Texas Research Incentive Program (TRIP) Overview

Purpose: Leverage private gifts for the enhancement of research productivity and faculty recruitment by providing matching funds based on how much an institution raises in private gifts and endowments.

State Match Rate for Qualifying Gifts

- 50%: \$100,000 to \$999,999
- 75%: \$1 million to \$1,999,999
- 100%: \$2 million to \$10 million


