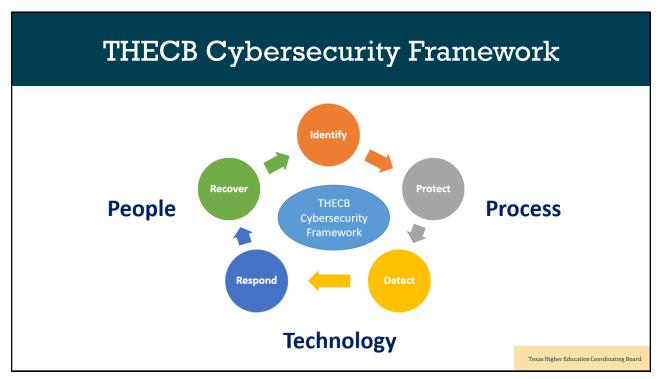

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FY2021 Agency Cybersecurity Framework Assessment Results

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Biennial Cybersecurity Framework Assessment

- As a state agency, the Coordinating Board is required by the statute to go through a biennial review of its information security program for compliance with the standards set forth by the Texas Cybersecurity Framework.
- In the first quarter of 2021, AT&T Cybersecurity, vendor contracted by the Department of Information Resources (DIR), conducted an assessment on the 42 control objectives implemented at the agency.
- AT&T Assessor presented the final report and key recommendations at the April 2021 AOC meeting.

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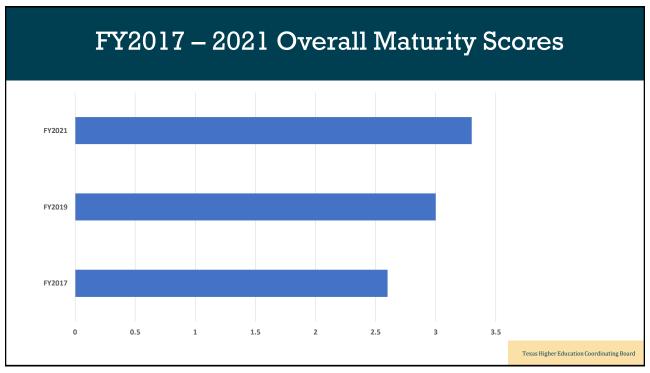
Maturity Criteria There is no evidence of the organization meeting the objective to meeting the objective. **Optimized** Level 4 The organization has a consistent overall approach to meeting the Managed objective, but it is still mostly reactive and undocumented. The Level 3 organization does not routinely measure or enforce policy Defined The organization has a documented, detailed approach to meeting Level 2 3 the objective, and regularly measures its compliance Repeatable The organization uses an established risk management framework to measure and evaluate risk and integrate improvements beyond the requirements of applicable regulations. Level 1 Initial The organization has refined its standards and practices focusing on 5 ways to improve its capabilities in the most efficient and cost-

effective manner.

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Key Recommendations - FY2021 Assessment

- Document and review all accounts with elevated access and develop a strategy for sustained minimization.
- Work with general counsel and procurement leadership to define the agency's base set of contractual security requirements for information technology with third parties and include the additional contractual terms and conditions for Cloud technologies.
- Baseline configurations should be thoroughly tested, formally approved, and then modified only through change control.
