

Texas Transfer Framework

Field of Study Curriculum Components

Under the rules, a Field of Study Curriculum consists of the following components:

- Selected discipline-specific Texas Core Curriculum courses, of an unspecified number of hours NOTE: The number of Texas Core Curriculum courses will be determined by the Discipline Specific Subcommittee and will include only those courses relevant for the major course of study.
- o Discipline Foundation Courses, up to 12 SCH
- Directed Electives, at least 6 SCH

NOTE: The Directed Electives will be submitted to the Coordinating Board by each receiving institution (university) and may include lower-division courses critical for student success in that major.

- A student is $\underline{\mathsf{FOSC}\text{-}\mathsf{complete}}$ when entering with all three of the above blocks complete.
- A student is <u>FOSC-incomplete</u> when entering with partial completion of any blocks complete.

Texas Transfer Advisory Committee (TTAC)

- The committee has 24 members with two co-chairs, Drs. Laurel Williamson and James Hallmark, and includes 2 ex-officio members who are advisors and 2 ex-officio members who are students.
- The TTAC met on November 10, 2021 and recommended that the revised Criminal Justice and Business Administration Fields of Study be forwarded to the Commissioner for approval.
- During the TTAC meeting, the committee also established the following subcommittees, which will be completing their work over the next several months: sociology, political science, social work, psychology, and biology.
