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
GEER Phase I: \$175 Million

Investments to Support Economic Recovery

- GEER Phase I funding focused on immediate Texas higher education needs.
- Funds provided direct aid to students, promoted paths for rapid reskilling, and enabled students to stay on track towards earning their credentials.
- Funding is also supporting strategic investments to improve digital learning and modernize the state's educational and workforce data infrastructure.

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Lessons Learned from GEER Phase I Investments

Persistent challenges for students, institutions, employers

- Gaps between skills Texans have today and skills needed for tomorrow's jobs
- Limited training capacity for high-value programs and credentials
- Persistent challenges in bridging access for adults, transfer, low-income students
- Adult Texans returning to postsecondary education need continued support
- HEERF allocations offset some costs and revenue losses for institutions but also can be used for strategic investments
