New Programs



Houston Engineering Campus (HEC):

- Allows students to earn a bachelor of science degree in engineering at the UT Tyler Houston Engineering Center (HEC), located on the second floor of the HCC Alief-Hayes campus in Houston.
- Students who complete the prescribed <u>ASES curriculum</u> with an overall GPA of at least 2.5 and no grade lower than C are automatically admitted to the baccalaureate degree program. No further testing or evaluation is required.

BAAS degree:

- The program was redesigned to meet the needs of marginalized students seeking to utilize accumulated hours.
- A policy change allowed the full transfer of AAS degree into the program, and only requires a minimum of 33 credit hours at UT Tyler to complete the BAAS.
- The program was designed to support transfer students and encourage degree completion.

Expanded Student Support

Finances:

- Facilitated FAFSA outreach in Houston to encourage completion and maximize access to aid.
- Offered Financial Aid Counseling to students entering with over 100 hours.
- Partnered with Student Money Management to launch an online tool for financial wellness.

Advising:

- Decentralized and added professional advisors.
- Expanded face to face and virtual tutoring.
- Implemented the Graduation Help Desk.

Belonging:

- Collaborated with Tyler Area Partnership for Education, which includes Tyler ISD & TJC.
- Implemented 10 Student Organizations on the HEC campus to offer the students the opportunity to gain valuable knowledge in teamwork and leadership.




Peer Success Coaches

- Respond to and Disseminate Alerts
 - 2,815 Alerts Reported by 464 faculty for 1,505 distinct students (1,685 from 3,169 Progress Report Requests Sent to 975 faculty members for 615 distinct students)
 - 85 Alerts Reported by 31 staff members for 80 distinct students
- Contact students to help resolve holds and re-enroll
 - 7,428 calls to 2,949 students for Fall 2018
 - 2,822 calls to 1,396 students for Spring 2019
- Deliver group presentations and provide individual guidance via phone call and email follow-up on




UT PERMIAN BASIN 4 AND 6 YEAR GRADUATION RATES



UT PERMIAN BASIN ONEYEAR RETENTION RATES








UT PERMIAN BASIN TOTAL UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE PRODUCTION








Student Success: 4-year Graduation Rate






