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Administrator's Statement

Temple College respectfully supports the \$1.83 billion formula funding request submitted by the Texas Association of Community Colleges (TACC) in its letter to the Legislative Budget Board and the Governor's Office, Budget Division. State support remains critical to the district as it continues to fulfil its statutory role and mission to offer vocational, technical, and academic courses for certification or associate degrees. Together with Texas' other 49 community college districts, we will continue do much of the heavy lifting in the state's efforts to achieve the 60X30TX plan. State support will further be necessary to help address costs related to mitigating the effects of the pandemic, including transitioning to distance education, providing for personal protective equipment, and safely delivering the required in-person instruction essential for students in healthcare and other technical/vocational programs.

In response to the economic downturn resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic, Texas community colleges began developing a workforce initiative aimed at providing low or no-cost short-term workforce training leading to high-demand credentials to Texans whose employment and/or academics had been recently disrupted. Temple College respectfully supports the \$50M exceptional item request submitted by TACC in support of this statewide workforce initiative, funded in the amount of \$1M per college district for the 2022-23 biennium.

Additional support from the State of Texas will allow Temple College to make several critical investments in support of our students and area workforce needs :

- * Build infrastructure and capacity for area workforce needs;
- * Create low-cost or no-cost high demand workforce training programs;
- * Add support for seamless pathways that are short in duration and stackable.

The College has been heavily involved in developing academic pathways and now needs to expand career and technical pathways. Current budgets do not provide adequate funding for support of workforce needs. With essential requested funding, upcoming Pathways Initiatives will enhance the efficiency of moving students through the "pipeline" from entry to employment and graduation. All of these efforts are critical to the economic future of the State of Texas.

Background checks are conducted on all security-sensitive positions as permitted by the Texas Government code, Sec. 411.094 and Texas Education Code, Section 61.003 (8), and consistent with the college's human resources policies and procedures.

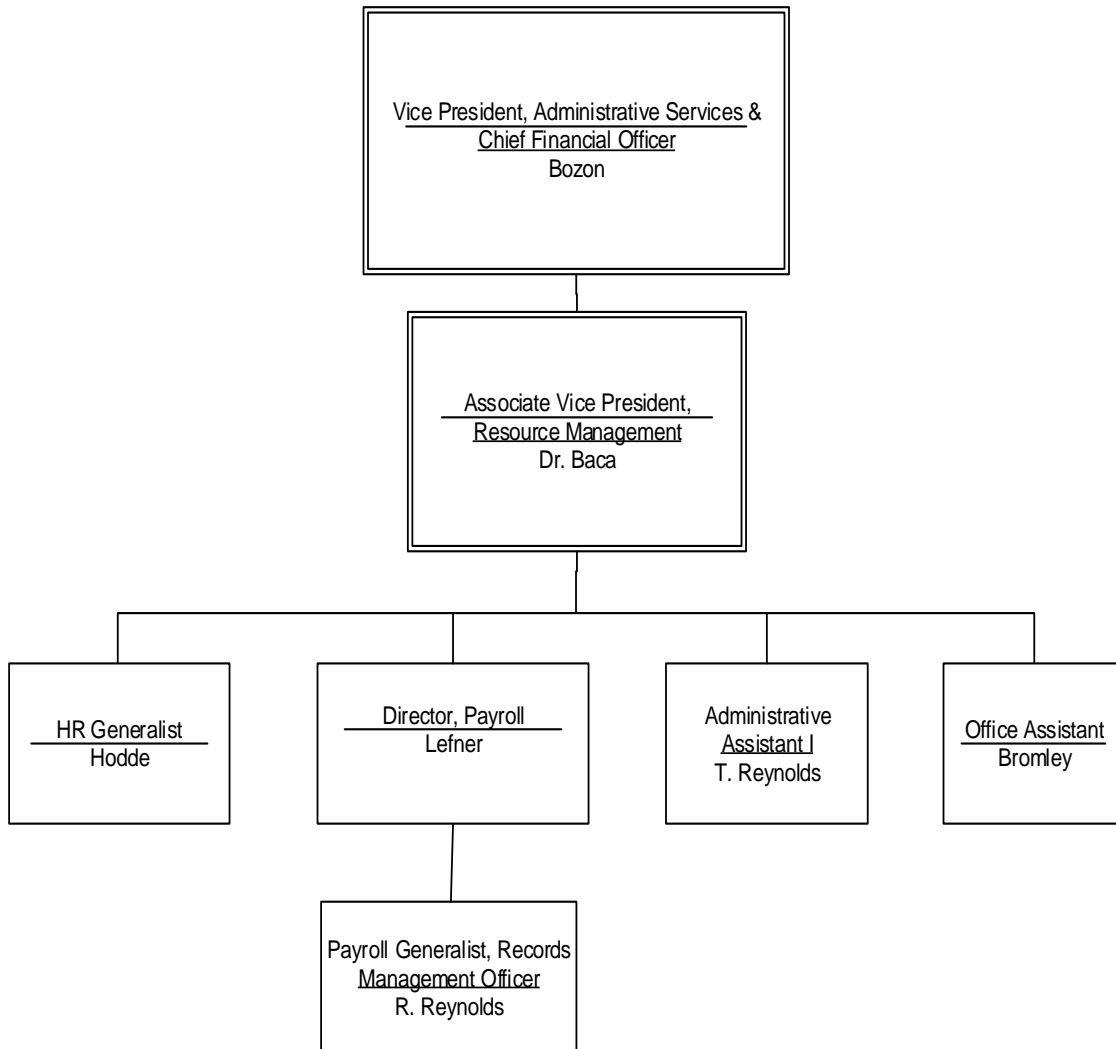

Division of Information Technology Services

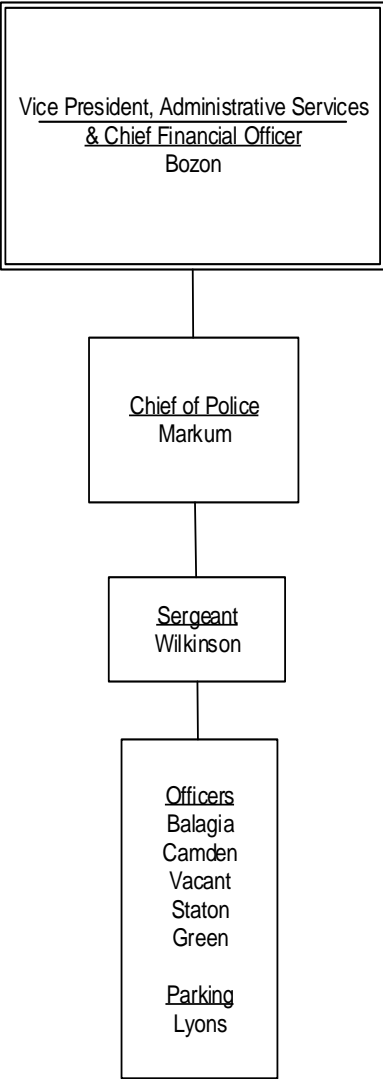

Division of Fine Arts

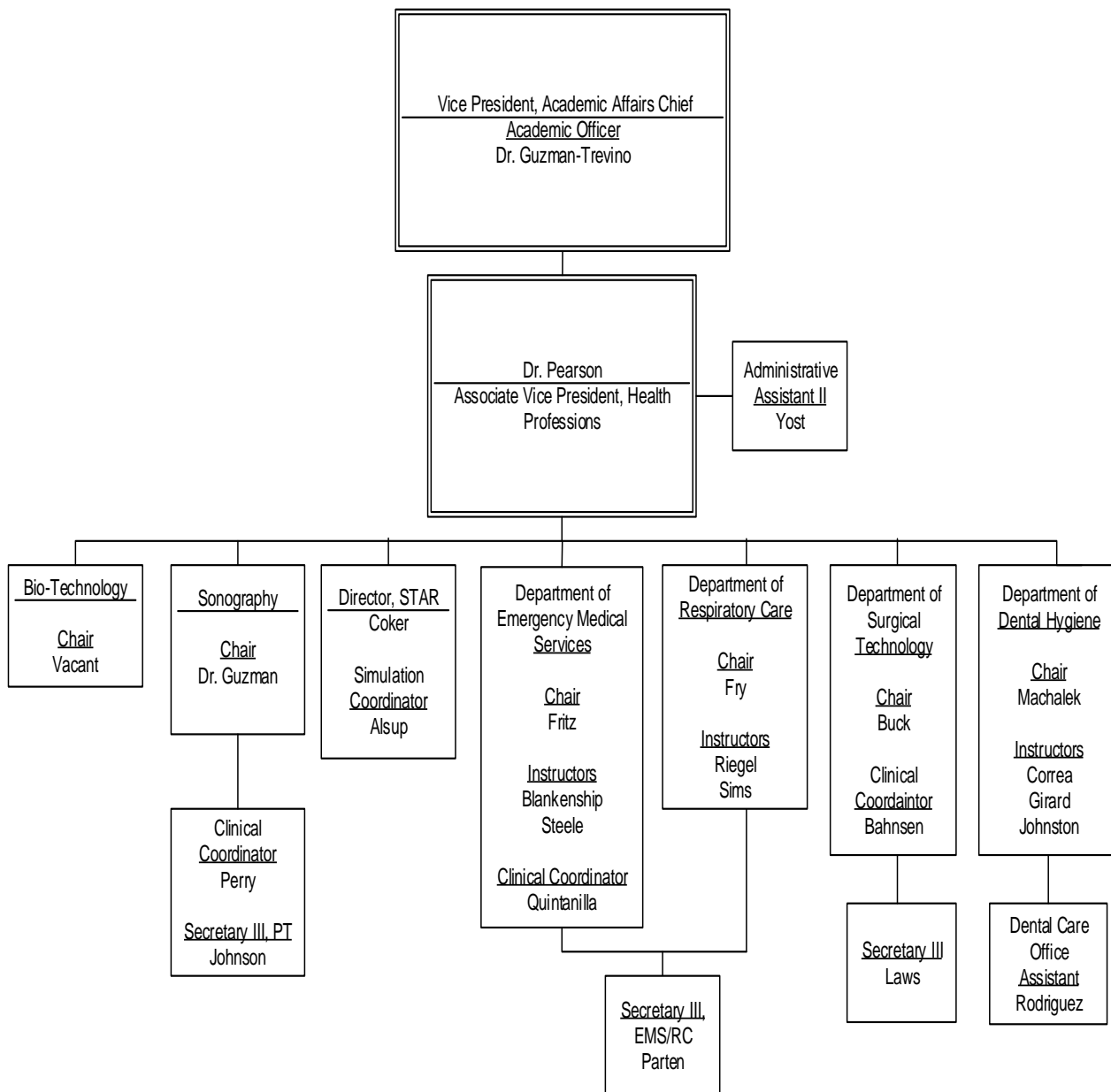


Organizational Chart I-15

Division of Liberal Arts

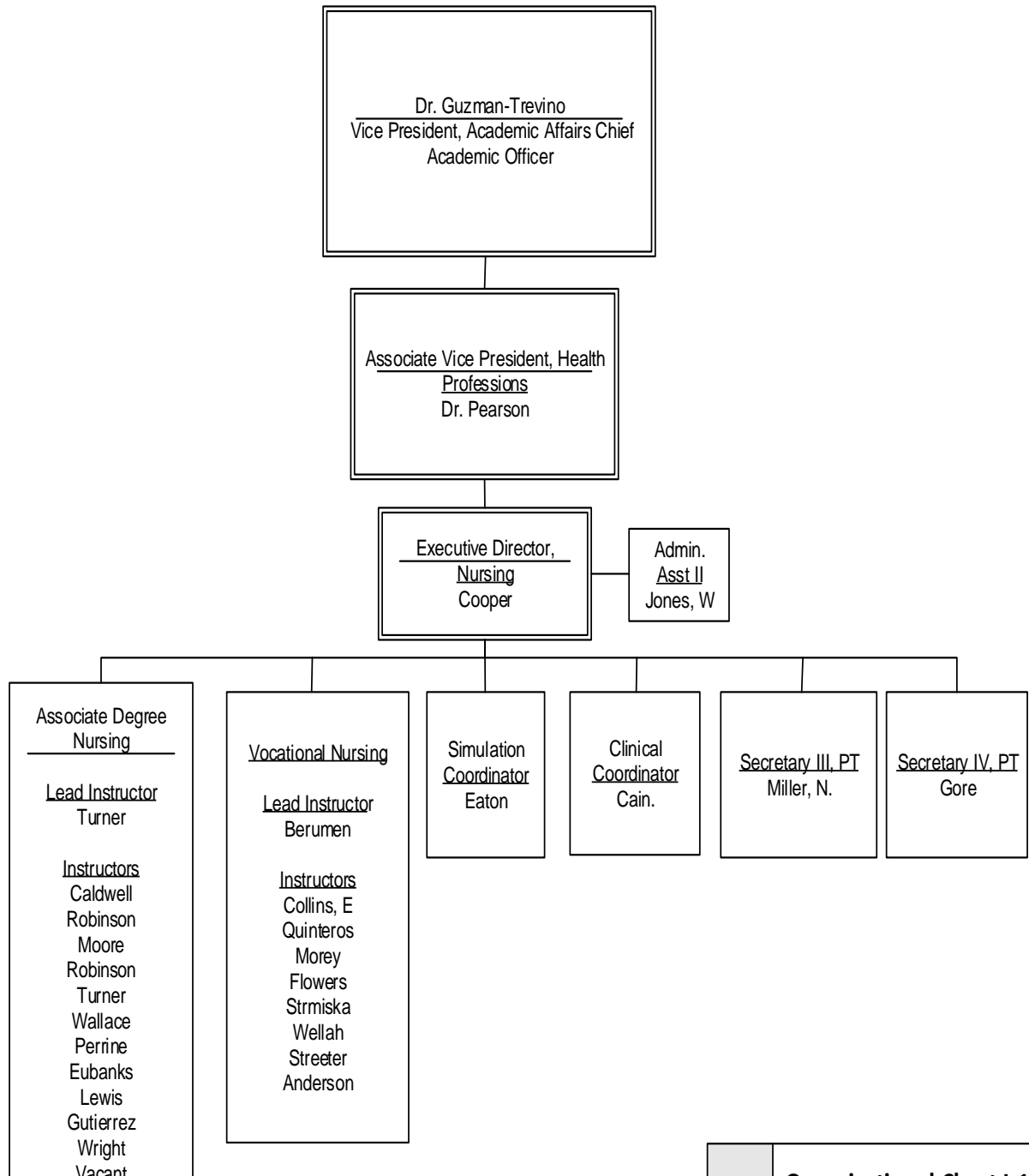


Division of Health Professions



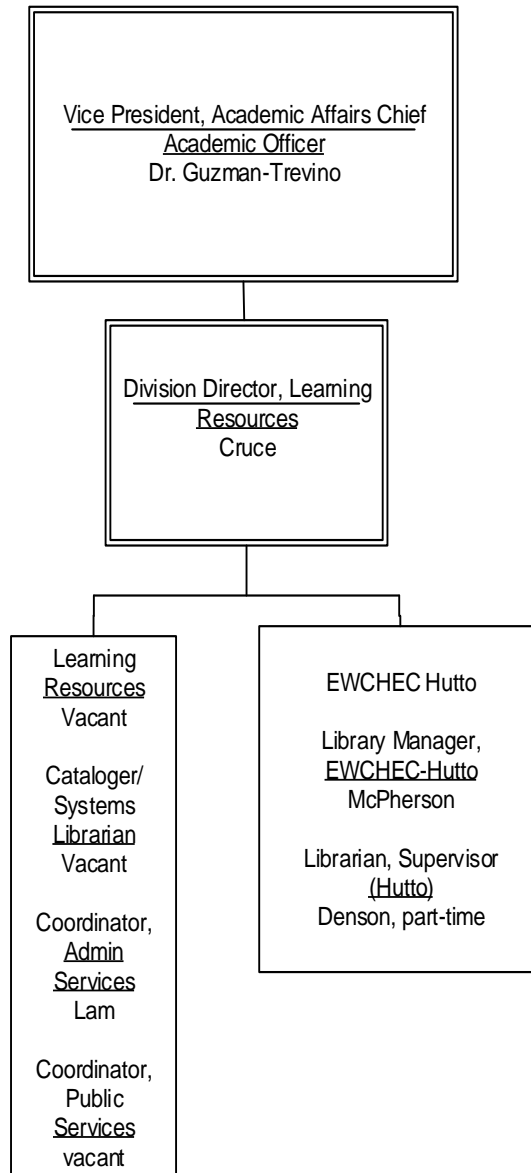

Division of Health Professions

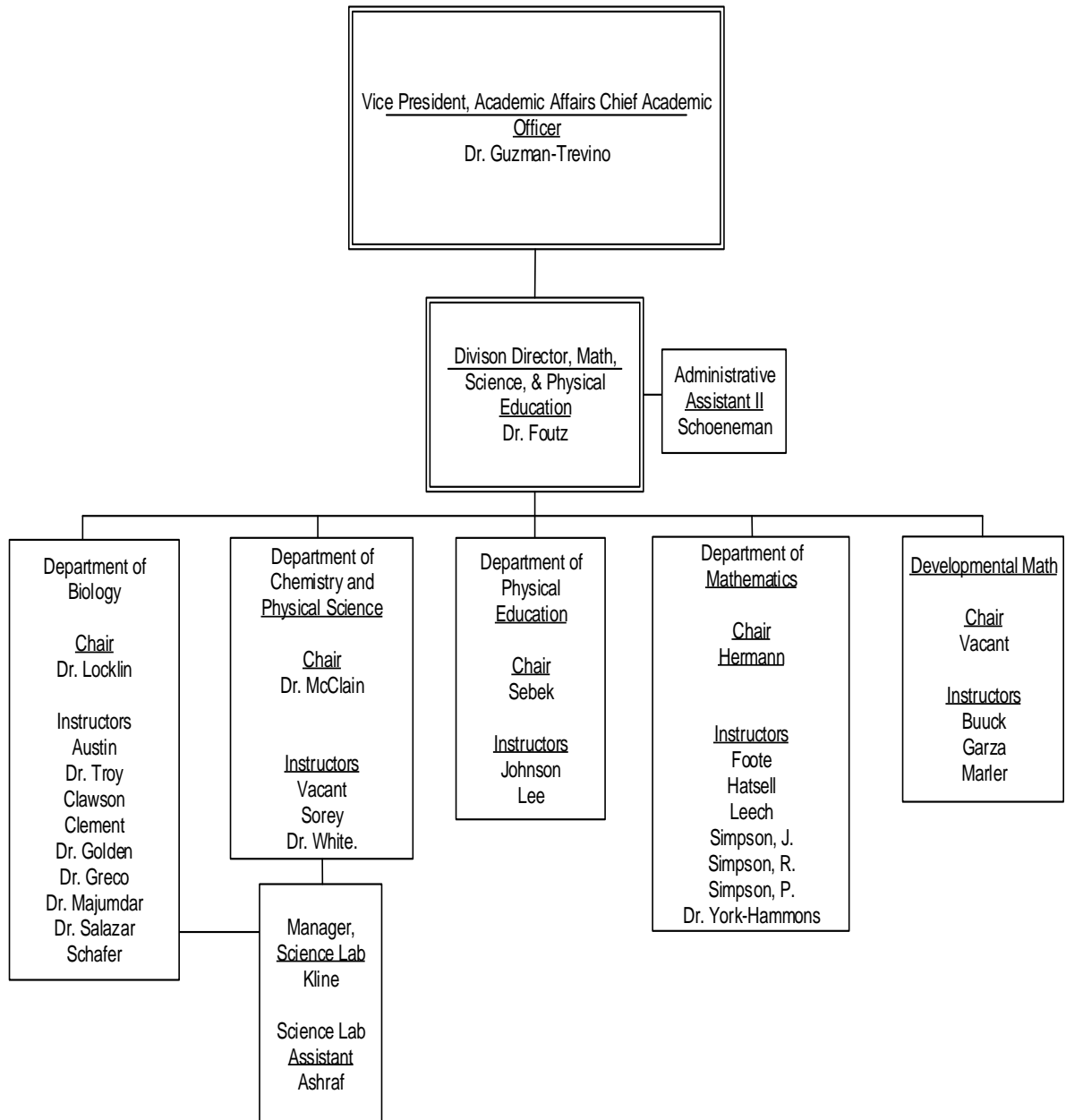

Division of Learning Resources

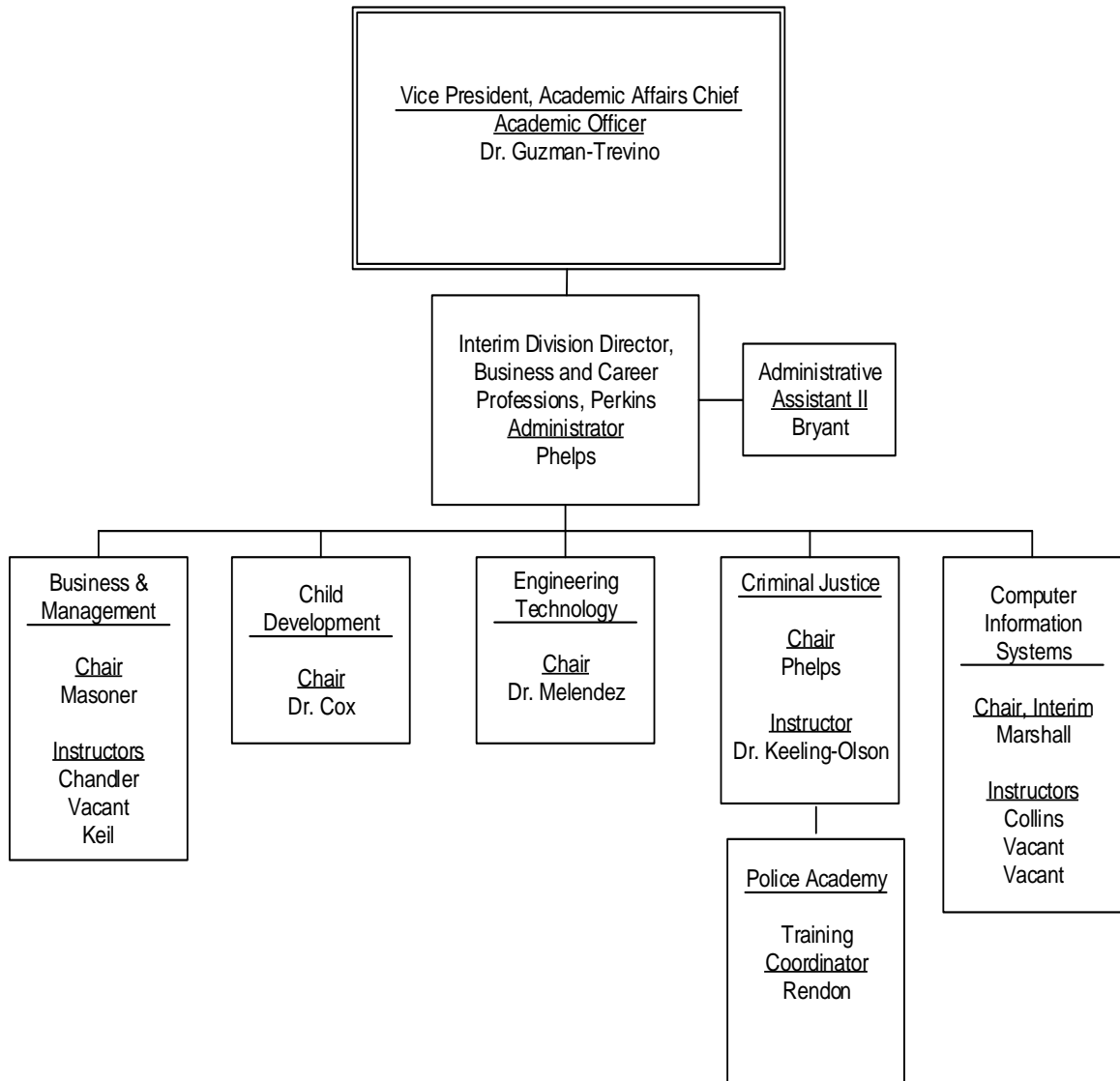


Division of Mathematics, Science, and Physical Education



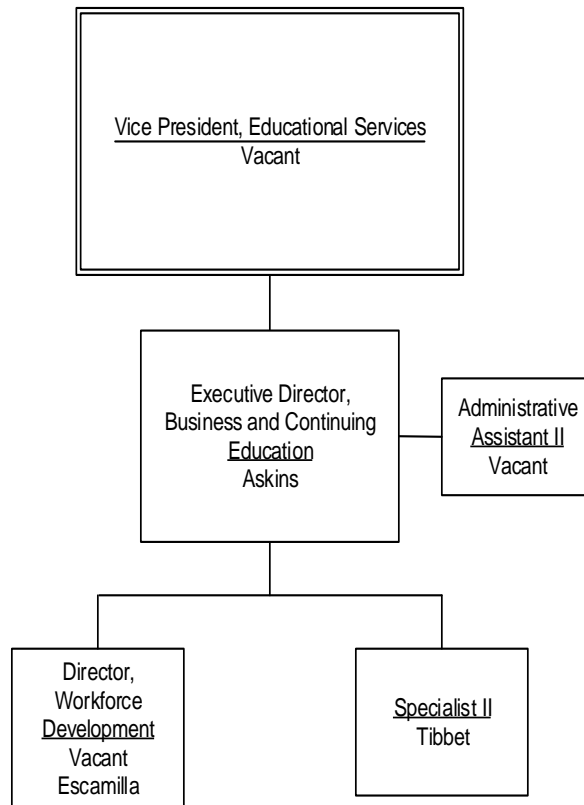

USE OF HOMELAND SECURITY FUNDS

All courses have been shifted to an online model with the exception of certain labs or healthcare programs that require in-person clinics. Student services have shifted to an online model where possible. FY20 Salaries and Wages included stipends paid to faculty members for the completion of additional training for the successful delivery of course content online. Consumable supplies primarily consists of PPE, hand sanitizer and disinfectant. Other operating expense primarily consists of non-capitalized IT equipment needed for employees to transition to remote work as well as Zoom licenses and remote test proctoring software. Grants consists entirely of CARES student aid. In 2021, it is anticipated that the college will draw down CARES Act institutional aid and MSI aid in order to stabilize payroll and the overall operating budget of the College.
