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Administrator's Statement

Located in the Gulf Coast region of Texas since its inception in 1946, Wharton County Junior College is a public, two-year comprehensive community college offering educational opportunities to more than 6,000 students. WCJC is an open-door institution with four campus sites that service Wharton, Fort Bend, and Matagorda, Colorado, Jackson, and Austin counties. WCJC offers degrees in Associate of Arts (AA), Associate of Arts in Teaching (AAT), and Associate of Applied Science (AAS), as well as certificates and continuing education courses.

Over the past year the College has faced unprecedented challenges largely due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Following the Declaration of a Public Health Disaster on March 19, 2020, the College moved instructional course offerings and student services to an on line environment. The summer and fall 2020 semester class offerings remained online with the exception of technical program offerings with face to face requirements. During this time, the College experienced a 12 percent enrollment and contact hour decline. Additionally, COVID-19 created increased costs for the purchase of personal safety protection products, social distancing, and salaries for essential employees, and distance education and technology infrastructure upgrades.

Wharton County Junior College appreciates the support of state Leadership and members of the Legislature. Recognition of community colleges as essential to the economic recovery of the State along with unaltered funding of community colleges for the current biennium has allowed us to continue workforce training in areas critical to the citizens of Texas. While WCJC continues to focus on high quality transfer programs and technical training in high demand areas, reductions in enrollment tuition and fee revenue may diminish our ability to continue to offer high cost health profession and first responder programs.

Wharton County Junior College respectfully supports the \$1.83 billion formula funding request submitted by the Texas Association of Community Colleges (TACC) in its letter to the Legislative Budget Board and the Governor's Office, Budget Division. State support remains critical to the district as it continues to fulfill its statutory role and mission to offer vocational, technical, and academic courses for certification or associate degrees. Together with Texas' other 49 community college districts, we will continue do much of the heavy lifting in the state's efforts to achieve the 60X30TX plan. State support will further be necessary to help address costs related to mitigating the effects of the pandemic, including transitioning to distance education, providing for personal protective equipment, and safely delivering the required in-person instruction essential for students in healthcare and other technical/vocational programs.

In response to the economic downturn resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic, Texas community colleges began developing a workforce initiative aimed at providing low or no-cost short-term workforce training leading to high-demand credentials to Texans whose employment and/or academics had been recently disrupted. Wharton County Junior College respectfully supports the \$50M exceptional item request submitted by TACC in support of this statewide workforce initiative, funded in the amount of \$1M per college district for the 2022-23 biennium.

Wharton County Junior College conducts background checks on all security-sensitive positions as permitted by the Texas Government Code, Sec. 411.094 and Texas Education Code, Section 61.003 (8), and consistent with the College's human resources policies and procedures.

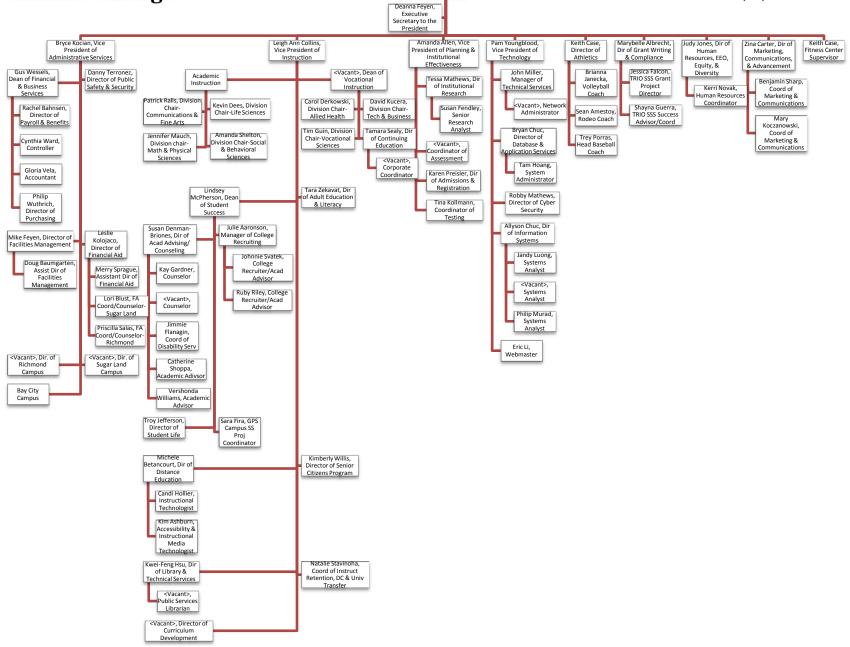
