Administrator's Statement

Amarillo Junior College District respectfully supports the lump sum \$1.833 billion formula funding request submitted by the Texas Association of Community Colleges on September 19, 2020.

Amarillo College has had modest growth in enrollment and contact hours in the past 2 years, and foresee that increase continuing.

Amarillo College receives no funding beyond the funding formula that would be applicable to any reduction. The college continues to be fiscally responsible and looks for ways to reduce costs while maintaining a high level of service to our students, community, and local workforce. Amarillo College is not requesting additional funds in the LAR beyond the formula funding that it currently has been appropriated. State support remains critical to the district as it continues to fulfil its statutory role and mission to offer vocational, technical, and academic courses for certification or associate degrees. Together with Texas' other 49 community college districts, we will continue do much of the heavy lifting in the state's efforts to achieve the 60X30TX plan. State support will further be necessary to help address costs related to mitigating the effects of the pandemic, including transitioning to distance education, providing for personal protective equipment, and safely delivering the required in-person instruction essential for students in healthcare and other technical/vocational programs. The impact of COVID-19 has been far reaching for Amarillo College. There was and still is a lot of money, time and resources that had to be used in a short amount of time to respond to the pandemic.

In response to the economic downturn resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic, Texas community colleges began developing a workforce initiative aimed at providing low or no-cost short-term workforce training leading to high-demand credentials to Texans whose employment and/or academics had been recently disrupted. Amarillo College District respectfully supports the \$50M exceptional item request submitted by TACC in support of this statewide workforce initiative, funded in the amount of \$1M per college district for the 2022-23 biennium.

Amarillo College is a comprehensive community college founded in 1929. AC is guided by the No Excuses 2025 Strategic Plan through 2025 which has been approved by the Board of Regents and supported by the Administration and Faculty. The strategic plan is highlighted by the following goals.

- Increase completion by improving persistence, decreasing time-to-completion, and creating a comprehensive transfer/completion pathway
- Align Degree and certificates with current and new labor market demand
- Increased Learning
- Equitable degree and certificate attainment
- Build systems for financial effectiveness

Amarillo College is committed to hiring the most qualified employees as well as to provide a safe and secure environment for all of our students, staff, and community. To ensure this, the college conducts background checks on all security-sensitive positions as permitted by the Texas Government Code, Sec. 411.094 and Texas Education Code, Section 61.003 (8), and consistent with the college's human resources policies and procedures.
