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College Vocabulary

Vocabulario Universitario

- . Adjunct Professor: A professor who is part-time and/or not on campus
- Academic Advisor: You will be assigned an Academic Advisor when you begin college. This person is similar to your high school counselor. Their purpose is to assist and advise you in your college career.
 They can help you choose a major and a minor. They also ensure that they meet all the requirements to graduate with a major in your chosen field. Academic Advisors are knowledgeable in all areas of academic life they are a great resource if you have questions.
- Academic Probation: A warning that your academic performance does not meet your
 college/university's requirements to be in "good academic standing". This usually means that your GPA
 has fallen below a C average. You will have a specific timeframe, generally one semester, to raise your
 academic performance or you can be dismissed/expelled.
- · Alumna/us: Someone who has graduated from that college/university. Plural: alumni
- Associate's Degree: A two-year postsecondary degree. Generally, translates into the first two years of a Bachelor's degree
 - AA: Associate of Arts
 - · AAS: Associate of Applied Science
 - . AS: Associate of Science
 - · ABA: Associate of Business Administration
 - · ABS: Associate of Business Science
 - AASCET: Associate of Applied Science in Computer Engineering Technology
- Audit: Attend an academic course without receiving credit. You may choose to attend a class without
 receiving a grade for that class or it appearing on your transcript. This is typically done when you find a
 class interesting but do not want to risk scoring poorly and it lowering your GPA and it is not required for
 your major.
- · Board of Trustees: Governing body of the college
- . Bachelor's Degree: A four-year postsecondary degree. Generally, this is around 120 credit hours or



Career Technical Education

Community colleges offer career and technical education programs that prepare students to directly enter the workforce upon completion. Some programs are common among all institutions and some are unique to the institutions as listed: Howard College: Dental Hygiene, Medical Assistant, Wind Energy, Craftsman, Green Construction, General Construction, Electrical, Agriculture, Interpreter Training. Midland College: Massage Therapy, Sonography, Paralegal, Health Information Management, Petroleum Energy Technician, Energy Technology, Collision Repair, Automotive, Aviation Maintenance Technology, and Diesel Technology.
