Each year the governor and the lieutenant governor may each appoint two students and two alternates, and each state senator and each state representative may appoint one student and one alternate to receive an initial scholarship. Students must meet specific requirements to be eligible for a nomination. Details about the scholarship and the nomination process can be found on the attached flyer.

2024-2025 TASSP nominations will be accepted **through August 30, 2024**. To submit a formal nomination, you or your designated staff member will go to the Coordinating Board portal: <u>https://www1.thecb.state.tx.us/apps/tassp/</u>.

Texas Armed Services Scholarship Program

WE WANT YOU! TO NOMINATE A STUDENT TODAY.

You have the power to provide a Texas student with the life-changing opportunity to attend college and serve our country.

As a member of the Texas Legislature, you can nominate one student annually to receive the Texas Armed Services Scholarship. You can nominate any student - they don't have to be a member of your district. The student can be a senior in high school or currently enrolled in higher education.

About the scholarship

This scholarship is designed for students planning to participate in Reserve Officers' Training Corps (ROTC) programs at civilian colleges.

Students who receive this scholarship also commit to serving four years in the Texas Army National Guard, Texas Air National Guard, Texas State Guard, U.S. Coast Guard, or U.S. Merchant Marine, or as a commissioned officer in any branch of the armed services of the United States.

Financial benefit to students

Eligible students can receive up to \$15,000 a year to help them attend the college of their choice.

Eligibility requirements

A student must meet specific eligibility requirements to be nominated.

High school seniors must meet two of the following four academic criteria at the time of application:

- On track to graduate or have graduated high school and completed the curriculum requirements of the Distinguished Level of Achievement Plan or the International Baccalaureate Program (IB)
- Have a high school GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale
- Achieved a college readiness score on the SAT (1070) or ACT (23)
- Ranked in the top one-third of the prospective high school graduating class

Students already enrolled in higher education must also do the following:

- Maintain satisfactory academic progress
- Continue to be a member of a ROTC program or another undergraduate officer commissioning program
- Have not earned a baccalaureate degree or a cumulative total of 150 credit hours, including transfer credit hours

To receive an initial award, students must meet additional requirements.

How to nominate a student

Formal appointments must be made by the governor, lieutenant governor, a legislator, or their designee through an online process approved by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board. Nominate a student at https://www1.thecb.state.tx.us/apps/tassp/ or by scanning the QR code below.
