#### Financial Aid Advisory Committee Meeting Notes March 4, 2021 (To be approved at the June 3, 2021, FAAC Meeting)

- A request for extension of time to make available e-TASFA online application was sent to the legislator, doing so would avoid significant work that would be completed within a year in efforts to align the implementation of the new simplification bill (expected availability of online application: October 1, 2022 for the 2023-2024 academic year).
- Other areas of development considered by THECB not included in other convening of the committee:
  - What it means to integrate e-TASFA into the Apply Texas system.
  - Institutions of Higher Education renewal process.
  - Consideration of expansion of the FAAC's TASFAC sub-committee to expand feedback opportunities to assist in the E-TASFA scope of work as well as the paper TASFA.

#### Discussion:

- Robert Merino TASFAC sub-committee should include more private school representation, as well as representation from the Rio Grande Valley.
- Committee members agreed with the expansion of the TASFA sub-committee role.

#### **Presentation Summary:**

<u>Budget:</u> Commissioner Keller has testified before the Senate Finance and House Appropriations Committee on the importance of investing adequately in higher education.

- Both the Senate and House General Appropriations Act have introduced bills in both chambers that include a 5% reduction
  of the major financial aid programs.
- THECB's budget proposal for the next biennium include the following two exceptional items:
  - Restoration of the 5% base cut, which is approximately \$57 million dollars across the 3 major financial aid programs – requesting to return budget back to the level set for the current biennium.
  - Requested additional \$110 million funding to maintain funding for the service level for the major financial aid programs for next biennium.

#### Policy:

- As it relates to policy aspect of Higher Education, Charles has shared with the committee bills filed by legislators, (e.g., Promise Grant Programs, and new exemption bills). Deadline for filing bills is March 12, 2021; however, it is unclear as to what bills will advance during this session.
- John does not foresee major groundbreaking Higher Ed. legislation being advanced this session. Health and safety protocols have limited legislators' ability to maintain workflow while having to address COVID19, budget deficient, a re-districting year, and the recent power outages.
- The legislature is also aware of the misalignment issues with the FAFSA Simplification Act (FSA) and the new required e-TASFA implementation.

#### <u>Q&A:</u>

- Committee asked if there are ways to assist the legislation to rectify issues surrounding the timing and misalignment challenges facing the FSA and electronic TASFA? Institutions and various leadership should increase awareness of these issues and reach out to legislators about these challenges as it always good for legislators to hear from more than one entity within the higher education industry.
- Committee asked if consideration was given to the loss of income for families when determining the
  additional \$110 million budget request? Numbers were based on last summer's growth factors for the financial aid
  programs; however unusual growth due to the pandemic was not factored in; however, budget information provided to the
  legislature are normally estimates.
- Committee asked how would additional COVID19 relief funds received (CRSSA Act) flow down to
  universities? Federal funds going directly to institutions have already gone out through the CARES Act GEER funds.
  \$175 million went to Coordinating Board to support financial aid programs through CARES ACT GEER funding. The
  additional GEER funding (CRSSA Act) received by the Governor's office who will determine how those additional funding will
  be allocated to support primary, secondary, and higher education. Committee was directed to review meeting handouts that
  contain information regarding the initial GEER funds received and impact of the EEG's (Emergency Educational Grants) as
  well as demographic information regarding recipients. Feedback received from institutions was tracked by CB on best
  practices and helpful insights.

For example, the student's biographic information is first, then school information, then the parent income info, then student income info, then other miscellaneous questions. This would be helpful for students, because the TASFA application jumps around a lot. Students have to jump from parent information to student information and back again. 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Discussion Topic: FAD Modernization Project-DeCha Reid	Virtual Meeting
This topic will discuss a new project to modernize importing FAD data to THECB.	
<b>Update:</b> An opportunity for FAD to be part of the data modernization project, as the modernization moves from proof of concept to development. The data modernization project consists of a data load, data analysis and data reporting. There are two phases of the project:	
<ul> <li>Phase One: Modernize the internal data to a cloud base platform</li> <li>Phase Two: Modernize the FAD application to web-base</li> </ul>	
The first phase would likely be a six-month project, launching soon. While the second phase may take longer, however both phases will be in parallel.	
Some of the key benefits of modernizing FAD are:	
<ul> <li>The rules for errors and warnings would be separated from the programming that loads data into our system. This allows the standardization of the data load framework for all the data institutions submit to the THECB.</li> <li>Rules will be individually defined and retained in a library. When data is loaded by an institution, the rules unique to that type of data load will fire. This provides two primary benefits.</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>First, institutions will receive feedback on their submission within minutes, if not seconds.</li> <li>Second, the rules will be maintained by the business unit.</li> </ul>	
• The possibility of removing flat file structure, so that institutions can do their work in Excel, allowing easier resolution of errors and warnings.	
Institutions benefit from an easier, timelier, and more responsive data load process. And Student Financial Aid Programs benefits from greater control of errors and warning rules and, ideally, earlier certification of institutional data and a reduction in the volume of inquiries received from institutions trying to get their data through the system.

One of the challenges is Sec. 51.9095 of the statute cannot be easily repealed without modifying other language in the statute which could cause an impact on other state financial aid programs.

Some agency thoughts on the topic:

- TASFA students are built into the application so this will be an impact on students who complete the FAFSA.
- Have ability to modify the administrative rules but not the statute
  - One recommendation: remove section B from the administrative rules however it would mean that every student would need a selective service statement
  - Second recommendation: modify a rule so the schools can go online directly to bypass collecting a selective service statement.
  - Third recommendation: Modify a rule to allow the school to have a student sign a selective service statement and bypass the SS website.

# Committee Feedback

- Make the student upload something from the SSA website rather than the schools, since there are way too many students and a huge burden on the schools.
- Schools have already built into their system that students have to sign an electronic statement and still have those students that cannot upload a document from SSA.
- Can selective service be added to the ApplyTX?
  - Not all students will use ApplyTX like transfer students
- Schools that have a large portion of exemptions/waivers that are handled by other areas on the schools and can be complexed on handling the administration of selective service.

- The College Access Loan (CAL) interest rate will be adjusted effective July 1. A borrower's interest rate is based on the date the school certifies the CAL application. The current bond market suggests that the CAL interest rate will drop on July 1.
