Southwest Texas Junior College respectfully supports the \$1.83 billion formula funding request submitted by the Texas Association of Community Colleges (TACC) in its letter to the Legislative Budget Board and the Governor's Office, Budget Division. State support remains critical to the district as it continues to fulfill its statutory role and mission to offer vocational, technical, and academic courses for certification or associate degrees. Together with Texas' other 49 community college districts, we will continue do much of the heavy lifting in the state's efforts to achieve the 60X30TX plan. State support will further be necessary to help address costs related to mitigating the effects of the pandemic, including transitioning to distance education, providing for personal protective equipment, and safely delivering the required in-person instruction essential for students in healthcare and other technical/vocational programs.

In response to the economic downturn resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic, Texas community colleges began developing a workforce initiative aimed at providing low or no-cost short-term workforce training leading to high-demand credentials to Texans whose employment and/or academics had been recently disrupted. Southwest Texas Junior College respectfully supports the \$50M exceptional item request submitted by TACC in support of this statewide workforce initiative, funded in the amount of \$1M per college district for the 2022-23 biennium.


At Southwest Texas Junior College background checks are conducted on all security-sensitive positions as permitted by the Texas Government Code, Sec. 411.094 and Texas Education Code, Section 61.003 (8), and consistent with the college's human resources policies and procedures.

With the funding from the State of Texas, the College will be able to address the unprecedented challenges of the current state of pandemic. SWTJC has instituted new policies and protocols for in-person lab attendance on campus, including sanitizing, and health monitoring. The College has instituted remote learning for academic courses and invested heavily in technology to support this remote learning.

The College continues to enhance partnerships with public school districts to assist them in expanding their offerings through dual credit, technical programs, early college high schools, and early college.

SWTJC is continuing to embrace the Pathways initiative as a Cadre 1 school and has pursued alignment with Sul Ross Rio Grande College, while participating in the selection of its new leadership.

The College, with State funding, is committed to assisting in the re-training and re-hiring of Texans through our technical and workforce programs, while keeping all students, faculty, and staff safe and healthy.
