Executive Summary

The Texas Legislature, through the General Appropriations Act, requires the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board to provide the Legislative Budget Board an annual report on student financial aid at Texas public and independent institutions of higher education. This report provides policymakers and stakeholders with important information about funding sources, types of student financial aid programs, students benefiting from those programs, and unmet financial need.

The Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 data are the product of the Financial Aid Database reporting process. A total of 1,490,079 students enrolled at nonprofit institutions of higher education for the 2021-2022 academic year. (See Appendix B for a list of the nonprofit institutions included in this report.) This is a decrease of about 19,500 students from the previous academic year. Sixty-eight percent of those students (1,020,299 students) received some form of financial aid. This includes students who received merit and other aid that did not require an analysis of a student's financial need.

Over \$12.5 billion in student financial aid was disbursed from federal, institutional, private, and state funding sources in FY 2022, however, there was still a significant amount of unmet financial need among students attending Texas institutions of higher education as reflected in Figure 9.

Most federal and state gift aid is available to undergraduates only. Sixty percent of all financial aid to undergraduates attending Texas institutions of higher education in FY 2022 was gift aid. This includes aid from endowments and other institutional funds, as well as funds disbursed to students by entities other than institutions. Thirty-two percent of aid to undergraduates was in the form of loans. As is common nationwide, financial aid for graduate students is primarily in the form of loans. For graduate students, only 28% of aid was comprised of gift aid, while 60% of aid was in the form of student loans.

Students attending Texas institutions of higher education rely extensively on federal funds for financial assistance. For undergraduates, approximately 52% of the total aid disbursed was federally funded, and 58% of aid to graduate students was federally funded. Most of the federal aid was in the form of student loans and Federal Pell Grants. In FY 2022, 6% of student financial aid to students enrolled at Texas institutions was funded by General Revenue appropriations.

The percentage of students who received loans in FY 2022 decreased among undergraduate students and across all income levels at nonprofit institutions of higher education. This is still likely a reflection of changes in enrollment and increases in federal gift aid caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Items to note in the FY 2022 report:

- All data in the report are from the 2022 Financial Aid Database unless otherwise noted.
- The average amount of unmet need reported in <u>Chapter 3</u> was calculated by subtracting the average amounts for expected family contribution, gift aid, tuition exemptions and waivers, need-based loans, and work-study from the average cost of attendance.


In FY 2022, undergraduate student reliance on loans was significant even though the amount of grant aid exceeded the amount of loan assistance.


Of the 1,291,314 undergraduates who enrolled at nonprofit institutions of higher education:

- > 57% received grants and/or scholarships, and
- > 25% received loans.

This report includes data for all students who received financial aid, regardless of financial need. Many students receive merit aid and other types of financial aid that are not based on financial need. Figure 1 includes a breakdown of all financial aid disbursed to undergraduates as well as a breakdown of state financial aid disbursed to undergraduates.

Figure 1. Types and Sources of Aid to Undergraduate Students, FY 2022







Of the 856,224 undergraduates who received aid in FY 2022, gift aid and loans were distributed among the three income ranges as follows:

- Below Poverty 97% received grants and 37% received loans
- > Poverty to Median 94% received grants and 39% received loans
- ➤ Above Median 72% received grants and 59% received loans

Institutional View of Undergraduate Student Financial Aid

In FY 2022, undergraduate students represented 87% of all enrollments at Texas nonprofit institutions of higher education. Figure 3 reflects the percentage of all financial aid disbursed to undergraduates by each of the three institutional sectors.





Figure 4. Distribution of Undergraduate Aid Disbursed, by Institutional Sector and Type of Aid, FY 2022

In Figure 4, the distribution of types of aid at public two-year institutions is similar to that of students attending private or independent institutions. There is a marked difference in the distribution of types of aid when public universities and health-related institutions (HRIs) are compared with the other two sectors.

Figure 3. Distribution of Undergraduate Aid Disbursed by Institutional Sector, FY 2022




This report includes data for all financial aid disbursed to graduate students, including aid in the form of tuition exemptions and waivers, athletic scholarships, and federal Veterans Affairs (VA) benefits.

In FY 2022, of the 198,675 graduate students enrolled at nonprofit institutions of higher education:

- > 42% received grants and/or scholarships, and
- > 53% received loans.

Figure 5. Types and Sources of Aid to Graduate Students, FY 2022







- Below Poverty 69% received grants and 74% received loans
- > Poverty to Median 58% received grants and 75% received loans
- ➤ Above Median 46% received grants and 78% received loans

Figure 6. Distribution of Graduate Recipient Income Levels, By Type of Aid, FY 2022






Institutional View of Graduate Student Financial Aid

In FY 2022, graduate students represented 13% of all enrollments at Texas nonprofit institutions of higher education. Figure 7 illustrates the percentage of aid disbursed to graduate students by institution type. Figure 8 shows the percentage, by type of aid, and institution type.

Chapter 3 - Meeting Financial Need

Students apply for financial aid each year by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or a Texas Application for State Financial Aid (TASFA), which collect demographic, income, and asset information from students and their families. This information is used to estimate the expected family contribution (EFC), the amount of money a family is projected to contribute toward a student's education costs. The EFC is determined by a need analysis formula established in Title IV of the Higher Education Act. A detailed explanation of the EFC formula, with practical example scenarios, is provided by Studentaid.gov, the U.S. Department of Education's Federal Student Aid website.

The calculations in this section regarding unmet need focus solely on Texas residents and include tuition exemption and waiver data from the Financial Aid Database (FAD). Students must be Texas residents to qualify for all but one financial aid program funded by state appropriations; the Texas Armed Services Scholarship Program does not require Texas residency.




Figure 9. Average Amount of Unmet Need for Undergraduate Students, FY 2022

In previous annual reports, the charts depicting average unmet need have reflected the total amount, including the EFC, required for students to pay the average cost of attendance after financial aid has been awarded. The amount of unmet need shown in Figures 9 and 10 illustrate the total amount required for students to pay the average cost of attendance after subtracting gift aid, work-study, need-based loans, and EFC.¹ Texas residents attending Texas institutions of higher education still had a substantial amount of unmet need despite the \$10.2 billion in financial aid distributed through federal, institutional, private, and state funding in FY 2022.

¹ Average cost of attendance includes tuition and required fees, books and supplies, room and board, transportation, and personal expenses.




Figure 11 depicts three groups of students (undergraduates and graduates combined), indicating whether they received financial aid in FY 2022. The largest group, **Group A**, includes students who demonstrated financial need and received aid. <u>Appendix F</u> provides aggregate statistics on these students, by type of institution and type of aid.

Group B includes students who demonstrated financial need but did not receive aid. The following are possible reasons that these students did not receive aid: (1) did not meet the financial aid application deadline, (2) were not enrolled for enough credit hours to qualify for financial aid, (3) did not meet satisfactory academic progress requirements, or (4) applied for aid after their institutions had already pledged all available funds to other students who applied for and qualified for need-based aid. <u>Appendix G</u> provides aggregate statistics on these students, by type of institution.

Group C includes students who did not demonstrate financial need but received aid. These students may have received merit-based aid from institutional funds, funds donated to the institution, or funds from outside organizations providing aid to students who did not complete a FAFSA, TASFA, or comparable form of need analysis. Some of the students in this group received aid that was not need-based after their application for financial aid demonstrated an expected family contribution that met or exceeded their cost of attendance. <u>Appendix H</u> provides aggregate statistics on these students, by type of institution and type of aid.

Figure 11. Comparison of Students with Regard to Receipt of Aid and Demonstration of Financial Need, FY 2022





Figure 12. Students Who Demonstrated Financial Need, FY 2022

Chapter 4 – State Financial Aid Programs

The program profiles include the following information for each program: statutory authority, administrative authority, funding source, background information, summary data, distribution of recipients by expected family contribution, distribution of recipients by race/ethnicity, one-year persistence rate, six-year graduation and persistence rate.

The combined six-year graduation and persistence rate is calculated by dividing the sum of the number of students who earned certificates, associate degrees, or baccalaureate degrees within two to six years and the number of students who were still enrolled in higher education after six years by the total number of students who first enrolled in fall 2016. A six-year graduation/persistence rate of grant recipients with students who did not receive the grant and whose incomes were below the median income is also provided for each program.

<u>Table 1</u> provides a quick comparison of the profiles of state financial aid programs, including the average income and EFC of the students receiving disbursements in FY 2022. As noted in the Executive Summary, a very high percentage of students receiving disbursements through the state programs for financially needy students had an EFC below the threshold to qualify for Federal Pell Grants, \$5,846. The highest percentages of dollars disbursed to students whose family incomes were at or below the poverty level were from the Toward Excellence, Access, and Success (TEXAS) Program; Texas Educational Opportunity Grant (TEOG) Program; and the Texas College Work-Study Program (TCWS) Program.

Statutory Authority: Texas Education Code, Sections 56.301-56.311

Administrative Rules: Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 22, Subchapter L

Funding Source: General Revenue appropriations

Background: The Toward EXcellence, Access, and Success (TEXAS) Grant Program was authorized in 1999 by the 76th Texas Legislature. This program has continued to be the foundational state financial aid program for students enrolled at public universities, encouraging needy students to prepare for college by choosing a rigorous high school curriculum, thereby contributing to their participation and success in higher education. The program is designed to distribute limited funding first to students who have demonstrated the greatest potential for academic success leading to a baccalaureate degree.

<u>Appendix J</u> includes data required by <u>Texas Education Code</u>, <u>Title 3</u>, <u>Chapter 56</u>, <u>Section 56.311(c-1)</u>.

Figure 13. TEXAS Grant Recipients, by EFC, FY 2022





TEXAS Grant Eligibility

To meet basic eligibility for a TEXAS Grant, a student must be a Texas resident, be registered with Selective Service, have demonstrated financial need, be enrolled at least 3/4 time, not have a baccalaureate degree, not have been convicted of a felony or crime involving a controlled substance, and be enrolled as an undergraduate in a baccalaureate degree program through one of the following pathways:

- High School Pathway: within 16 months of high school graduation
- Military Pathway: within 12 months of an honorable military discharge (must have enlisted within 12 months of high school graduation)
- Associate Pathway: within 12 months of receiving an associate degree
- Texas Educational Opportunity Grant (TEOG) Pathway: after having received a TEOG, the state's primary grant program for students attending two-year institutions, and having completed at least 24 credit hours at a Texas institution with at least a 2.5 Grade Point Average (GPA)

In addition to meeting basic eligibility requirements, a student must meet at least two of the following four criteria to be considered through the Priority Model:

- Advanced coursework: earn 12 hours of college credit courses (e.g., dual credit or advanced placement); or graduate under the Distinguished Level of Achievement High School Plan or the International Baccalaureate Program
- Advanced math: complete a math course beyond Algebra II
- Academic achievement: rank in the top third of high school graduating class or attain a B average
- College readiness: achieve a college readiness threshold as determined by the Texas Success Initiative

Background: The Tuition Equalization Grant (TEG) Program was authorized by the 62nd Texas Legislature in 1971 (codified in 1973). The purpose of the TEG Program is to promote the best use of existing educational resources and facilities within the state, both public and private, by providing need-based grants to Texas residents enrolled in nonprofit Texas private or independent colleges and universities. The TEG Program has remained one of the state's three signature grant programs providing access to higher education for Texas students who have financial need.

Figure 15. TEG Recipients, by EFC, FY 2022





Background: The TEOG Program was originally authorized in 2001 by the 77th Texas Legislature as the TEXAS Grant II Program, for grants to students attending Texas public two-year institutions, beginning in FY 2002. The program was renamed the TEOG Program by the 79th Texas Legislature in 2005. Enrollment in Texas public two-year institutions (public state colleges, technical institutes, and community colleges) currently represents 46% of the state's total enrollment in nonprofit institutions of higher education. The TEOG Program has remained one of the state's three signature grant programs providing access to higher education for Texas students who have financial need.



Funding Source: General Revenue appropriations

Background: The TASSP was authorized in 2009 by the 81st Texas Legislature to encourage undergraduate students to complete a baccalaureate degree and become members of the Texas Army National Guard, the Texas Air National Guard, the Texas State Guard, the United States Coast Guard, or the United States Merchant Marine, or to become commissioned officers in any branch of the armed services of the United States. Annually, the governor and the lieutenant governor may each nominate two students, and each state senator and state representative may nominate one student to receive an initial conditional scholarship.

Figure 19. TASSP Recipients, by EFC, FY 2022




Figure 20. TASSP Recipients, by Race/Ethnicity, FY 2022



Section 5: Texas Public Educational Grant (TPEG) Program

Statutory Authority: <u>Texas Education Code</u>, <u>Sections 56.031-56.039</u>

Administrative Rules: Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 22, Subchapter D

Funding Source: State-mandated set-asides from tuition

Background: The 64th Texas Legislature created the Texas Public Educational Grant (TPEG) Program in 1975 to provide grant assistance to students with financial need. To fund this program, public institutions of higher education are required to "set aside" funds for TPEG recipients, of which not less than 90% of TPEG funds must be used for grants to students whose educational costs are not met in whole or in part from other sources, while no more than 10% may be used for emergency loans. The set-aside amounts are established in Texas Education Code, Section 56.033, as follows:

Universities, state and technical colleges, and HRIs must set aside at least:

- 15% of statutory tuition charged to resident students, and
- 3% of statutory tuition charged to non-resident students.

Community colleges are required to set aside at least:

- 6% of each resident student's hourly tuition charge, excluding out-of-district charges, for residents taking academic and career and technical education courses, and
- \$1.50 of each non-resident student's hourly charge for academic courses.

Reliance on set-aside funds to assist financially needy students has increased as tuition and fees have increased. Students who do not meet all requirements to qualify for other grant aid may be assisted with these funds. Additionally, institutions rely on these funds to meet the statutory requirements to make up the difference between tuition and fee costs and grants through two of the state's signature grant programs, the TEXAS Grant Program and the Texas Educational Opportunity Grant Program.

Figure 21. TPEG Recipients, by EFC, FY 2022




Figure 22. TPEG Recipients, by Race/Ethnicity, FY 2022



Section 6: Financial Aid Funded by Designated Tuition Set-Asides

Statutory Authority: Texas Education Code, Sections 56.011 and 56.012

Funding Source: State mandated set-asides from tuition

Background: The 78th Texas Legislature amended the Texas Education Code to allow governing boards of public universities to set different designated tuition rates. While deregulating tuition, the legislation also requires universities to set aside at least 15% of the amount of undergraduate and graduate designated tuition charged to resident undergraduates and graduate students in excess of \$46 per semester credit hour. (Currently, no public two-year institutions charge designated tuition at a level that requires set-asides.)

The funds set aside from undergraduate tuition dollars must be used for financial assistance to financially needy resident undergraduate students, and dollars set aside from graduate and professional degree-seeking students must be used for financial assistance to resident graduate students and those seeking professional degrees. The financial assistance may include grants, scholarships, work-study programs, student loans, and student loan repayment assistance. The summary profile provides details on the grants and scholarships funded by these tuition set-asides, which represented 99% of the total amount disbursed from these funds.




Figure 23. Recipients of Aid from Designated Tuition Set-Asides, by EFC, FY 2022

Figure 24. Recipients of Aid from Designated Tuition Set-Asides, by Race/Ethnicity, FY 2022



Background: The 71st Texas Legislature created the Texas College Work-Study Program (TCWS) in 1989 to provide financially needy students with part-time jobs, funded partially by the state with the remaining wages paid by the employer, to enable students to attend public or private institutions. The following tables include data for the Work-Study Student Mentorship Program, which falls under the umbrella of the Texas College Work-Study Program.


Work-Study Student Mentorship Program (WSMP)

Out of the \$6.61 million indicated for TCWS in the summary profile in Table 15, \$1.38 million was disbursed to 488 students participating in the Work-Study Student Mentorship Program. These funds provide wages to college students employed to mentor high school students on a part-time basis or to mentor other college students on their own college campuses. In FY 2022, 57 institutions of higher education funded mentors in college campuses and/or local high schools.

Figure 25. TCWS and WSMP Recipients, by EFC, FY 2022






Figure 26. TCWS and WSMP, by Race/Ethnicity, FY 2022

Texas Working Off-Campus: Reinforcing Knowledge and Skills Internship Program

Program year 2021-2022 staff continue to work toward creating a strong internship program foundation and engaging employers and students to participate in the initiative. Benefiting from Governor Abbott's Tri-Agency Workforce Initiative, the THECB continues to partner with the Texas Workforce Commission to leverage the Texas Internship Challenge site for students to apply for TXWORKS internships and to support the management and verification of applications for TXWORKS employers. The partnership also has provided multiple collaboration strategies to expand TXWORKS' awareness and outreach.

The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board and the Texas Workforce Commission have partnered to implement the Texas Interns Unite (TIU) conference across the state to connect the workforce, higher education institutions, and students across the state to discuss the value of work-based learning, educate on how to approach it best, and explore the opportunities that the TXWORKS internship program provides Texas employers and students. Over 500 attendees participated in the conference series throughout 2021-2022 in support of the TXWORKS internship program. In addition to continuous outreach and program awareness, the TXWORKS team has created marketing materials, employer/student toolkits, and guides to make participating in the program easy and to help employers implement best practices for work-based learning.

Over 40 employers have applied to participate in TXWORKS, and most were selected to provide internships. Texas law requires that participating employers must have the capacity to employ college students with a demonstrated financial need, manage state reporting, and advance internship compensation. Over 200 students submitted an interest/eligibility form seeking eligibility to apply for available internships, and TXWORKS employers continue to report offering interns permanent positions upon graduation and hiring interns for consecutive periods.

As the state continues to experience economic and pandemic recovery, the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic have directly impacted employers and students. Agency staff will continue to work closely with employers to streamline processes and identify career-readiness competencies and associated skills that interns will work to gain and strengthen. Texas employers and students continue to demonstrate an interest in TXWORKS, and we anticipate steady growth over time to help the state maintain a strong, skilled, and growing Texas workforce.

Once there is a large enough cohort of TXWORKS interns, disaggregated data required by Texas Education Code, Section 56.082, will be provided in a future edition of this report.

Section 8: College Access Loan (CAL) Program

Statutory Authority: <u>Texas Education Code</u>, <u>Sections 52.31-52.39</u>

Administrative Rules: Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 22, Subchapter C

Funding Source: Proceeds from the sale of General Obligation Bonds and repayments from student loan borrowers.

Background: The College Access Loan (CAL) Program is the most significant portfolio in the Hinson-Hazlewood College Student Loan Program (HHCSLP), which was authorized by the 59th Texas Legislature in 1965. Since its implementation in 1988, the CAL Program has continued to provide a valuable option for the students of Texas, especially during periods of significant changes in the student loan marketplace.

Although the bonds used to fund the CAL program are backed by the full faith and credit of the state of Texas, General Revenue funds have never been required to make bond payments. The tax-exempt status of the bonds allows the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board to pass along savings to students, in the form of one of the lowest interest rates in the country for "alternative" non-federal student loans. CAL loans may be used to cover the amount of the student's cost of attendance that is not covered by other resources.



Chapter 5 – Loan Repayment Assistance Programs

Currently, THECB has six loan repayment programs available to assist individuals in targeted groups of professions in paying back student loan debt. Unlike financial aid programs for students, loan repayment awards are disbursed after a year of service has been provided. Awards are disbursed directly to participants' student loan servicers.

The program profiles in this chapter include the following information for each program: statutory authority, administrative authority, background information, eligibility requirements, and maximum award amounts. FY 2022 summary data for each program are also provided. Summary data points include total amount awarded, number of recipients, average award amount, average student loan debt, and median student loan debt.

Section 1: Mental Health Professionals Loan Repayment Program

Statutory Authority: <u>Texas Education Code</u>, <u>Sections 61.601–61.659</u>

Administrative Rules: <u>Texas Administrative Code</u>, <u>Chapter 23</u>, <u>Subchapter D</u>

Background: The Loan Repayment Program for Mental Health Professionals was authorized by the 83rd Texas Legislature in 2015 to practice in a Mental Health Professional Shortage Area and provide mental health care services to recipients under the medical assistance program authorized by the <u>Texas Human Resources Code, Chapter 32</u>, and to enrollees under the child health plan program authorized by the <u>Texas Health and Safety Code, Chapter 62</u>.

Participants agree to provide five years of service and award amounts increase each year. Each category of providers has different award amounts. The total aggregate award amounts are:

- \$160,000 psychiatrists
- \$80,000 psychologists and licensed clinical social workers, licensed professional counselors, and licensed marriage and family therapists who hold doctoral degrees
- \$60,000 advanced practice nurses
- \$40,000 licensed clinical social workers, licensed professional counselors, and licensed marriage and family therapists who do not hold doctoral degrees
- \$10,000 licensed chemical dependency counselors who hold associate degrees

Section 2: Math and Science Scholars Loan Repayment Program

Statutory Authority: Texas Education Code, Sections 61.9831-61.9841

Administrative Rules: <u>Texas Administrative Code</u>, <u>Chapter 23</u>, <u>Subchapter J</u>

Background: The Math and Science Scholars Loan Repayment Program was authorized by the 83rd Texas Legislature in 2015 to encourage teachers who demonstrated high academic achievement as math or science majors to teach math or science for at least four years in Title I public schools in Texas.

To be eligible to receive loan repayment assistance, a teacher must meet the following requirements:

- Has completed an undergraduate or graduate program in mathematics or science
- Has earned a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0 on a four-point scale or the equivalent, at the institution from which the teacher graduated
- Is certified under the <u>Texas Education Code, Chapter 21, Subchapter B</u>, or under a probationary teaching certificate, to teach mathematics or science in a Texas public school (a generalist certificate is not eligible)
- Has secured an employment contract as a full-time classroom teacher to teach
 mathematics or science in a Title I school at the time of application for enrollment in the
 program
- Is a U.S. citizen
- Has not received or is receiving any other state or federal loan repayment assistance, including a Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant or teacher loan forgiveness

Teachers who enrolled in the program after September 1, 2019, must have graduated with a 3.0 or higher GPA and must agree to teach at least four consecutive years at Texas public schools that receive federal Title I funding.

Teachers may qualify for up to \$10,000 a year in student loan repayment for a period of up to eight years.

Section 3: Nursing Faculty Loan Repayment Assistance Program

Statutory Authority: Texas Education Code, Sections 61.9821-61.9828

Administrative Rules: Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 23, Subchapter G

Background: The Nursing Faculty Loan Repayment Assistance Program was authorized by the 83rd Texas Legislature in 2013 to improve access to nursing education programs by encouraging qualified nurses to serve as faculty at eligible institutions of higher education.

To be eligible to receive loan repayment assistance, a nurse must meet the following requirements:

- Holds a master's or doctoral degree in nursing
- Is licensed by the Texas Board of Nursing
- At the time of application for repayment assistance, has been employed full time for at least one year and is currently employed full time as a faculty member of a nursing program at an eligible institution in a position that requires an advanced degree in professional nursing

Nurses may qualify for up to \$7,000 a year in student loan repayment for a period of up to five years.

In FY 2022, additional funding through the Governors Emergency Education Relief Fund was available for part-time and sixth-year participants. Supplemental awards were also available for participants in the first through fifth years of the program in FY 2022.

Section 4: Peace Officer Loan Repayment Assistance Program

Statutory Authority: Texas Education Code, Sections 61.995-61.9959

Administrative Rules: Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 23, Subchapter H

Background: The Peace Officer Loan Repayment Assistance Program was authorized by the 86th Texas Legislature in 2019 to assist qualifying peace officers with the repayment of eligible student loans.

To be eligible to receive loan repayment assistance, a loan recipient must meet the definition of "peace officer" as described in <u>Article 2.12 of the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure</u> and meet the following criteria:

- Be initially appointed as a full-time peace officer on or after September 1, 2019
- Have earned at least 60 semester credit hours, or the equivalent, at an eligible institution of higher education in **Texas** before initial appointment as a peace officer
- Be currently employed and have completed at least one year of employment as a fulltime peace officer in Texas

Peace officers may qualify for up to \$4,000 a year in student loan repayment for a period of up to five years.

Section 5: Physician Education Loan Repayment Program

Statutory Authority: Texas Education Code, Sections 23, Subchapter J

Administrative Rules: <u>Texas Administrative Code</u>, <u>Chapter 23</u>, <u>Subchapter C</u>

Funding Source: Dedicated General Revenue appropriations (from smokeless tobacco sales tax revenue)

Background: The Physician Education Loan Repayment Program was authorized by the 69th Texas Legislature in 1985 to provide student loan repayment assistance to physicians practicing in Texas Health Professional Shortage Areas (HPSAs) and for certain state agencies. An "alternative pathway" was later authorized, if funds are available, for primary care physicians who are not practicing in HPSAs but are providing specified service levels to persons enrolled in Medicaid and/or Healthy Texas Women. A year of service must be provided by participating physicians before funds are disbursed to lenders annually, thereby ensuring a 100% guaranteed return on the state's investment.

To be eligible to receive loan repayment assistance, a physician must meet the following primary requirements:

- Be eligible to take the exam for board certification from the specialty board established by THECB administrative rules during the first, second, or third service period
- Agree to provide four consecutive years of service in a federally designated HPSA, secure correctional facility operated by or under contract with the Texas Juvenile Justice Department, or a secure correctional facility operated by or under contract with the Texas Department of Criminal Justice
- Provide direct patient care to Medicaid and/or Texas Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) enrollees
- Be a U.S. citizen or Legal Permanent Resident and hold a full physician license from the Texas Medical Board, with no restrictions

Additional requirements listed in the Texas Administrative Code must also be met to receive loan repayment assistance.

Physicians enrolling in the program before September 1, 2019, may qualify for up to a total of \$160,000 over a period of four years, while physicians enrolling after that date may qualify for up to \$180,000 over a period of four years.

Section 6: Teach for Texas Loan Repayment Assistance Program

Statutory Authority: Texas Education Code, Sections 56.351-56.359

Administrative Rules: Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 23, Subchapter B

Background: The Teach for Texas Loan Repayment Assistance Program was authorized by the 78th Texas Legislature in 2003 to recruit and retain certified classroom teachers in fields and communities that have a shortage of teachers in Texas.

To qualify for participation in this program, applicants must meet the following requirements:

- Be certified in a critical shortage teaching field, be currently teaching full-time in that field at the time of application, and have taught in that field full-time for at least one year at the preschool, primary, or secondary level in a Texas public school; or
- Be a certified educator currently teaching in a critical shortage community full-time at the time of application at the preschool, primary, or secondary level and have taught in that community full-time for at least one year

Teachers may qualify for up to \$2,500 a year in student loan repayment for a period of up to five years.

Appendix A: Data Considerations

For this report, 146 Texas public and independent colleges and universities that participate in state financial aid programs contributed financial aid data for FY 2022. All data in the report are from the 2022 Financial Aid Database (FAD) unless otherwise noted.

The following items should be taken into consideration when reviewing the FY 2022 financial aid detail throughout this report:

- ➤ The FAD does not include information on students attending for-profit institutions in Texas. National data for Federal Pell Grants, Federal Direct Loans, and Federal Direct PLUS Loans include information on students attending for-profit institutions.
- This report does not include data on aid that has been disbursed but has been declined. For example, students may choose to decline some or all of loan funds disbursed and instead find a means of lowering costs or working to earn income.
- Exemptions and waiver data reported in Integrated Fiscal Reporting System (IFRS) are included in <u>Appendix L</u>. All charts, tables, and unmet need calculations include exemption and waiver data reported in the FAD.
- National data are based on the federal academic year (July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022), whereas state data are based on the state fiscal year (September 1, 2021, to August 31, 2022).
- For compliance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (<u>FERPA</u>), any student counts of fewer than five are represented with an asterisk in the appendices that provide financial aid data by institution. Double asterisks represent complementary masking.
- Charts and tables included in <u>Chapter 3</u> (Meeting Financial Need) exclude data reported by Parker University.
- Enrollment data shown in <u>Tables 28</u> and <u>29</u> were reported by institutions to the THECB as of the 12th class day in fall 2021.
- ➤ Table 30 is used throughout the report to provide comparative income data on financial aid recipients, as well as comparative context for the EFC levels represented by aid recipients within each program. The income on which need analysis was based was reported for the calendar year that occurred two years before the state fiscal year for which the aid was received.
- The term "gift aid" is defined as all grants, scholarships, and categorical aid.



Appendix L: Tuition Exemptions and Waivers

Many tuition exemption and waiver programs reward individuals or their families for services rendered. Others strengthen institutional recruitment of faculty, research assistants, teaching assistants, and highly qualified students.

Twenty-four of the 55 tuition exemption and waiver programs represented in FY 2022 data are optional, left to the discretion of the governing board of each institution. If the institution chooses to offer the program, however, it must serve all eligible students.

Impact on Institutions

The All Funds formula funding allocation to institutions does not include funding to offset tuition and fees lost to exemptions and waivers claimed at an institution. Given the large amount of foregone revenue to institutions represented by these exemptions and waivers, it is important to recognize their possible impact on tuition and fee charges for all students attending public institutions of higher education in Texas. It is also worth noting that foregone revenue from tuition and fee exemptions for dual credit enrollment is not included in this report because the students benefiting from the exemptions are high school students.

In FY 2022, there was a 13% decrease in the number of recipients who received tuition exemptions from the previous fiscal year. This increase was largely driven by the expanded use of <u>Texas Education Code, Section 54.5035</u>, which likely represents decisions by institutions to waive certain fees due to the pandemic.




Figure 30. Number of Exemption and Waiver Recipients, FYs 2018-2022




Figure 31. Institutional Foregone Revenue from Tuition Exemptions and Waivers, FYs 2018-2022

The Hazlewood Act provides qualified veterans and, in some cases, spouses and dependent children an education benefit for up to 150 hours of tuition exemption, including mandatory fees. Hazlewood exemptions, totaling \$250.5 million, represented the largest amount of foregone institutional revenue from tuition exemptions in FY 2022.

In 2009, the Texas Legislature authorized the Hazlewood Legacy Act, which extends eligibility to spouses and allows eligible veterans to assign their unused credit hours to their children. Data for Legacy exemptions were first reported in IFRS for FY 2012. That year, 6,982 students benefited from these exemptions, which totaled \$43.2 million. In 2022, the number of students receiving Legacy exemptions reached 19,916 for a total of \$152.3 million, representing a 253% increase in foregone revenue to institutions.

The largest tuition waiver program was for competitive scholarship recipients, in the amount of \$245.4 million.






Figure 33. Gift Aid (in Millions) Nationally, FYs 2018-2022⁴




Figure 34. Loan Aid (in Millions) in Texas, FYs 2018-2022⁵




Figure 35. Loan Aid (in Millions) Nationally, FYs 2018-2022

Appendix N: Student Loan Debt

<u>Texas Education Code, Title 3, Section 61.07764</u>, requires the THECB to report student loan data by race/ethnicity, sex, degree type, and enrollment status, including data on graduation status.

TEC 61.07764 indicates that the report on student loan data should acknowledge any limitations on the scope and accuracy of the data. These limitations include the following:

- The disaggregation is using data reported to the agency each year regarding student loans disbursed in the prior year. The data do not reflect outstanding student loan balances, and students may have already reduced their loan debt through payments directly to the loan servicers.
- The data lack loan detail for Texas residents who completed a portion of their education out of state, who attended nonprofit institutions that are not accredited by Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS), who attended nonprofit institutions that are accredited by SACS but do not participate in TEG, and who attended for-profit institutions.


Fall 2016 Cohort (First-Time Entering Students in Fall 2016)

In keeping with the six-year cohort used in the graduation/persistence rates in the program profiles in this report, as well as the six-year cohort represented in the <u>Texas Public Higher</u> <u>Education Almanac</u> when discussing student loan debt, a six-year cohort of first-time entering students (fall 2016) was examined.

Of the 215,514 first-time entering students in the fall 2016 cohort, 90,681 (42%) accrued student debt. The average debt amount for students with debt who entered at public universities and HRIs is \$22,457, while the average debt amount for students who entered at public two-year institutions is \$14,069, and the average debt amount for students who entered at private or independent universities is \$32,438.

<u>Figure 36</u> groups first-time entering students in fall 2016 cohort at nonprofit institutions of higher education into three categories; graduated (students who earned a degree by summer 2022), persisting (students who did not graduate but were still enrolled in higher education in fall 2022), and left school (students who are not reported as enrolled in fall 2022).

Figure 36. Percentage of Students with Debt and Average Borrowed by Students with Debt, by Graduation Status, Fall 2016 Cohort



Figure 37 compares all students in the fall 2016 cohort who have earned a degree or certificate. Students are placed into institutional sectors based on the sector of initial enrollment. For example, 18 students with initial enrollment at two-year public institutions earned a doctorate within six years. Thirteen of these students (72%) accrued student loans with an average debt amount of \$91,186.

Figure 37. Percentage of Students with Debt and Average Borrowed by Students with Debt, by Highest Degree Earned, Fall 2016 Cohort







Students Enrolled in FY 2022 Cohort

This section focuses on student loan debt for all students enrolled at nonprofit institutions of higher education in the 2021-2022 academic year. Of the undergraduates and graduates who enrolled in FY 2022, 539,414 (37%) accrued student debt.


Figure 40. Percentage of Students with Debt and Average Borrowed by Students with Debt, by Institutional Sector, Enrolled FY 2022

Figures 40 through 44 provide a student debt profile for students enrolled in FY 2022 by year in school. For students in public institutions, Year 1 is defined as attempted hours of 30 or less, Year 2 is defined as attempted hours between 31 and 60, Year 3 is defined as attempted hours between 61 and 90 hours, Year 4 is defined as attempted hours greater than 90, and Graduate is defined as attempted hours after earning a bachelor's degree. For private institutions, the year in school was determined by the classification reported by institutions since attempted hours are not reported for private institutions.


Figure 41. Percentage of Students with Debt and Average Borrowed by Students with Debt, by Degree Program, Enrolled FY 2022


Figure 42. Percentage of Students with Debt and Average Borrowed by Students with Debt, by Enrollment Status, Enrolled FY 2022


