- takes a scientific approach to evaluating learning delays, syndromes, and the brain
- evaluates and monitors children in clinical settings
- prepares medical students and residents in child development concepts
- provides summer tutoring programs for medical school students seeking research experience

CLI's Clinical Programs

The Center for Autism and Related Conditions and the Dan L. Duncan Children's Neurodevelopmental Clinic offer clinical assessment, diagnosis, and treatment of socioemotional and learning disorders for children and young adults.

At the Center for Neurosciences,

both pediatric and adult patients with a variety of neurological conditions that can affect brain function are screened in order to aid in diagnosis and treatment through neuropsychological testing.





Dan L. Duncan Reading Initiative: **Summer Tutoring Programs** Targeted reading instruction tutoring for grades K-8.

Dan L Duncan Reading Initiative: School-Based Programs Early intervention for students who are at-risk for reading failure as

well as enrichment programs for students with grade level academic skills.

CLI is expanding its mathematics support with K-2 tutoring services and a math school ready summer camp for entering children entering kindergarten.





Developmental Consequences Of Pediatric Traumatic Brain Injury Study


- Funded by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the National Center for Injury Prevention and Control






CLI continues to find ways to diversify revenue streams and meet increasing demand for services. The CLI Solutions Group provides:
