Western Texas College, operating under the Scurry County Junior College District, was created by the voters of Scurry County in 1969. Western Texas College's service area, which extends over a vast 9,000 square miles and encompasses 26 high schools, includes Scurry County, its taxing authority, and the following nine counties, Borden, Dickens, Fisher, Jones, Kent, Mitchell, Nolan, Runnels, and Stonewall.

All seven elected members of the Board of Trustees of the Scurry County Junior College District currently live in Snyder and serve six-year terms on the board. The members of the board and their terms are as follows: Lee Presswood, 2018-2024; Eddie Peterson, 2018-2024; Dr. Jay Kidd, 2016-2022; Tim Riggan, 2016-2022; Drew Bullard, 2020-2026; Mike McWilliams, 2020-2026; and Jason West 2020-2022 (Mr. West replaced former board member Scott Richburg mid-term).

SIGNIFICANT POLICY CHANGES:

There are no significant changes in policy which impact this budget request.

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN PROVISION OF SERVICE:

WTC's enrollment has taken a sharp 25% decline due to the Coronavirus. In fall 2020, after having transitioned in-person classes to online classes from mid-March 2020 through summer 2020, WTC welcomed students back on campus by offering diverse in-person, online and hybrid classes. Given our decrease in enrollment, WTC is trying to make accommodations for all students. In addition, with many individuals out of work, and the decline in oil and gas jobs, students and their families have experienced a significant decrease in household earnings, leading those contemplating a return to the classroom in serious need of financial aid. Unfortunately, the demand far exceeds the availability of state and federal assistance, emphasizing the need to keep tuition rates affordable in trying circumstances.

In response to workforce needs, in fall 2020 WTC began offering a new Medical/Clinical Assistant Program. The Medical/Clinical Assistant department offers two educational routes: Medical/Clinical Assistant Level II Certificate and an Associate of Applied Science Degree. Upon completion of either route, students will be able to make application to take the American Medical Technologist certification exam to become a Registered Medical Assistant (RMA). Medical/Clinical Assistants are listed as a Demand Occupation in the Abilene Region of Texas and growth is projected to increase by 2.2% annually for the next seven years. Currently, Medical/Clinical Assistants in the Abilene Region have a median income of \$28,660.

PURPOSE FOR ANY NEW FUNDING REQUESTED:

Western Texas College respectfully supports the \$1.83 billion formula funding request submitted by the Texas Association of Community Colleges (TACC) in its letter to the Legislative Budget Board and the Governor's Office, Budget Division. State support remains critical to the district as it continues to fulfil its statutory role and mission to offer vocational, technical, and academic courses for certification or associate degrees. Together with Texas' other 49 community college districts, we will continue do much of the heavy lifting in the state's efforts to achieve the 60x30TX plan. State support will further be necessary to help address costs related to mitigating the effects of the pandemic, including transitioning to distance education, providing for personal protective equipment, and safely delivering the required in-person instruction essential for students in healthcare and other technical/vocational programs.

In response to the economic downturn resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic, Texas community colleges began developing a workforce initiative aimed at providing low or no-cost short-term workforce training leading to high-demand credentials to Texans whose employment and/or academics had been recently disrupted. Western Texas College respectfully supports the \$50M exceptional item request submitted by TACC in support of this statewide workforce initiative, funded in the amount of \$1M per college district for the 2022-23 biennium.

Administrator's Statement

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With additional support from the state of Texas, we will continue to expand programs to meet workforce needs and provide the opportunity for rural students to avail themselves of a college education.

BACKGROUND CHECKS:

Background checks for all security-sensitive positions are permitted by the Texas Government Code, Section 411.094 and Texas Education Code, Section 61.003 (8). WTC is currently working with CastleBranch, accredited through the Professional Background Screening Association (PBSA), as well as local law enforcement to institute background checks consistent with the college's human resources policies and procedures for all security-sensitive positions.
