

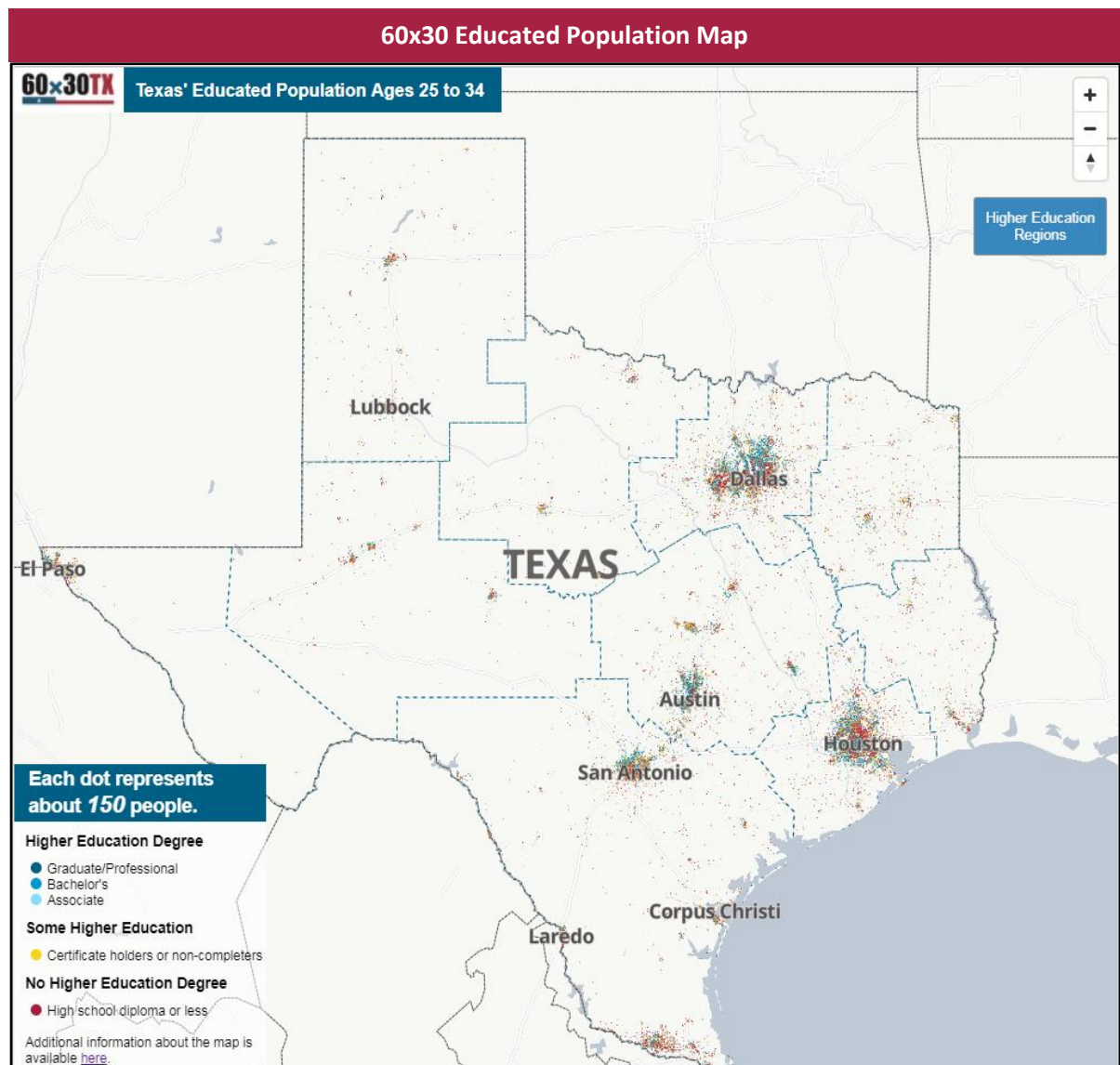
60x30 Educated Population Map

Population Ages 25-34 by Education Level

September 2017

To support achievement of the 60x30 Educated Population goal of 60x30TX, the agency has developed an interactive map which shows visually how education levels of Texas residents ages 25-34 are distributed throughout the state. This is a dot-density map where dots are used to represent groups of Texans.

- The color of each dot indicates the education level of a group.
- The pattern or density of dots provides perspective on the geographic distribution of education levels in Texas.
- Regional boundary lines may be added (as shown).
- Zooming in or out changes the number of people each dot represents.

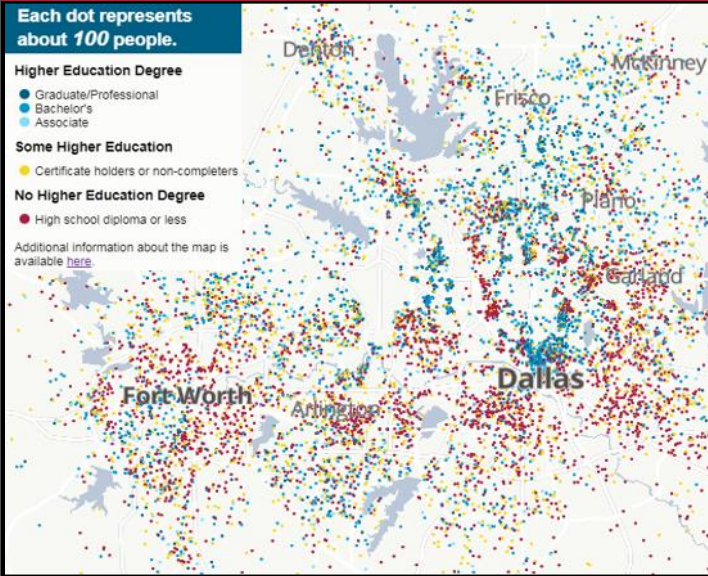

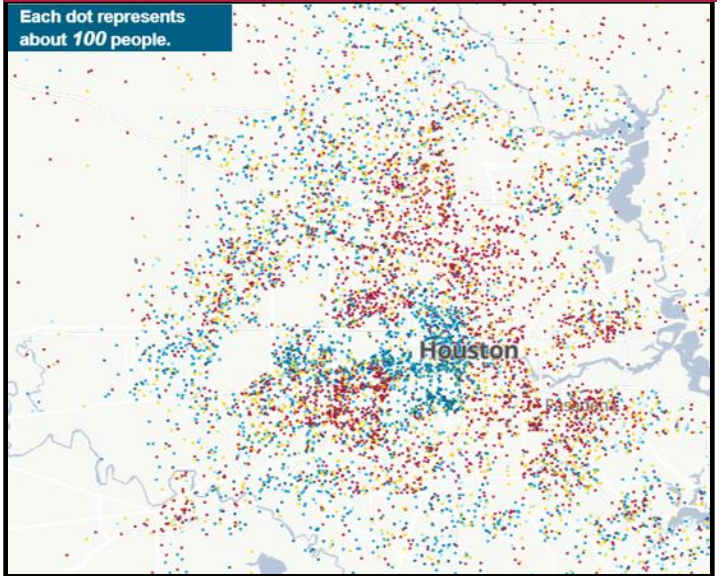

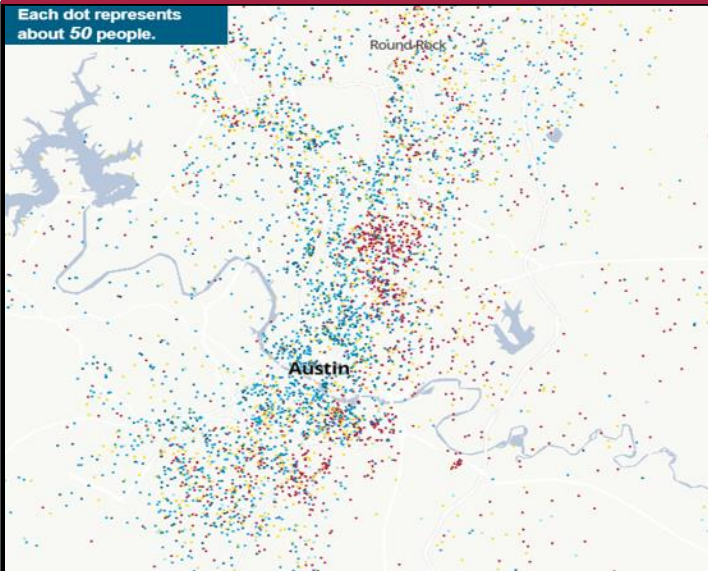
Houston

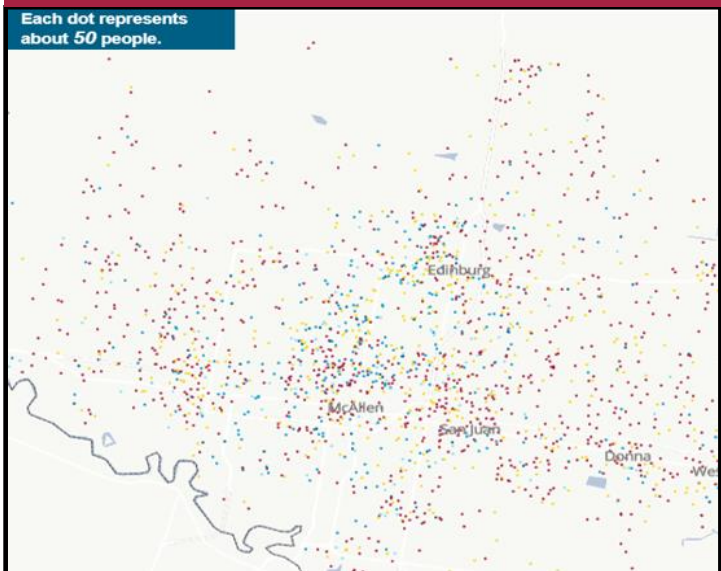

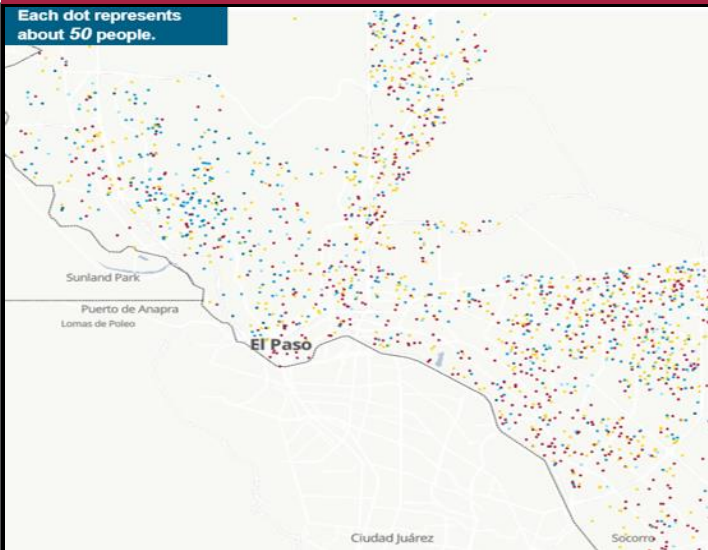
