

#### TEXAS HIGHER EDUCATION COORDINATING BOARD FAMILY MEDICINE RESIDENCY TRAINING PROGRAM SUPPORT PROGRAM MAY 27, 2020 UPDATE TO THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE UNTHSC/TCOM FACULTY DEVELOPMENT CENTER

During the grant year 2018 - 2019 (FY19) and 2019 - 2020 (FY20) to date, the University of North Texas Health Science Center (UNTHSC) / Texas College of Osteopathic Medicine (TCOM) Faculty Development Center conducted a variety of programs that support the development of undergraduate and graduate Family Medicine education in Texas. Through these programs the Faculty Development Center aims to strengthen the infrastructure of Texas academic Family Medicine.

The UNTHSC/TCOM Faculty Development Center (FDC) used THECB funds to operate the FDC to train Family Medicine faculty, preceptors, administrators and resident physicians via the following activities:

- 1. Graduate Certificate in Academic Medicine Fellowship;
- 2. Family Medicine Leadership Conference for chairs, directors, faculty and administrators;
- 3. Chief Resident Leadership Conference for incoming chief residents;
- 4. Preceptor training;
- 5. On Demand and contracted workshops for faculty and residents at Texas FM Residency Programs or Departments of FM;
- 6. Staff presentations at conferences and meetings;
- 7. Resource and curriculum development, both for use internally and for use by our constituent organizations; and
- 8. Other consultations.

#### Staff Update

1. Maria Orozco-Guzman was hired as administrative support. FDC supports 0.5 FTE of her position.

#### OTHER TRAINING ACTIVITIES

#### (THESE NUMBERS DO NOT INCLUDE ANNUAL PROGRAMS)

Upon request & given mutually agreeable date/time, our FM program / department constituents around the state are provided one ½ day workshop/training session each academic year, with no charge for professional fees; thereafter the fee is \$500 per ½ day session. Constituent program/department pays travel & lodging. Faculty, residents and/or staff may be the training subjects. The content is tailored to constituent need, with a variety of standard topics as a basis. Often a new, customized topic is requested. FDC staff develops much of their new training materials in response to such requests.

#### 2018-2019:

In addition to the individuals consulted with or trained via FDC annual programs, FDC held 16 (8 didactic sessions; 8 consultation sessions) on-demand or contracted training sessions, netting 242 trainee encounters with: 24 faculty, 192 resident physicians (including 106 during didactic sessions and 86 individual project consultations), 15 medical students at FM venues, and 1 administrative or other trainees. We led Scholars' Day activities where 10 scholarly presentations were made by resident physicians under FDC staff tutelage. FDC staff attended Research Day activities of 3 FM Residency Programs. We also reviewed, accepted for presentation, configured space and organized the judging process for 39 posters during TCOM Educational Conclave.

#### Update (Academic Year July 1 through May 27, 2020):

FDC held **18** (9 didactic sessions; 8 consultation sessions; 1 guided session) ondemand or contracted training sessions, netting **212** trainee encounters with: **41** faculty, **147** resident physicians (including 101 during didactic sessions and 46 individual project consultations), **13** medical students at FM venues, and **1** administrative or other trainees. We led Scholars' Day activities where **10** scholarly presentations were made by resident physicians under FDC staff tutelage. One 3hour workshop was held virtually. We are producing an online poster session for TCOM Educational Conclave. Posters are being reviewed, accepted for presentation and organized for the judging process.
