Distance Education

 The formal educational process that occurs when students and instructors are not in the same physical setting for the majority (more than 50 percent) of instruction.

- Electronic-to-Individual (Online)
 - Hybrid/Blended (51-85%)
 - Fully Online (86-100%)
 - 100% Online
- Off-Campus Face-to-Face
- Electronic-to-Group
- Self-Supporting

Distance Education Approval Processes Bachelor's and Master's Programs

Online

(Hybrid/Blended, Fully Online, 100% Online)

- Institution approved to offer program
- Certification Form for Electronically Delivered and Off-Campus Education Programs
- Notification to the THECB that the program is being delivered online

Off-Campus

- (Off-Campus Face-to-Face, Electronic-to-Group, Self-Supporting)
- Institution approved to offer program
- Certification Form for Electronically Delivered and Off-Campus Education Programs
- 50-Mile radius area notification 60 days prior to proposed implementation date including 30 day objection period
- Approved, if no objections or when all objections are resolved



Distance Education Approval Processes for Doctoral Programs

New

- Submit planning notification
- 50-Mile radius area notification and 30 day objection period
- Complete and submit proposal form offer a new doctoral program via distance education
- Staff review
- Learning Technology Advisory Committee (LTAC) review and recommendation
- CAWS/Board consideration at regular quarterly meeting

Existing

- 50-Mile radius area notification 60 days prior to proposed implementation date including 30 day objection period
- Complete and submit proposal form to offer an existing doctoral program via distance education
- Learning Technology Advisory Committee (LTAC) review and recommendation
- Staff consideration of approval



Study-Abroad and Study in America Courses

- Study-Abroad Courses
 - Off-campus, academic credit instruction which is delivered outside the United States primarily to regular on-campus students.
- Study-in America Courses
 - Off-campus, academic credit instruction which is delivered outside Texas, but in the United States primarily to regular on-campus students.
- Institution must certify the courses meet the THECB Standards for Out-of-State and Out-of-Country Courses through the <u>Study-Abroad and</u> <u>Study-in-America reporting site</u>.
