Executive Summary

Financial aid plays a key role in accomplishing the four goals articulated in 60x30TX, the strategic plan for higher education in Texas: educated population, completion, marketable skills, and student debt. Since 1993, the Texas Legislature has included in the General Appropriations Act a provision calling for the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB or Coordinating Board) to provide the Legislative Budget Board an annual report on student financial aid at Texas public and independent institutions of higher education. This report provides policymakers important information about funding sources, types of student financial aid programs, students benefiting from those programs, and unmet financial need.

The Fiscal Year (FY) 2020 data are the product of a reporting process that occurs three times during the calendar year, with final certification of the Financial Aid Database (FAD) report occurring at the end of the year. This provides institutions the opportunity to reconcile data and respond to changes in student circumstances as they occur throughout the year. A total of 1,581,692 students enrolled at nonprofit institutions of higher education for the 2019-2020 academic year, and 1,044,731 of them (66%) received some form of financial aid. This includes students who received merit and other aid that did not require need analysis.

Although nearly \$12.5 billion in student financial aid was offered from federal, institutional, private, and state funding sources in FY 2020, there was a significant amount of unmet financial need among students attending Texas institutions of higher education. [Figure 9](#) on page 8 reflects the difference between the average annual undergraduate cost of attendance and financial aid offered but does not account for any student or family resources. Calculations of unmet financial need often include expected student resources, called the Expected Family Contribution (EFC), explained in [Chapter 3](#). The following amounts reflect the average annual amount needed per student to pay for undergraduate education costs after subtracting student's EFC and financial aid received:

- \$8,318 for students attending public two-year institutions
- \$7,273 for students attending public universities and health-related institutions (HRIs)
- \$9,207 for students attending private or independent institutions

Most federal and state gift aid is available to undergraduates only. Fifty-seven percent of all financial aid to undergraduates attending Texas institutions in FY 2020 was grant aid. This includes aid from endowments and other institutional funds, as well as funds offered to students by entities outside the institutions. Thirty-six percent of aid to undergraduates was in the form of loans. For graduate students, only 26% of aid was comprised of grants, while 62% of aid was in the form of student loans.

Students attending Texas institutions of higher education rely extensively on federal funds for financial assistance. For undergraduates, approximately 56% of the total aid offered was federally funded, and 61% of aid to graduate students was federally funded. Most of the federal aid was in the form of student loans and federal Pell grants. Only 5% of all FY 2020 financial aid to students at Texas institutions was offered through the six state programs funded by General Revenue appropriations.

Items to note in the FY 2020 report include:

- The percentage of students who received loans in FY 2020 decreased among undergraduate students enrolled at nonprofit institutions of higher education, across all income levels, and among the distribution of aid offered at public institutions. FY 2020 also showed a corresponding increase in the amount of cost of attendance not covered by aid, which may suggest students are identifying other ways to cover costs (reduced course load, working more, etc.).
- House Bill 3808, 86th Texas Legislature, created the Texas Working Off-Campus: Reinforcing Knowledge and Skills (WORKS) Internship Program (TXWORKS). This program provides students with opportunities to build their resumes through paid and professional work experiences aimed at strengthening their career readiness. While there has been a delay in the program's launch due to the COVID-19 pandemic, significant progress has occurred. A detailed program update is provided in [Section 7](#) of Chapter 4.
- Senate Bill 1019, 87th Texas Legislature, requires the state of student loan debt, disaggregated by race/ethnicity, gender, degree type, and enrollment status, to be reported annually. [Appendix M](#) of this report provides a student debt profile on first-time entering students in fall 2014 as well as a student debt profile on students enrolled at nonprofit institutions of higher education in FY 2020.
- All data in the report are from the 2020 Financial Aid Database (FAD) unless otherwise noted.

Chapter 1 – Financial Aid to Undergraduate Students


In FY 2020, undergraduate student reliance on loans was significant, even though the amount of grant aid exceeded the amount of loan assistance.

Of the 1,395,551 undergraduates who enrolled at nonprofit institutions of higher education:

- 55% received grants and/or scholarships, and
- 27% received loans.

This report includes data for all students who received financial aid, regardless of need. Many students receive merit aid and other types of financial aid that are not need-based. Figure 1 includes a breakdown of financial aid offered to undergraduates.

Figure 1. Types and Sources of Aid to Undergraduate Students, FY 2020





Financial Aid to Undergraduate Students by Income Level

Of the 891,125 undergraduates who received aid in FY 2020, grant aid and loans were distributed among the three income ranges as follows:

- Below Poverty – 97% received grants and 40% received loans
- Poverty to Median – 93% received grants and 44% received loans
- Above Median – 69% received grants and 65% received loans

Figure 3. Distribution of Undergraduate Aid Offered and Total Enrollment, by Institutional Sector, FY 2020





Figure 4 shows that the distribution of types of aid at public two-year institutions is somewhat like that of aid to students attending private or independent institutions. There is a marked difference in the distribution of types of aid when public universities and health-related institutions (HRIs) are compared with the other two sectors.


Chapter 2 – Financial Aid to Graduate Students

This report includes data for all financial aid offered to graduate students, including aid in the form of tuition exemptions and waivers, athletic scholarships, and federal Veterans Affairs (VA) benefits.

In FY 2020, of the 186,141 graduate students enrolled at nonprofit institutions of higher education:

- 52% received grants and/or scholarships, and
- 43% received loans.

Figure 5. Types and Sources of Aid to Graduate Students, FY 2020





Financial Aid to Graduate Students, by Income Level

Of the 154,495 graduate students who received aid in FY 2020, grant aid and loans were distributed among the three income ranges as follows:

- Below Poverty – 69% received grants and 76% received loans
- Poverty to Median – 58% received grants and 77% received loans
- Above Median – 46% received grants and 79% received loans

Institutional View of Graduate Student Financial Aid





Figure 8. Distribution of Graduate Aid Offered, by Institutional Sector and Type of Aid, FY 2020

In FY 2020, graduate students represented 12% of all enrollment at Texas nonprofit institutions of higher education. Figure 7 illustrates, by each type of institution, the percentage of all aid offered to graduate students and the percentage of overall graduate student enrollment, while Figure 8 shows the percentage, by type of aid, offered at each institutional sector.

Figure 7. Distribution of Graduate Aid Offered and Total Enrollment, by Institutional Sector, FY 2020


Chapter 3 – Meeting Financial Need

Students apply for financial aid each year by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or a Texas Application for State Financial Aid (TASFA), which collect demographic, income, and asset information from students and their families. This information is used to estimate the Expected Family Contribution (EFC), the amount of money a family is projected to contribute toward a student's education costs. The EFC is determined by a need analysis formula established in Title IV of the Higher Education Act. A detailed explanation of the EFC formula, with practical example scenarios, is provided by Studentaid.gov at <https://studentaid.gov/complete-aid-process/expected-family-contributions>.

The calculations in this section regarding unmet need focus solely on Texas residents and include tuition exemption and waiver data from the FAD. To qualify for all but one financial aid program funded by state appropriations, the Texas Armed Services Scholarship Program, students must be Texas residents.

Figures 9 and 10 illustrate the estimated amount students are responsible for after subtracting financial aid from the total average cost of attendance.¹ In addition to \$11 billion distributed to Texas residents in student financial aid through federal, institutional, private, and state funding in FY 2020, there was still a substantial amount of unmet financial need among Texas residents attending Texas institutions of higher education.

Figure 10. Average Amount of Unmet Need for Graduate Students, FY 2020





Figure 11 depicts three groups of students (undergraduates and graduates combined), indicating whether they received financial aid in FY 2020. The largest group, **Group A**, includes students who demonstrated need and received aid. [Appendix F](#) provides aggregate statistics on these students, by type of institution and type of aid.

Group B includes students who demonstrated need but did not receive aid. The following are possible reasons that these students did not receive aid: (1) did not meet the financial aid application deadline, (2) were not enrolled for enough credit hours to qualify for financial aid, (3) did not meet satisfactory academic progress requirements, or (4) applied for aid after their institutions had already pledged all available funds to other students who applied for and qualified for need-based aid. [Appendix G](#) provides aggregate statistics on these students, by type of institution.


Group C includes students who did not demonstrate need but received aid. These students may have received merit-based aid from institutional funds, funds donated to the institution, or funds from outside organizations providing aid to students who did not complete a FAFSA, TASFA, or comparable form of need analysis. Some of the students in this group received aid that was not need-based after their application for financial aid demonstrated an expected family contribution that met or exceeded their cost of attendance. [Appendix H](#) provides aggregate statistics on these students, by type of institution and type of aid.

The program profiles in this chapter include the following information for each program: statutory authority, administrative authority, funding source, background information, summary data, distribution of recipients by EFC, distribution of recipients by race/ethnicity, one-year persistence rate, and six-year graduation/persistence rate.

The combined six-year graduation/persistence rate is calculated by dividing the sum of the number of students who earned certificates, associate degrees, or baccalaureate degrees within two to six years and the number of students who were still enrolled in higher education after six years by the total number of students who first enrolled in fall 2014. These tables also provide a six-year graduation/persistence rate of grant recipients with students who did not receive the grant and whose incomes were below the median income.

Table 1 provides a comparison of the profiles of state financial aid programs, including the average income and EFC of the students receiving offers in FY 2020. As noted in the Executive Summary, a very high percentage of students receiving offers through the state programs for financially needy students had an EFC below the threshold to qualify for federal Pell grants, \$5,576. The highest percentages of dollars offered to students whose family incomes were at or below the poverty level were from the Texas Educational Opportunity Grant (TEOG) Program; the Toward EXcellence, Access, and Success (TEXAS) Grant Program; and the Texas College Work-Study Program (TCWS) Program.

Statutory Authority: Texas Education Code, Sections 56.301-56.311

Administrative Rules: Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 22, Subchapter L

Funding Source: General Revenue appropriations

Background: The TEXAS Grant Program was authorized in 1999 by the 76th Texas Legislature. This program has continued to be the foundational state financial aid program for students enrolled at public universities, encouraging students who have financial need to prepare for college by choosing a rigorous high school curriculum, thereby contributing to their participation and success in higher education. The program is designed to distribute limited funding first to students who have demonstrated the greatest potential for academic success leading to a baccalaureate degree.

Figure 13. TEXAS Grant Recipients, by EFC, FY 2020




Figure 14. TEXAS Grant Recipients, by Race/Ethnicity, FY 2020



Background: The TEG Program was authorized by the 62nd Texas Legislature in 1971 (codified in 1973). The purpose of the TEG Program is to promote the best use of existing educational resources and facilities within the state, both public and private, by providing need-based grants to Texas residents enrolled in nonprofit Texas private or independent colleges and universities. The TEG Program has remained one of the state's three signature grant programs providing access to higher education for Texas students who have financial need.

Figure 15. TEG Recipients, by EFC, FY 2020




Figure 16. TEG Recipients, by Race/Ethnicity, FY 2020



Background: The TEOG Program was originally authorized in 2001 by the 77th Texas Legislature as the TEXAS Grant II Program, for grants to students attending Texas public two-year institutions, beginning in FY 2002. The program was renamed the TEOG Program by the 79th Texas Legislature in 2005. Enrollment in Texas public two-year institutions (public state colleges, technical institutes, and community colleges) currently represents 48% of the state's total enrollment in nonprofit institutions of higher education. The TEOG Program has remained one of the state's three signature grant programs providing access to higher education for Texas students who have financial need.

Figure 17. TEOG Recipients, by EFC, FY 2020




Figure 18. TEOG Recipients, by Race/Ethnicity, FY 2020



Funding Source: General Revenue appropriations

Background: The TASSP was authorized in 2009 by the 81st Texas Legislature to encourage undergraduate students to complete a baccalaureate degree and become members of the Texas Army National Guard, the Texas Air National Guard, the Texas State Guard, the United States Coast Guard, or the United States Merchant Marine, or to become commissioned officers in any branch of the armed services of the United States. Annually, the governor and the lieutenant governor may each nominate two students, and each state senator and state representative may nominate one student to receive an initial conditional scholarship.

Figure 19. TASSP Recipients, by EFC, FY 2020




Figure 20. TASSP Recipients, by Race/Ethnicity, FY 2020



Section 5: Texas Public Educational Grant (TPEG) Program

Statutory Authority: Texas Education Code, Sections 56.031-56.039

Administrative Rules: Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 22, Subchapter D

Funding Source: State-mandated set-asides from tuition

Background: The 64th Texas Legislature created the TPEG Program in 1975 to provide grant assistance to students with financial need. To fund this program, public institutions of higher education are required to "set aside" funds for TPEG offers, of which not less than 90% of TPEG funds must be used for grants to students whose educational costs are not met in whole or in part from other sources, while no more than 10% may be used for emergency loans. The set-aside amounts are established in Texas Education Code, Section 56.033 as follows:

Universities, state and technical colleges, and health-related institutions must set aside at least:

- 15% of statutory tuition charged to resident students, and
- 3% of statutory tuition charged to non-resident students.

Community colleges are required to set aside at least:

- 6% of each resident student's hourly tuition charge, excluding out-of-district charges, for residents taking academic and career and technical education courses, and
- \$1.50 of each non-resident student's hourly charge for academic courses.

Reliance on set-aside funds to assist financially needy students has increased as tuition and fees have increased. Students who do not meet all requirements to qualify for other grant aid may be assisted with these funds. Additionally, institutions rely on these funds to meet the statutory requirements to make up the difference between tuition and fee costs and grants through two of the state's signature grant programs, TEXAS Grant Program and the TEOG Program.

Figure 21. TPEG Recipients, by, EFC, FY 2020




Figure 22. TPEG Recipients, by Race/Ethnicity, FY 2020



Section 6: Financial Aid Funded by Designated Tuition Set-Asides

Statutory Authority: Texas Education Code, Sections 56.011 and 56.012

Funding Source: State-mandated set-asides from tuition

Background: The 78th Texas Legislature amended the Texas Education Code to allow governing boards of public universities to set different designated tuition rates. While deregulating tuition, the legislation also requires universities to set aside at least 15% of the amount of undergraduate and graduate designated tuition charged to resident undergraduates and graduate students in excess of \$46 per semester credit hour. (Currently, no public two-year institutions charge designated tuition at a level that requires set-asides.)

The funds set aside from undergraduate tuition dollars must be used for financial assistance to financially needy resident undergraduate students, and dollars set aside from graduate and professional degree-seeking students must be used for financial assistance to resident graduate students and those seeking professional degrees. The financial assistance may include grants, scholarships, work-study programs, student loans, and student loan repayment assistance. The summary profile provides details on the grants and scholarships funded by these tuition set-asides, which represented 99% of the total amount offered from these funds.

Figure 23. Recipients of Aid from Designated Tuition Set-Asides, by EFC, FY 2020




Figure 24. Recipients of Aid from Designated Tuition Set-Asides, by Race/Ethnicity, FY 2020



Background: The 71st Texas Legislature created the TCWS Program in 1989 to provide financially needy students with part-time jobs, funded partially by the state with the remaining wages paid by the employer, to enable students to attend public or private institutions. The following tables include data for the Work-Study Student Mentorship Program, which falls under the umbrella of the Texas College Work-Study Program.

Work-Study Student Mentorship Program

Included in the [summary profile table](#) for TCWS is \$2.2 million offered to 736 students participating in the Work-Study Student Mentorship Program. These funds provide wages to college students employed to mentor high school students on a part-time basis or to mentor other college students on their own college campuses. In FY 2020, 49 institutions of higher education funded mentors in college campuses and/or local high schools. Table 9 lists the top activities for the Work-Study Student Mentorship Program.

Figure 25. TCWS and Mentorship Recipients, by EFC, FY 2020




Figure 26. TCWS and Mentorship Recipients, by Race/Ethnicity, FY 2020



Texas Working Off-Campus: Reinforcing Knowledge and Skills Internship Program

House Bill 3808, 86th Texas Legislature, created the Texas Working Off-Campus: Reinforcing Knowledge and Skills (WORKS) Internship Program (TXWORKS). There are currently eight TXWORKS employers, in the process of managing and preparing for the 2021-2022 internship periods, serving Texas college and universities students who have

demonstrated financial need. Over 100 students have submitted a program eligibility form demonstrating effort and interest in applying for the TXWORKS fall 2021 internship period.

The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board has conducted outreach through a variety of avenues, presentations, social media posts, and electronic notifications and has provided support and technical assistance as applicable to Texas employers and students in collaboration with Texas higher education institutions, the Texas Workforce Commission, and the Texas Chamber of Commerce. Employers around the state continue to apply to participate in the TXWORKS program for the upcoming semesters. TXWORKS employers implementing internships in the fall 2021 internship period have identified career-readiness competencies and associated skills that interns will focus on throughout the internship period and have committed to ensuring students leave their internships with meaningful experience and the ability to articulate gained and strengthened skills as they explore their career options, graduate, and enter the workforce.

TXWORKS internships are offered in in-person, virtual, or hybrid settings. The Texas Workforce Commission's Texas Internship Challenge website has been leveraged as the platform for students to apply for TXWORKS internships and to support the management of applications for TXWORKS employers. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board's online portal is used to streamline the administration of the program. In addition, electronic forms and systems have been built to manage student eligibility verification, timely communication, and support for students. Electronic forms and processes have been built as well to streamline the employer application process within a traditional state-agency setting.

The initial cohort of interns were scheduled to begin applying in spring 2021; however, the time it has taken to secure employers and processes prolonged the launch of the first cohort. The COVID-19 pandemic has had a direct impact on employers and students. For students, they have had to learn to function fully virtually and, in some cases, have lost their jobs. Employers have had the challenge of employee shortages, learning to function virtually, or transitioning for the first time in over a year to in-person work settings and trying to keep their current employees safe. For some employers, participation in the TXWORKS program may seem unattainable at this time. With this stated, the program has launched, students have demonstrated the need for work opportunities that contribute to their future and graduation progression, and more employers continue to apply to participate in TXWORKS despite current challenges. Disaggregated data required by Texas Education Code Section 56.082 will be included in the FY 2021 edition of this report.

Section 8: College Access Loan (CAL) Program

Statutory Authority: Texas Education Code, Sections 52.31-52.39

Administrative Rules: Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 22, Subchapter C

Funding Source: Proceeds from the sale of general obligation bonds and repayments from student loan borrowers.

Background: The CAL Program is the most significant portfolio in the Hinson-Hazlewood College Student Loan Program (HHCSLP), which was authorized by the 59th Texas Legislature in 1965. Since its implementation in 1988, the CAL Program has continued to provide a valuable option for the students of Texas, especially during periods of significant changes in the student loan marketplace.

Although the bonds used to fund the CAL program are backed by the full faith and credit of the state of Texas, General Revenue funds have never been required to make bond payments. The tax-exempt status of the bonds allows the Coordinating Board to pass along savings to students, in the form of one of the lowest interest rates in the country for “alternative” non-federal student loans. CAL loans may be used to cover the amount of the student’s cost of attendance that is not covered by other resources.

Figure 27. CAL Recipients, by EFC, FY 2020




Figure 28. CAL Recipients, by Race/Ethnicity, FY 2020



Appendix A: Data Considerations

For this report, 145 Texas public and independent colleges and universities that participate in state financial aid programs contributed financial aid data for FY 2020. All data in the report are from the 2020 Financial Aid Database (FAD) unless otherwise noted.

The following items should be taken into consideration when reviewing the FY 2020 financial aid detail throughout this report:

- The FAD does not include information on students attending for-profit institutions in Texas. National data for federal Pell grants, federal Direct Loans, and federal Direct PLUS Loans include information on students attending for-profit institutions.
- This report does not include data on aid that has been offered but has been declined. For example, students may choose to decline some or all of loan funds offered and instead find a means of lowering costs or working to earn income.
- The Texas Armed Services Scholarship Program is included in grant aid to reflect its nature of gift aid. Previously, TASSP was included in loan aid.
- Tuition exemptions and waiver data reported in Integrated Fiscal Reporting System (IFRS) are included in [Appendix K](#). All charts, tables, and unmet need calculations include exemption and waiver data reported in the FAD.
- National data are based on the federal academic year (July 1, 2019, to June 30, 2020), whereas state data are based on the state fiscal year (September 1, 2019, to August 31, 2020).
- For compliance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, any student counts of fewer than five are represented with an asterisk in the appendices that provide financial aid data by institution.
- Charts and tables included in [Chapter 3](#) (Meeting Financial Need) exclude data reported by Parker University.
- Enrollment data shown in [Tables 13](#) and [14](#) were reported by institutions to the Coordinating Board as of the 12th class day in fall 2019.
- [Table 15](#) is used throughout the report to provide comparative income data on financial aid recipients, as well as comparative context for the EFC levels represented by aid recipients within each program. The income on which need analysis was based was reported for the calendar year that occurred two years before the state fiscal year for which the aid was received.



Appendix K: Tuition Exemptions and Waivers

Many tuition exemption and waiver programs reward individuals or their families for services rendered. Others strengthen institutional recruitment of faculty, research assistants, teaching assistants, and highly qualified students.


Twenty-four of the 54 tuition exemption and waiver programs represented in FY 2020 data are optional, left to the discretion of the governing board of each institution. If the institution chooses to offer the program, however, it must serve all eligible students.

Impact on Institutions

The All Funds formula funding allocation to institutions does not include funding to offset tuition and fees lost to exemptions and waivers claimed at an institution. Given the large amount of foregone revenue to institutions represented by these exemptions and waivers, it is important to recognize their possible impact on tuition and fee charges for all students attending public institutions of higher education in Texas. It is also worth noting that foregone revenue from tuition and fee exemptions for dual credit enrollment is not included in this report because the students benefiting from the exemptions are high school students.

In FY 2020, there was a 35% increase in the number of recipients who received tuition exemptions from the previous fiscal year. This increase is largely driven by the expanded use of Texas Education Code, Section 54.5035, which likely represents decisions by institutions to waive certain fees due to the pandemic.


Figure 29. Number of Exemption and Waiver Recipients, FYs 2016-2020

The Hazlewood Act provides qualified veterans and, in some cases, spouses and dependent children an education benefit for up to 150 hours of tuition exemption, including mandatory fees. Hazlewood exemptions, totaling \$261 million, represented the largest amount of foregone institutional revenue from tuition exemptions in FY 2020.

In 2009, the Texas Legislature authorized the Hazlewood Legacy Act, which extends eligibility to spouses and allows eligible veterans to assign their unused credit hours to their children. Data for Legacy exemptions were first reported in IFRS for FY 2012. That year, 6,982 students benefited from these exemptions, which totaled \$43.2 million. By 2020, the number of students receiving Legacy exemptions reached 23,714 for a total of \$168 million, representing a 289% increase in foregone revenue to institutions over the eight-year period.

The largest tuition waiver program was for competitive scholarship recipients, in the amount of \$235 million.




Figure 31. Grant Aid (in Millions) in Texas, FYs 2016-2020²

Figure 32. Grant Aid (in Millions) Nationally, FYs 2016-2020³





Appendix M: Student Loan Debt

Texas Education Code (TEC), Title 3, Section 61.07764, requires reporting on student loan data by race/ethnicity, sex, degree type, and enrollment status, including data on graduation status.

TEC, Title 3, Section 61.07764 indicates that the report on student loan data should acknowledge any limitations on the scope and accuracy of the data. These limitations include the following:

- The disaggregation is using data reported to the agency each year regarding student loans disbursed in the prior year. The data do not reflect outstanding student loan balances, and students may have already reduced their loan debt through payments directly to the loan servicers.
- The data lack loan detail for Texas residents who completed a portion of their education out of state, who attended nonprofit institutions that are not accredited by Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS), who attended nonprofit institutions that are accredited by SACS but do not participate in TEG, and who attended for-profit institutions.


Fall 2014 Cohort (First-Time Entering Students in Fall 2014)

In keeping with the six-year cohort used in the graduation/persistence rates in the program profiles in this report, as well as the six-year cohort represented in the Texas Public Higher Education Almanac when discussing student loan debt, a six-year cohort of first-time entering students (fall 2014) was examined.

Of the 214,752 first-time entering students in the fall 2014 cohort, 93,373 (44%) accrued student debt. The average debt amount for students with debt who entered at public universities and HRIs is \$23,221, while the average debt amount for students who entered at public two-year institutions is \$14,331, and the average debt amount for students who entered at private or independent universities is \$34,464.

Figure 35 groups first-time entering students in the fall 2014 cohort at nonprofit institutions of higher education into three categories: graduated (students who earned a degree by summer 2020), persisting (students who did not graduate but were still enrolled in higher education in fall 2020), and left school (students who are not reported as enrolled in fall 2020). Figure 35 shows the percentages of the fall 2014 cohort with debt and the average borrowed by those students with debt by institution type.

Figure 35. Percentage of Students With Debt and Average Borrowed by Students With Debt, by Graduation Status, Fall 2014 Cohort



Figure 36 compares all students in the fall 2014 cohort who have earned a degree or certificate. Students are placed into institutional sectors based on the sector of initial enrollment. For example, 16 students with initial enrollment at two-year public institutions earned a doctorate within six years. Fourteen of these students (88%) accrued student loans with an average debt amount of \$94,456.

Figure 36. Percentage of Students With Debt and Average Borrowed by Students With Debt, by Highest Degree Earned, Fall 2014 Cohort




Figure 37. Percentage of Students With Debt and Average Borrowed by Students With Debt, by Gender, Fall 2014 Cohort



Students Enrolled in FY 2020 Cohort

This section focuses on student loan debt for all students enrolled at nonprofit institutions of higher education in the 2019-2020 academic year. Of the 1,581,692 undergraduates and graduates who enrolled in FY 2020, 588,026 (37%) accrued student debt.


Figure 39. Percentage of Students With Debt and Average Borrowed by Students With Debt, by Institutional Sector, Enrolled FY 2020

Figures 39 through 43 provide student debt profiles for students enrolled in FY 2020 by year in school. For students in public institutions, year one is defined as attempted hours of 30 or less, year two is defined as attempted hours between 31 and 60, year three is defined as attempted hours between 61 and 90 hours, year four is defined as attempted hours greater than 90, and graduate is defined as attempted hours after earning a bachelor's degree. Figure 40. Percentage of Students With Debt and Average Borrowed by Students With Debt, by Degree Program, Enrolled FY 2020



Figure 41. Percentage of Students With Debt and Average Borrowed by Students With Debt, by Enrollment Status, Enrolled FY 2020




Figure 42. Percentage of Students With Debt and Average Borrowed by Students With Debt, by Gender, Enrolled FY 2020
