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## Advise TX Background

- Advise TX College Advising Corps (CAC) launched in 2010-2011.
- Works to increase the number of low-income, first-generation college, and underrepresented high school students who enter and complete a postsecondary education.
- The program model utilizes near-peer advisers by placing well-trained recent college graduates in high schools with historically low college-going rates.
- Advisers serve one to two years as full-time Advise TX Advisers.
- Advisers:
  - provide guidance on how to research, select, and apply to colleges
  - help with completion of financial aid (FAFSA/TASFA) applications
  - provide feedback on college essays
  - help interpret and compare financial aid award letters
  - host meetings with parents and families

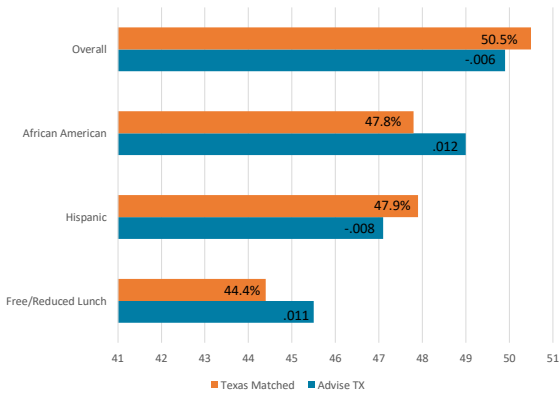

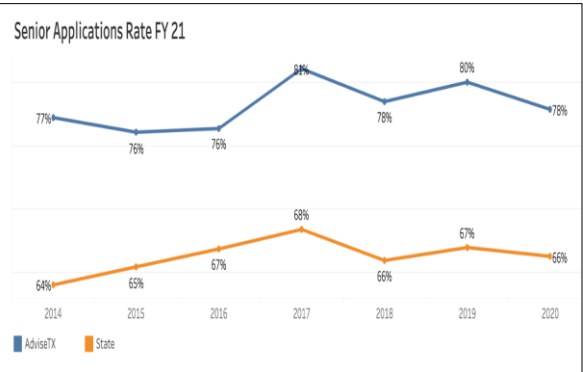
## Advise TX Matched Group Data Analysis
