Texas Research Incentive Program (TRIP) Overview

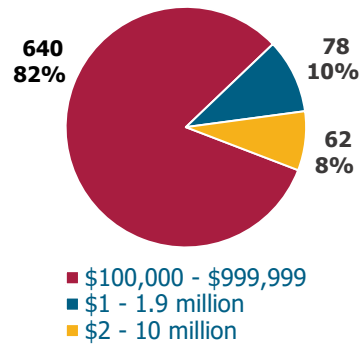
- Established in 2009 to provide matching funds to assist eligible institutions in leveraging private gifts for the enhancement of research productivity and faculty recruitment.
- Eligible institutions must be designated as an Emerging Research University:
 - Texas State University
 - Texas Tech University
 - The University of Texas at Arlington
 - The University of Texas at Dallas
 - The University of Texas at El Paso
 - The University of Texas at San Antonio
 - University of Houston
 - University of North Texas



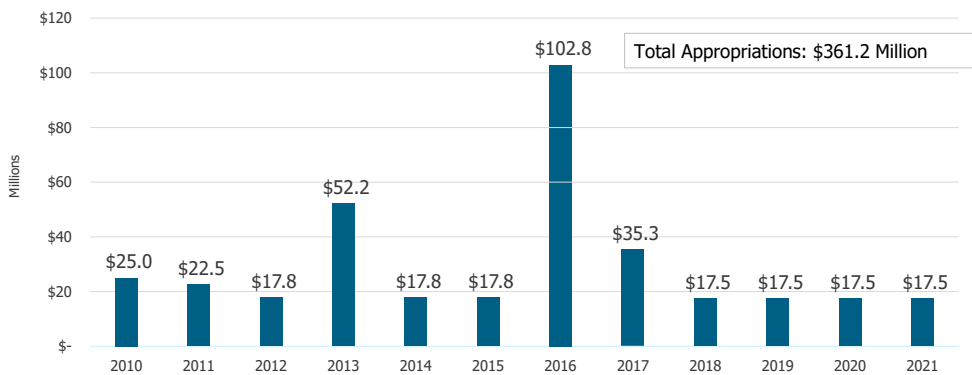
Qualifying Gifts Matched to State Dollars

- Since 2010, \$461 million in private gifts have been matched by state funds
- Gifts must be certified by the Coordinating Board to receive state matching funds
- The state match rate for qualifying gifts is set in statute:
 - 50%: \$100,000 to \$999,999
 - 75%: \$1 million to \$1,999,999
 - 100%: \$2 million to \$10 million

Number of Gifts by Match Rate

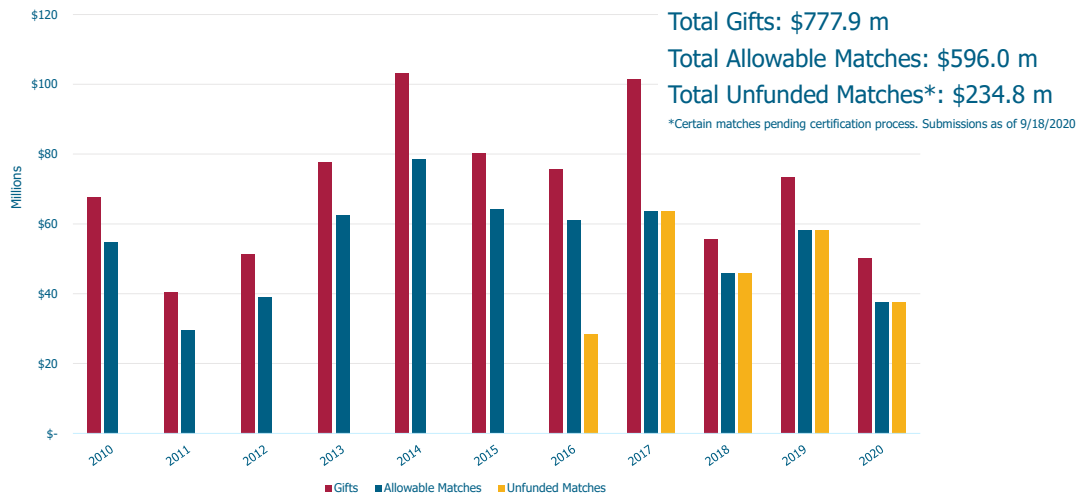


Legislative Appropriations: FY 2010-2021



TRIP appropriations have varied over time. The program currently has more eligible gifts available to be matched than appropriated funding.

TRIP Review and Certification Process

- 113 matching requests received
- Peers challenged 45 submissions
- 103 gifts recommended for funding
- Gifts recommended to be certified for state match by Board:
\$61.7 million
