Apprenticeship Program are exempt from this requirement and the “Meets Hiring Requirements of Employers” requirement (see more in 1.5). Programs seeking this exemption must submit a Certificate of Registration or other written evidence provided by the U.S. Department of Labor (DOL) confirming the program is a Registered Apprenticeship Program.

1.5 Meets Hiring Requirements of Employers Policy and Process

Hiring Requirements of Employers Definition: The specific workforce competencies, skills, and recognized credentials identified by high-skill, high-wage, or in-demand industries and occupations as necessary for employment and career advancement.

Evidence

To be eligible for Workforce Pell, a program must meet the hiring requirements of employers in the associated high-skill, high-wage, or in-demand occupation. To prove a program meets the hiring needs of employers, the institution must provide two letters of support from employer partners, employer associations, sector partnerships, registered apprenticeship sponsors, or labor-management partnerships. Participating institutions will be required to upload these two letters via the Eligibility Certification Form, and the letters must contain:

- The specific skills and competencies the program provides.
- Confirmation that these competencies meet the employer’s current hiring requirements.

These employer letters may also be used as evidence of portability across employers (see more in 1.6).

Registered Apprenticeship Programs are exempt from this requirement.

1.6 Stackable and Portable Policy and Process

- **Stackable Credentials:** A credential is considered stackable when it is part of a sequence of credentials that a student can pursue at one or more institutions of higher education.
- **Portable Credentials:** A credential is considered portable when it is recognized and accepted across a variety of settings, such as different employers.

Evidence

To be eligible for Workforce Pell, programs must provide credentials that are both stackable and portable as defined above. To prove these requirements are met, institutions must provide following acceptable evidence:

- **Stackable:**
 - Written documentation demonstrating a student’s ability to receive academic credit for an earned credential that counts toward the progressive attainment of a certificate or degree. This may include degree maps showing a sequence of credentials or educational programs, official articulation agreements (see Section 1.7), or data demonstrating that students have obtained credentials through career pathways.
- **Portable:**
 - Two letters from employers verifying that students earning the credential offered by the program are eligible for employment. Letters should list the specific skills and competencies the program provides and confirm these skills meet their current hiring requirements. THECB considers written documentation that a program is a Registered Apprenticeship Program (see more in 1.4) as evidence of portability.

Sole Recognized Credential Exception: A program that prepares students for an occupation for which there is only one recognized postsecondary credential is exempt from demonstrating the credential is stackable and portable. An institution must submit written evidence that a program qualifies for this exception, which may include statutes, regulations, state or national licensing standards, licensing board rules or guidance, statutory or regulatory excerpts, official agency letters or webpages, or governing occupational standards. This submitted documentation may also be used as evidence the program ensures the award of credit upon completion (see more in 1.7).

In future WPG implementation, THECB will consider available real-time labor market information and data on student’s career pathways when determining if a credential is stackable and portable.

1.7 Program Awards Credit Upon Completion Policy and Process

To be eligible for WPG, a program must ensure the award of academic credit toward a subsequent certificate or degree upon a student’s successful completion of the eligible program.

Evidence

To show a program ensures the award of credit upon completion, an institution must submit:

1. **Award of Credit at Same Institution:** Official internal documentation, which may include a degree map as outlined in Section 1.6, demonstrating that the program ensures the award of academic credit toward a subsequent certificate or degree; OR
2. **Award of Credit at Different Institution:** Any written agreements demonstrating awarded credit will be accepted by one or more eligible institutions. This may include established articulation agreements, transfer-of-credit agreements, consortium or partnership agreements, or similar arrangements.

For non-credit programs, institutions are required to maintain a formal process to eventually record these competencies as credit should the student matriculate into an advanced, for-credit certificate or degree program. Any submitted documentation must reflect this commitment.

THECB considers written documentation a program qualifies for the Sole Recognized Credential Exception (see more in 1.6) as evidence meeting this requirement.

1.8 Accountability Metrics (Job Placement Rate and Completion Rate)

To be eligible for WPG, a program must annually demonstrate:

- A better than 70% program completion rate within 150% of normal completion time.
- A better than 70% job placement rate within 180 days of program completion.

Evidence

THECB is requesting student-level data to determine which programs meet required accountability metrics. To accurately measure program completion and placement rates in the specified timeframes, the data reported must be from the most recently completed program year, which for this round of applications is August 1, 2024-July 31, 2025. For each program applying for certification, institutions will need to submit student names and Social Security numbers, the institution-specific program identifier associated with the student's enrollment, the student's start date and their actual and expected completion date, and if a student qualifies for any regulatory exception (i.e. death, medical incapacity, military service, or incarceration).

Appendix A: Workforce Pell Grant Occupation Eligibility Methodology

Purpose

Workforce Pell requires eligible programs to lead to occupations that have been identified by the state as high-skill, high-wage, or in-demand (HHI) occupations. For Texas, the methodology for identifying eligible occupations for purposes of Workforce Pell uses Texas Labor Market Information occupation projections and wage data to identify occupations that meet all three of those criteria.

Eligibility Standard

An occupation must meet all three of the following criteria to be included on the Workforce Pell occupation list:

- The occupation pays a high wage.
- The occupation requires high skill.
- The occupation is in demand.

Occupations that meet only one or two of the criteria are not included.

Definitions

High-Wage: A high-wage occupation is one for which the median annual wage is greater than the statewide median wage of \$47,499.

High-Skill: A high-skill occupation is classified by the Texas Workforce Commission (TWC) as a middle-skill occupation based on Bureau of Labor Statistics education and training assignments.

Occupations qualify as "high-skill" if they fall into one of the following categories:

- Associate degree
- Some college, no degree
- Postsecondary non-degree award
- High school diploma or equivalent plus apprenticeship
- High school diploma or equivalent plus short-term, moderate-term, or long-term on-the-job training

In-Demand: An occupation is considered "in-demand" if it appears in TWC's *Report on Texas Growth Occupations – 2025*.

Below is the step-by-step methodology by which Texas creates its final HHI List for purposes of Workforce Pell eligibility:

Step #	Step Detail
1	Download Texas Labor Market Information Occupation Projections (2022-2032) from " Popular Downloads ." - Report Title: Occupations Projections
2	<p>Remove rows where Summary Level is NOT Detail [tab: Occ Ed Wages (w Identifiers)].</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In-Demand – Match occupations with TWC's <i>Report on Texas Growth Occupations</i> and flag matches as in-demand. • High-Skill – Flag occupations that fall into the educational assignments identified for high-skill. • High-Wage – Flag occupations where the median annual wage is greater than \$47,499.
3	Create a variable (HHI) to indicate which occupations meet all three requirements: in demand, high skill, and high wage.
4	Use the NCES CIP-to-SOC crosswalk to determine the academic programs that each SOC maps to.

Resulting Output

The final output will be a list of qualifying occupations linked to the corresponding programs of study (CIP codes) maintained by THECB.
